

Ibbotson's-lane Mossley Hill-drive. Croxteth-drive and Ullet-road along the boundary of the Sefton Park West Ward aforesaid to the junction of Ullet-road and Lodge-lane thence in northerly easterly and south-westerly directions successively along the boundary of the Sefton Park Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I the said Commissioner in further pursuance of the terms of the said Warrant and for the purposes aforesaid do hereby assign and apportion all the existing Councillors of the Sefton Park Ward among the Sefton Park West and the Sefton Park East Wards as hereinbefore defined of the city of Liverpool as follows namely—

"To the Sefton Park West Ward three Councillors namely:—

"Richard Dart, Radcliffe William Smith, Francis Henderson.

"To the Sefton Park East Ward three Councillors hereafter to be elected.
