Le Ministère des Affaires Étrangères à l'honneur d'informer la Légation Royale, qu'à la suite de la constatation de la peste à Astrakhan, Samara et Stavropol, la Direction Générale du Service Sanitaire a décidé, que les navires venant de la Mer d'Azof et du littoral Caucasiens de la Mer Noire ne seront admis à faire escale qu'à Soulinea, où ils seront soumis à la visite sanitaire de rigueur. Si pendant le trajet, des cas suspects de peste venaient se déclarer à bord des navires, les navires auront à subir une quarantaine de 10 jours. A la Légation Royale d'Angleterre.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of an Ordinance issued by the Senate of Hamburg, viz.:—

Ordinance respecting the Control by the Sanitary Police Authorities of Seagoing Ships in the Port of Hamburg.

In order to prevent the introduction of a case of plague, the Senate hereby orders, with refer-

ence to section 2 of the Hamburg Port Regulations of June 2nd, 1897, as follows:—

The officers and crews of seagoing ships arriving at Hamburg shall not be permitted to leave their vessels until the Sanitary Police examination by the Port Physician, or by one of his representatives, prescribed for all ships by section 18 of the Port Regulations of June 30th, 1897, shall have taken place. The first examination will, as far as practicable, be performed immediately after the vessel has been properly moored, also during the night time.

The Harbour Police have received orders to prevent any contravention of this prohibition.

Attention is, at the same time, called to the rule laid down by section 19 of the Port Regulations, viz., that persons suffering from infectious or contagious diseases, as also from fever, choleraic maladies, eruptions, or scurvy, are only allowed to leave their vessel after having been examined by the Port Physician, and only with his permission.

Contraventions will, in accordance with section 38 of the Port Regulations, be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred and fifty marks (about £7 10s.), or in default thereof by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 weeks.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Circular respecting quarantine issued by the Marine Board at Trieste:—

Translation of Circular No. 10259 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, to all Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers, and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

By Decree, dated August 31st, 1899, issued by the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance, B.L.I. 170, in conjunction with the Hungarian Government,

on account of the existence of plague in Oporto, the importation and transit of certain specified goods and articles from Egypt, issued by Ministerial Decree of June 6th, 1899, B.L.I. No. 99, is extended to Portugal, in order to prevent the introduction of infectious diseases.

The present Decree comes into force on the day that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued for information and guidance with reference to Circular of June 7th, 1899, No. 6513.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, intimating that the following Regulations have been issued with respect to quarantine, viz. :—

1. All vessels, from what port soever they sailed, bound for Bulgarian Black Sea ports, must put in at Varna or Bourgas, where pratique will be given to them for the other ports.

2. The importation from Russia of fruit, vegetables, preserves, fish (fresh or salted), caviar, corks, mushrooms, hides, fur coats, used sacks, goods coming from the Province of Astrakhan, samples and postal parcels, is prohibited.

3. A quarantine of twelve days is imposed on vessels arriving from the Sea of Azov and from Russian ports of the Asiatic coast of the Black Sea. If during the quarantine a suspicious case occurs among the crew or passengers, the vessel will be compelled to leave. At the end of the quarantine the passengers will be allowed to land after steam disinfection of their baggage and their clothes. The same procedure will be followed with the crew, if they wish to land. If the vessel has cargo to load or discharge the disinfection of the vessel and crew is obligatory. In that case the bilge-water must be pumped out, not into the harbour, but into the open sea. During the discharge of the cargo the quarantine officials are to take the greatest care that no rats are landed with the goods; with this object they may require the goods to be first discharged into lighters which have been cleared of rats, and from thence landed under quarantine supervision.

4. Vessels arriving from Russian ports of the European coast of the Black Sea are admitted to pratique after a strict medical inspection of passengers and crew. The baggage and clothes of passengers will be disinfected by steam. The vessels and crews will be disinfected as in paragraph 3, if they have goods to load or to discharge.

5. If a vessel has on board, or has had during the voyage, a suspicious case, or if the sanitary state of the vessel is bad, the quarantine doctor will refuse it admission.

6. All goods from Russia will be subjected to steam disinfection. Goods which cannot be disinfected by steam will be disinfected in another manner, but the disinfection must be thorough.

7. Petroleum and naphtha will be discharged when the vessel has undergone the necessary quarantine. They will be admitted after external disinfection with carbolic acid or sublimate.

8. Vessels entering the Danube from Russia or with passengers from Russia on board must stop at Silistria, where they will be disinfected by the quarantine doctor, who will give them free pratique

for the Danube ports. The quarantine doctor of Silistria will effect a medical inspection of such vessels, and will give them a sanitary certificate or endorse their bills of health. The other quarantine doctors on the Danube will verify the sanitary condition of the vessels.

9. Passengers arriving from Russia by the Danube will be inspected at Silistria. If the medical inspection is satisfactory, and if the passengers produce official certificates from Sulina or Galatz that they have undergone quarantine or medical inspection in Roumania, and that their clothes and effects have been disinfected by steam, they will be admitted into the Principality and the fact endorsed on their certificates. In the contrary case, such passengers will be stopped at Silistria for medical inspection and disinfection of their baggage, after which a certificate of free entry will be granted to them. The quarantine doctors at other Bulgarian stations on the Danube will not allow such passengers to enter Bulgarian territory, unless they produce the certificate of the quarantine doctor of Silistria or a certificate from Sulina or Galatz endorsed by him.

10. Goods coming from Russia by the Danube will be subjected to disinfection as in paragraph 6. Goods which have been rigorously disinfected at Sulina or Galatz will be allowed to pass on production of an official certificate to that effect, endorsed by the quarantine doctor of Silistria.

11. All passengers arriving from Russia and admitted into Bulgaria by the seaports, by the Danube or by land, are subjected at their place of residence to twelve days' sanitary supervision. The quarantine doctors and the passport commissioners at Varna, Bourgas, Tsaribrod, Harmanli, and the Danube ports, will take accurate note of the names and destination of such passengers, and will advise the sanitary authorities concerned by telegraph.

12. Any person endeavouring to avoid such supervision will be isolated and kept in arrest for twelve days for the purpose of supervision.

ORDER of the Local Government Board :
Medical Officer : Additional Appointment :—
Bradford Poor Law Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford Poor Law Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Commissioners prescribed Regulations for the government of any Workhouse of that Union, and made provision for the appointment, duties, and remuneration of certain officers, including a Medical Officer for the Workhouse :

And whereas under the authority of the said Order the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford Poor Law Union have appointed a Medical Officer

for the Workhouse of that Union, and the said Guardians have made application to Us, the Local Government Board, to authorize the appointment of an additional Medical Officer for the said Workhouse :

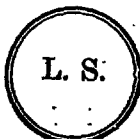
Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order as follows :—

The said Guardians may, as and when they shall deem it expedient, appoint a Medical Officer for the said Workhouse, in addition to the Medical Officer appointed or who may hereafter be appointed for the said Workhouse under the authority of the above-cited Order, and all the provisions of any General or other Orders for the time being in force in the said Union applicable to such an appointment shall apply to any Medical Officer who may be appointed under the authority of this Order :

Provided as follows :—

- (1.) That the Guardians shall from time to time, by resolution, determine what wards or what class of patients shall be under the care of each Medical Officer of the said Workhouse, and in other respects so far as may be necessary determine the distribution of duties between such Medical Officers, and which of the duties of such Medical Officers may be performed, under their superintendence, by an Assistant. A copy of any such resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk to the Guardians as soon as practicable after the passing thereof.
- (2.) That any Medical Officer who may be appointed under the authority of this Order may, if the Guardians think fit, be appointed by the Guardians from time to time, with Our Assent, to discharge the duties of such office for a limited period only.
