THE Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that, upon the decease of Charles William Moore, fifth Earl Mountcashell, of Cashell, in the Peerage of Ireland, which happened on or about the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the title and dignity of Earl Mountcashell devolved upon Edward George Augustus Harcourt Moore, now Earl Mountcashell, as eldest son and heir of Edward George Moore, Clerk in Holy Orders (commonly called the Honourable and Reverend Edward George Moore), Canon of Windsor, and Rector of West Ilsley, in the county of Berks, deceased, who was the third but second surviving son of Stephen, second Earl Mountcashell, in the Peerage of Ireland, and uncle of the said Charles William, fifth Earl Mountcashell; and that the said Reverend Edward George Moore died on or about the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, in the lifetime of his nephew the said Charles William, fifth and late Earl Mountcashell; whereby according to the ordinary rules of honour the daughters of the said Reverend Edward George Moore, deceased, cannot enjoy that place, rank, and precedence which would have been due to them had their said father survived his nephew the said Charles William, fifth and late Earl Mountcashell, and succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl Mountcashell, has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Louisa Fanny Matilda Moore and Mary Augusta Georgiana Gilliat otherwise Moore, wife of Algernon Gilliat, Esquire, the daughters of the said Reverend Edward George Moore, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father had survived the said Charles William. late Earl Mountcashell, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl Mountcashell:

And to command that the said Order and

declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

Department of Justice and Police, Christiania, 23rd August, 1899. Circular.

On the 22nd instant the following Royal Proclamation was made:

"With reference to the Royal Proclamations of the 1st February, 1897, and the 27th June, 1899, notice is hereby given, by virtue of section 2 of the Quarantine Law of the 12th July, 1848, that the town of Oporto in Portugal and the Chinese ports shall, until further notice, be regarded as infected with bubonic plague, and that the quarantine regulations against plague contained in the above-mentioned Law are in accordance herewith to be at once brought into force.

"Whereunto all those whom it may concern

have humbly to submit themselves."

In bringing the above fact to your notice I would remind you that the above-named Proclamations of the 1st February, 1897, and the 27th June, 1899, state that ports in Egypt, Arabia. Persia, India, Formosa, and the Pescadores in East Asia, as well as the Island of Mauritius, shall, until further notice, be regarded as infected by bubonic plague.

I would add that discharging quarantine at present can only be performed at the quarantine station on Oddero, near Christiansand, S. section 8 of the Quarantine Law of the 12th July, 1848, and section 11 of the Quarantine Regulations of the 1 th of February, 1849.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 24th August, 1899, from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Galatz, stating that passengers from Russia will only be allowed to enter Roumania via Radantz, Ungheni, Falcin, and Galatz, and their passports must bear the Consular visa, and indicate the route followed by the bearer during the preceding twenty days. Passengers from Astrakan direct must undergo twenty days' quarantine, counting from the day of departure. Vessels from Portugal subject to twelve days' quarantine at Sulina.

Translation of Circular No. 9516, of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste to all Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and .Officers.

In relation with Decree of July 31st of the current year, No. 41060 of the Imperial and Royal Ministry for Commerce, the Marine Board at Trieste, in conjunction with the Royal Marine Board at Fiume, make it known, the regulations respecting the sanitary treatment of the Austrian Lloyd's Steamers running on the Indo-China line and also other vessels arriving from Egypt, as

The special application of the sanitary measures respecting the steamers of the Austrian Lloyd's on the above-mentioned line, namely the steamers that do not touch Alexandria, will not be enforced, in consideration of the administration of the Austrian Lloyd's having abolished the passenger traffic from Egypt on this line. The same sanitary rules will be applicable to all steamers under the same conditions, namely, that the steamers have not touched Alexandria and also did not embark passengers from any other Egyptian ports. All vessels arriving from Egypt will be subjected to the treatment of the Sanitary Convention of Venice of 1897, as "suspects" according to the Government Circular of June 17th, 1897, No. 5684, paragraph second, Article No. 17.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 26th August, 1899, from Her Mejesty's Representative at Christiania, containing the following prec's of Quarantine Regulations:

Précis of Norwegian Quarantine Regulations against Bubonic Plague.

The Norwegian Legislature distinguishes between two kinds of quarantine—" discharging quarantine" and "observation quarantine."

"Discharging quarantine" is enforced on :-1. Vessels arriving from a plague-infected country or place and bringing thence infected goods.

2. Vessels which on their voyage have held

intercourse with a plague-smitten country or vessel and which have taken infected goods on board from them.

3. Vessels on which during the voyage there have been or on arrival there are found to be

persons suffering from plague.

Discharging quarantine which can at present only be performed in Norway at the Island of Odderö, near Christiansand, consists in the complete emptying of the vessel and the disinfection of the goods discharged while the persons who have been on board are kept isolated in the lazaret.

The goods are returned to the proper persons entitled to receive them after twenty days have elapsed from their discharge from the vessel and disinfection. In the case of vessels bringing infected goods, or which on arrival have persons suffering or dead from plague on board, quarantine will last for twenty days reckoned from the day on which the goods, persons infected, or bodies are removed from the vessel and the disinfection of the latter has begun.

Vessels which have not brought infected goods or persons suffering from, or who have died of, plague will be kept in quarantine for fourteen days from the date of the vessel having left the infected country, or from the date on which the vessel last had intercourse with a ship coming

from an infected country.

Persons recovering from the plague will be kept in quarantine for fourteen days from the date of their being declared to have recovered.

"Observation quarantine" is enforced on vessels which do not fall under any of the three classes above enumerated and after whose departure from or intercourse with an infected country or vessel sufficient time has elapsed to free them from quarantine.

Observation quarantine consists in the vessel being laid up at a proper distance from land and from any other vessel under continual watch preventing all intercourse with the vessel.

The above Regulations apply at present (August 25th, 1899) to vessels arriving at Norwerian ports from the following countries or

Oporto, China, Egypt, Arabia, Persia, India, Formosa, the Pescadores, Mauritius.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Rutland) Order, 1899.

Dated 25th August, 1899.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1895, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Rutland, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Rutland) Order, 1899."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1890.

II. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the County of Rutland to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act :-

Buntings (Black-headed Bunting, Corn Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting), Chats (Whinchat, Stonechat), Chilfchaff, Dipper, Flycatchers, Stonechat), Hawks (Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey), Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Linnet, Martins (House Martin, Sand Martin), Nuthatch, Pipits, Redstart, Robin, Shrikes, Siskin, Swallow, Swift, Tits (Long-tailed Tit, Great Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Bearded Tit), Treecreeper, Wagtails (White Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail), Warblers (Garden Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Reed Warbler, Coasthonnes Warbler, Willow Warbler, Weekley Weekley Grasshopper Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler), Wrens, Wryneck.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County. III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Rutland:-

Bee-eater, Bittern, Bullfinch, Buntings (Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting), Chats (Whinchat,

Stonechat), Chiffchaff, Dipper, Flycatchers (Pied and Spotted), Goldfinch, Grebe (Lesser (Dabchick) Grebe, Great Crested Grebe), Hawfinch, Hawks (Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey), Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Linnett, Martins (House Martin, Sand Martin), Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nutherth Oriole (Aug. (Brown, Owl. Long. orned.) hatch, Oriole, Owls (Brown Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, White Owl (or Barn Owl)), Pipits (Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit), Pochard, Redstart, Sandpiper (Summersnipe), Shelldrake, Shoveller, Shrikes (Butcher Birds), Swallow, Siskin, Snipe, Stock Dove, Teal, Tits (Cole Tit, Marsh Tit), Treecreeper, Wagtails (Grey Wagtail, Grey-headed Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail), Warblers (Garden Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Reed Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler), Wheatear, Whitethroat, Widgeon, Woodcock, Woodpeckers (all species), Wrens (all species), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

IV. The Order of the 14th May, 1897, is hereby repealed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 31ST AUGUST 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1895, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:
