WILD BIRD PROTECTION.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Buckingham) Order, August, 1899.

Dated 15th August, 1899.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Buckingham, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Buckingham) Order, August, 1899."

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period from the 1st August in any year to the last day of February following the taking or killing of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Buckingham:—

Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owls (all species), Woodpeckers (all species), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Kestrel (Red Hawk or Wind Hover), Nuthatch (or Nutjobber), Tree Creeper, Hedge Sparrow (Accentor, Dunnock), Robin (Robin Redbreast); all Wagtails, including Pied Wagtail (Dishwasher), Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail; Wren (Jenny Wren), Golden-crested Wren (Kinglet), Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Linnet, Brambling, Longtailed Tit (Bottle Tit or Bumbarrel), Bearded Tit (Reedling), Cole Tit, Marsh Tit (Blackcap), Swallows, Martins (Sand Martin, House Martin), Swifts.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the County of Buckingham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Denbighshire, Flintshire, and Shropshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Overton, being a detached portion of the county of Flint; the petty sessional division of Oswestry, the municipal borough of Oswestry, and the parishes of Whitechurch-Urban, Whitechurch-Rural (except the detached portion), Ightfield, Whixall, Welsh Hampton, Ellesmere-Urban, Ellesmere-Rural, Cockshutt, Hordley, and Ruyton of the Eleven Towns, in the county of Salop; and also comprising the petty sessional division of Bromfield, together with the detached portion of the petty sessional division of Ruabon, in the county of Denbigh, and the detached portion of the county of Flint situate within the first-named petty sessional division; and also comprising the borough of Wrexham. (19 May, 1899.)

Lancashire.—(1.)
