Provision for payment of all the proper costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the proceedings, and all fees and percentages payable to the Official Receiver and the Board of Trade shall be made in the following manner:—The Trustee shall, on the request of the Official Receiver, pay the amount thereof to the Official Receiver out of the first moneys which shall come to his hands as hereinafter provided in priority to all other payments. A Composition shall be paid as hereinafter mentioned on all provable debts, namely:—A Composition of 7s. 6d. in the pound, payable (after the payments mentioned in Clauses 1 and 2) within three calendar months after the approval by the Court of this proposal. That Lawrence Hasluck, of No. 17, Holborn-viaduct, Chartered Accountant, be appointed Trustee to receive and distribute the Composition. Payment of the Composition be secured in the following manner:—(a) By an assignation in the Scotch form to the Trustee to be made by the debtor and John Henry Brass, of Norlands, Westgate-on-Sea, in the county of Kent, Esquire, of the Pedigree Herds of Aberdeen Angus cattle, and the live and dead farming stock and implements of husbandry and growing crops now upon the Home Farm at Aboyne Castle, Aberdeenshire; (b) By the bond or covenant of Amy, Marchioness of Huntly, for payment to the Trustee of any balance required for payment of the Composition as aforesaid. Section 23 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1890, shall apply to any debts which have been or shall be proved upon the debtor's estate, which include interest or any pecuniary consideration in lieu of interest, and to the payment of any Composition or Dividend under this scheme</p>
