THE following Scheme for adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Pudsey, in the county of York, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885 :—

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the district of Pudsey in the county of York in the month of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Pudsey hereinafter described a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the eleventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two Pudsey was constituted a Local Government District and was governed by a Local Board of Health constituted pursuant to and under the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1858," but such Local Board of Health has now become an Urban District Council by virtue of the provisions of "The Local Government Act, 1894."

And whereas there is now in the Treasurer's hands as a Sinking Fund the sum of £1,600 17s. 11d.

And whereas pursuant to section 62 of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the Pudsey District Council resolved that the powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities of the then existing Burial Board of Pudsey should be transferred to

the Council as from the sixteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1888," and by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated twenty-fourth April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1896," which Acts are hereinafter respectively referred to as the said Act of 1888 and the said Act of 1896, and the said Orders and confirming Acts ordered that the Urban Sanitary Districts named in column one of the said Order, namely :—The Urban District Council of Calverley, the Urban District Council of Ecclehill, the Urban District Council of Farsley, the Urban District Council of Idle, and the Urban District Council of Pudsey, should be formed into one united district, called "The Calverley Joint Hospital District," for the purpose of the provision, maintenance and management for the use of the inhabitants of the constituent districts of a hospital or hospitals for the reception of cases of infectious diseases, and it was further provided (inter alia) that all persons should be admitted into the hospital provided by the Joint Board (a.) By an order of the Joint Board or any of the Constituent Authorities ; (b.) By an order of the Medical Officer of Health of any of the Constituent Authorities ; (c.) By an order of the Medical Officer appointed by the Joint Board ; (d.) By an order of a Justice made under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875. And it was further provided that all the expenses incurred by the Joint Board should be defrayed out of a common fund, to which should be paid sums received from the Constituent Authorities in respect of the costs for the maintenance of the patients as thereinbefore provided, and the sums recovered by the Joint Board from or repaid to the Joint Board by or for patients, and further that the common fund so far as the same should not be provided by the payment therein mentioned should be contributed by the Constituent Districts respectively in proportion to the number of inhabitants in each Constituent District.

And whereas according to such latter proviso the Urban District Council of Pudsey provides a proportionate part of the expenses of the said Joint Hospital.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Pudsey when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the West Riding of the County of York.

And whereas the parish of Pudsey for Poor Law purposes is part of and is situate in the North Bierley Union, which Union comprises parishes situate in the county of York.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by and are in force within the district of the District Council, namely, "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and "The Baths and Wash-Houses Act."

And whereas the District Council is the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said District of Pudsey, and such Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Guardians of the Poor of the North Bierley Union in the county of York and the School Board are the Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department to the Local Government Board, and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

Preliminary Provisions.

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Pudsey Scheme, 1899.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Pudsey are in this Scheme referred to as the Corporation.

Borough and Municipal Borough mean the Borough of Pudsey.

"District Council" means the Urban District Council of Pudsey.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

Commencement of Scheme.

This Scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

Sanitary Authority.

The Municipal Borough created by the said

Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme and thenceforward be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

Urban District Council Abolished.

The District Council and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough, and the District Council shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until the commencement of this Scheme be deemed to have been continued, and continue to enjoy, be subject to and exercise the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council and their district shall be abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

Transfer of Jurisdiction, Property, &c., of Urban District Council.

All the jurisdiction, powers, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such including the jurisdiction, powers, duties and properties vested in or possessed as aforesaid under the hereinbefore recited Provisional Order of the Local Government Board of the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and the Confirmation Act relating thereto, and the hereinbefore recited Provisional Order of the Local Government Board of the twenty-fourth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the Confirmation Act relating thereto, or in any way appertaining to the Culverley Joint Hospital Board referred to therein, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the District Council, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said borough.

All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey.

Any investigations, legal proceedings or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme, may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey.

The District Fund and the General District Rate of the borough of Pudsey shall take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund or General District Rate of the Urban District shall be paid to, from or out of and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough respectively.

With respect to the hereinbefore recited Acts and the Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Calverley Joint Hospital Board, and to any matters and things to be done thereunder the following provisions shall have effect:—

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey acting by the Council shall be substituted for the District Council and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties and liabilities vested in, devolving upon or exercisable by the District Council shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses.

No act done or purporting to be done under the authority of such Acts or Orders between the commencement of this Scheme and its confirmation by Parliament or by Order in Council (as the case may be) shall be invalidated by this Scheme but such act shall be and continue to be valid if the same would have been valid but for the operation of this Scheme.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations and liabilities whatsoever of the District Council acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority of the district of Pudsey by virtue of the following Acts, namely, "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and any Act amending or extending the same, the Sanitary Acts as defined by "The Public Health Act, 1875," and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar to those of the aforesaid Acts shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey.

The Town Clerk of the borough of Pudsey shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

Bye-Laws.

The regulations made under "The Dairies, Cowsheds and Milk-Shops Order of 1885," and the bye-laws and lists of fees and charges in force in the Urban District of Pudsey at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, varied or revoked, continue in force, and have operation in the borough, in like manner, and with the like effect, as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses, acting by the Council and their officers and the borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or District Council, as the case may be, and their officers and the District.

The bye-laws for the good rule and government of the administrative county of the West Riding of York, so far as they are now in force in the district of Pudsey, shall continue in force and be enforced within the borough of Pudsey for two years from the commencement of this Scheme or until their earlier repeal or variation as respects the said borough.

School Board.

The Pudsey School Board shall be the School Board for the borough of Pudsey by the name of the Pudsey Borough School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Pudsey School Board by the Education Department the borough of Pudsey had been a municipal borough. Everything in connection with the said Board shall be done, had and construed accordingly.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations, liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the Pudsey School Board immediately

before the commencement of this Scheme, shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Pudsey Borough School Board and all charges charged on the School Fund and in respect of liabilities of the Pudsey School Board on the Poor Rate of the parish of Pudsey immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged upon the School Fund of the Pudsey Borough School Board and upon the Borough Rate or Fund of the said borough and not otherwise.

Any bye-laws made by the Pudsey School Board under the Acts relating to public elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Pudsey Borough School District.

Any act done by the Education Department or the said Pudsey School Board or the Council of the said borough or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done if the said department, School Board, Council or Justice might have lawfully done the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said borough.

Savings for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme by, to or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, entered into or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

Compensation for Existing Officers.

In case any officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council for a period of five years shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Pudsey acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said borough such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided, nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same

manner as if he had not been employed by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses. Provided that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act, stating any special grounds for granting such allowance, shall be necessary or be made.

Provided that the term "officer" shall include any persons employed by the District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons.

Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title, or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question, shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

The accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character and operation, to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, transmitting the annexed copy of an Ordinance respecting quarantine issued by the Bulgarian Government, viz.:—

Ordonnance.

No. 376 du 27 Août, 1899.

Conformément à l'Ordonnance rendue par le Conseil des Ministres le 26 Août a.c. en base d'une décision du Conseil Médical Supérieur de la Principauté le Département de l'Intérieur a édicté les mesures quaranténaires suivantes :

(1.) Aux navires, voiliers, chaloupes et barques de n'importe quelle provenance à destination de Bulgarie, ne seront ouverts que les ports de Bourgas et de Varna où ils recevront également la libre pratique pour les autres ports bulgares de la Mer Noire.

(2.) Est interdite l'importation en Bulgarie des légumes, fruits, conserves, poissons frais et salés, caviar, bouchons de liège, peaux, fourrures, sacs, ayant servi et marchandises provenant de la Province d'Astrakhan et venant de Russia ainsi que des échantillons et colis postaux.

(3.) Les vapeurs, voiliers, chaloupes et barques venant de la Mer d'Azof et de la rive asiatique russe de la Mer Noire, seront soumis à une quarantaine de douze jours. Si un cas suspect se produit parmi les voyageurs et l'équipage en cours de quarantaine, les vapeurs, voiliers, etc., seront repoussés. Une fois la quarantaine terminée, les voyageurs ne pourront entrer en Bulgarie qu'après une désinfection rigoureuse, par la vapeur, de leurs bagages et habits. Il sera procédé de même à l'égard de l'équipage s'il désire descendre à terre. Au cas où le vapeur, voilier, &c., aurait à décharger ou charger des marchandises du port, la désinfection de l'équipage et de tout le navire est obligatoire ; dans ce cas, l'eau qui se trouve dans les cales devra être renouvelée. Toutefois, les eaux des cales ne devront pas être jetées dans le port, mais au large et loin du port. Au déchargement des marchandises, les médecins quaranténaires devront faire grande attention par qu'il ne soit pas transporté à terre des rats avec les marchandises du navire. A cet effet, les médecins quaranténaires ont le droit d'exiger que le déchargement des marchandises soit fait d'abord avec des mahones de contenant pas de rats et desquelles, après un contrôle rigoureux, les marchandises

pourront être déchargées à la rive près du lazaret de la quarantaine.

(4.) La libre pratique des vapeurs, voiliers, &c, venant des ports de la rive européenne russe de la Mer Noire ne sera accordée qu'après un examen médical rigoureux des voyageurs et de l'équipage. Les bagages et habits des voyageurs seront désinfectés à l'étuve. Au cas où le navire aurait à décharger ou charger des marchandises, l'équipage et le navire subiront la désinfection prévue dans le § 3.

(5.) Au cas où le vapeur, le voilier, la barque ou la chaloupe aurait ou aurait eu à son bord un cas suspect, ou bien si la tenue du navire, &c., au point de vue de l'hygiène est mauvaise, le médecin quarantenaire devra absolument faire repousser un pareil vapeur, voilier, &c.

(6.) Toutes les marchandises venant de Russie seront soumises à la désinfection à l'étuve. Les marchandises qui ne supportent pas la désinfection par la vapeur, seront désinfectées par d'autres moyens mais de manière à ce que la désinfection soit complète.

(7.) Le pétrole et le naphte seront déchargés après que le navire le voilier, etc., aura subi la quarantaine établie et ne pourront entrer en Bulgarie qu'après une désinfection extérieures à l'acide phénique ou au sublimé.

(8.) Les vapeurs, voiliers, etc., venant de Russie par le Danube ou transportant des voyageurs de Russie devront s'arrêter à Silistra, où ils seront visités par le médecin quarantenaire et recevront la libre pratique pour tous les ports bulgares sur le Danube. Le médecin quarantenaire de Silistra procédera à la visite sanitaire de ces vapeurs, voiliers, etc., et délivrera le certificat constatant leur état sanitaire ou visera leur patente. Les médecins quarantenaires des autres ports sur le Danube vérifieront l'état sanitaire des vapeurs, etc.

(9.) Les voyageurs venant de Russie par le Danube seront soumis à une visite à Silistra. Si la visite sanitaire est satisfaisante et que les voyageurs produisent des certificats officiels délivrés à Soulina ou à Galatz constatant qu'ils ont subi la quarantaine établie en Roumanie ou qu'ils ont été soumis à une visite sanitaire et que leurs habits et effets ont été désinfectés par la vapeur ils seront autorisés à entrer librement en Bulgarie et ce fait sera mentionné sur leurs certificats. Dans le cas contraire, de pareils voyageurs seront retenus au lazaret de la quarantaine à Silistra pour subir la visite et pour que leurs effets soient désinfectés ainsi que pour être munis d'un certificat de permission. Les médecins des autres ports bulgares du Danube ne laisseront en aucune façon entrer en Bulgarie des pareils voyageurs au cas où ceux-ci ne produiraient pas des certificats délivrés par le médecin quarantenaire de Silistra ou bien si les certificats qui leur ont été délivrés à Soulina ou à Galatz ne seraient pas visés à Silistra.

(10.) Les marchandises venant de Russie par le Danube seront soumises à la désinfection comme il est dit dans le § 6. Celles qui ont subi une désinfection rigoureuse à Soulina ou à Galatz seront admises dans le pays à la présentation d'un certificat officiel à cet effet, visé par le médecin quarantenaire de Silistra.

(11.) Les voyageurs venant de Russie par voie de mer, par le Danube ou bien par voie de terre et dont l'entrée en Bulgarie a déjà été autorisée, seront soumis, à leur lieu de destination, à une observation médicale de douze jours. Les médecins quarantenaires ainsi que les officiers de police chargés de service de passeports à Varna, Bourgas, Tzaribrod, Harmanly et dans les ports du Danube, auront à prendre note exacte du nom et du lieu de

destination des voyageurs de cette catégorie et à aviser par voie télégraphique les autorités sanitaires respectives.

(12.) Quiconque, usant de ruse, réussirait à se soustraire à l'observation médicale mentionnée dans l'article précédent, sera isolé et soumis à une observation forcée pendant douze jours.
