Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, July 26, 1899.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 26th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Honolulu, enclosing copy of the following Notice, which was issued on the 22nd ultimo by the Board of Health at that place:—"All passengers arriving from North American ports are hereby required to report daily to the Port Physician, at his office on Beretania-street, until otherwise instructed. Any passenger failing to report to the Port Physician as directed will be placed in quarantine at the quarantine station."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 16th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, intimating that the Sanitary Board have modified, in the following manner, the previous Order relating to the importation of sacks:—

1. The sacks specified in the previous Order may be imported also by way of Hebibtchevo (the frontier station on the Oriental Railway).
2. In that case they must be conveyed in waggons separate from other goods, and must be unloaded at the Hebibtchevo Quarantine Station for disinfection.
3. Such sacks, if they should be brought by rail into the interior of Bulgaria without having been disinfected at Hebibtchevo, will be returned, together with other goods with which they may have been mingled, at the expense of the Railway Company, to be disinfected at Hebibtchevo.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, July 28, 1899.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 19th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin, intimating that the Imperial Gazette of the previous night contained a Decree imposing restrictions on the importation of articles from Egypt, of which the following is a translation:—

§1. In order to prevent the introduction of the plague, the importation by sea of the following

articles from the Egyptian ports in the Mediterranean and Suez Canal is prohibited until further notice:—

Body-linen, old clothes already worn, bed-clothes that have been used, and rags and tatters of every description.

§2. The prohibition, contained in §1, does not apply to body linen, bedclothes, and articles of clothing, which travellers take with them for their own use, or which are imported by them on change of residence. Permission to import them may, however, be rendered conditional upon their undergoing a previous process of disinfection.

§3. The Chancellor of the Empire is empowered to grant exemptions from the prohibition, upon prescribing the necessary measures of precaution.

§4. The present Decree comes into force on the day of its publication.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Maintenance of Lunatics in Workhouse under Section 26 (1) of the Lunacy Act, 1890:—
Forden Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Forden Union;—

To the Visiting Committee of the Salop and Montgomery Counties and Wenlock Borough Lunatic Asylum, situate at Bicton, near Shrewsbury;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 26 of the Lunacy Act, 1890, it is enacted that:—

"The visitors of any asylum may, with the consent of the Local Government Board and the Commissioners, and subject to such regulations as they respectively prescribe, make arrangements with the guardians of any union for the reception into the workhouse of any chronic lunatics, not being dangerous, who are in the asylum and have been selected and certified by the manager of the asylum as proper to be removed to the workhouse";

And whereas the Visiting Committee of the Salop and Montgomery Counties and Wenlock Borough Lunatic Asylum, situate at Bicton, in the County of Salop, propose, with the consent of the Local Government Board and of the Commissioners in Lunacy, to make arrangements with the Guardians of the Poor of the Forden Union for the reception into their Workhouse, situate at Forden, in the county of Montgomery, of a certain number of chronic male lunatics, not being dangerous, who are now, or may hereafter be, inmates of the said Asylum, and who have been,

or may hereafter be, selected and certified by the Manager of the said Asylum as proper to be removed to the said Workhouse;

And whereas the Commissioners in Lunacy have prescribed Regulations in accordance with the above-cited enactment with regard to the reception and treatment in the said Workhouse of chronic male lunatics as aforesaid from the said Asylum not exceeding twenty-five in number, or of such smaller number as shall, with the lunatics chargeable to the said Union and being inmates of the said Workhouse, make the total number of lunatics in the Lunatic Ward of the said Workhouse not more than twenty-eight;

And whereas by an Order dated the 4th day of April, 1870, the Poor Law Board made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of the Forden Union, and by another Order dated the 18th day of May, 1870, the Poor Law Board prescribed the mode of keeping the Accounts relating to such Workhouse;

And whereas it is expedient that We, the Local Government Board, should prescribe further Regulations in connection with the reception into the said Workhouse of chronic male lunatics as aforesaid, (hereinafter termed "patients,") from the said Lunatic Asylum:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I. No patient shall be admitted to the said Workhouse either upon his first or any subsequent admission without a written or printed Order signed by the Manager or Medical Superintendent of the said Asylum. Such written or printed Order shall be according to the Form in the Schedule to this Order.

ARTICLE II. The patients shall be classified in such manner as the Guardians, with the advice of the Medical Officer of the Workhouse, shall direct.

ARTICLE III. The Guardians, acting under the advice of the Medical Officer of the Workhouse, may cause any patient to be returned to the said Asylum when they shall consider that it is expedient that he should not continue in the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE IV. The Master of the Workhouse shall give to the Manager or Medical Superintendent of the said Asylum not less than forty-eight hours' notice of the proposed return of any patient to the said Asylum as aforesaid.

ARTICLE V. The Master of the Workhouse shall keep a separate Admission and Discharge Book with respect to the patients received into the said Workhouse from the said Asylum.

ARTICLE VI. The Guardians shall cause Accounts to be opened and entries to be made in such form as We may approve, in their Books of Account and in the Financial Statements to be submitted to the District Auditor, so that the costs and expenses incurred in respect of the maintenance and care of the said patients may be distinguished from the expenses of a like sort in regard to the other inmates of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VII. Subject to the foregoing regulations and the regulations of the Commissioners in Lunacy above referred to, every patient received into the said Workhouse shall be amenable to the Regulations in force respecting the government of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VIII. Expressions in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Lunacy Act, 1890.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 26TH JULY 1899.)

DOGS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1899.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Landing of Dogs.

1. Dogs brought to Great Britain from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Licences for Landing in Particular Cases.

2. The Board may in any particular case grant a Licence authorizing the landing of a dog, and such dog may thereupon be landed subject to and in accordance with the conditions of such Licence.

Applications for Licences.

3. Any application for a Licence under the preceding Article is to be made in writing to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W., and is to be accompanied by a statement signed by the owner of the dog to which the application relates or by his agent authorized in writing for this purpose containing the following information (namely)—

(i.) the description of the dog, stating so far as

- possible for the purposes of identification, the particulars of its breed, sex, age, and colour ;
(ii.) the port at which it is proposed to be landed ; and
(iii.) the place to which it is proposed after being landed to be moved for the purposes of such detention and isolation as may be required by the Board, and also the route by which it is proposed to be moved to such place of detention ; and
(iv.) such other information as the Board may require.

Conditions of Licence.

4.—(1.) The Board may insert in any Licence granted under this Order authorizing the landing of a dog such conditions as they think necessary or desirable for the following purposes—

- (a.) for prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog by and at the expense of its owner for any period not exceeding six months at a place to be provided for that purpose by such owner and to be described in the Licence ; or
(b.) for regulating the movement of the dog to such place of detention and its movement during the period of detention prescribed by the Licence.

(2.) A dog landed under the authority of a Licence granted under this Order shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the conditions of such Licence, and shall not be moved in contravention of any such condition.

Notice of Detention.

5. Where a dog has been landed or moved in contravention of this Order or of the conditions

of a Licence granted thereunder, an Inspector of the Board may give Notice in writing to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring such detention isolation and restriction of the movement of the dog, as the Board think necessary or desirable and direct, for the purposes mentioned in the preceding Article.

Restriction on Granting of Licences.

6. An applicant for a Licence to be granted under this Order for the landing of a dog will be required to satisfy the Board that proper and suitable arrangements can be made for such detention and isolation of the dog as appears to the Board to be necessary or desirable.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Dogs shall be animals, and rabies shall be a disease, for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a dog is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence granted thereunder, or of the requirements of a Notice given thereunder, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog is not kept isolated as required by this Order, or by the conditions of a Licence granted thereunder, or by a Notice given thereunder, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where such dog is detained, and the person failing or neglecting to isolate the dog, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts defaults or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence granted thereunder, or by a Notice given thereunder, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:
“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“Master” includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the DOGS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1899.
