THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, intimating that the port of Nikoz in Manchuria is dangerous on account of plague, and that the importation into Russia from India, Egypt, and other plague-affected districts of rags of all kinds, including those pressed by hydraulic power and imported as goods in bales, shall be henceforth prohibited.

"Vessels bound for Bulgarian Black Sea ports can get pratique only at Bourgas and Varna.

Twelve days' quarantine imposed on arrivals from Sea of Azov and Russian ports of Asiatic coast of Black Sea. Medical inspection imposed on arrivals from Russian ports of European coast of Black Sea. In both cases disinfection of crew and vessel if cargo taken or discharged. Importation of all goods from Astrakban, and fruit, vegetables, fish, caviar, hides, furs, and used sacks from Russia prohibited.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 8TH SEPTEMBER 1899.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of September, one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-nine.
