EGYPT.

IN pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 29th day of September, 1899, has been made, on his representation, by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, ordering, directing, and declaring that on and from the 1st day of October, 1899, parcels may, subject to the provisions of the said Warrant and at the rates of postage therein specified, and in accordance with the Regulations therein referred to, be transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and Egypt.

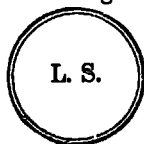
CARDIFF FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF REVOCATION ORDER OF 1899.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven defining a part of the Port of Cardiff as a foreign animals wharf: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.

This Order may be cited as the CARDIFF FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF REVOCATION ORDER OF 1899.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 30TH SEPTEMBER 1899.)

CARDIFF FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF ORDER OF 1899.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Cardiff as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Bute Docks, in the borough of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, situate on the north-west side of the Roath Dock Lock, hereinafter described and consisting of the following parts numbered respectively (1) (2) and (3) on the plan of the said foreign animals wharf hereinafter mentioned, that is to say—
(1) all that part bounded by a line commencing at a point sixty-five feet or thereabouts from the north-west edge of the said Roath Dock Lock, and also three hundred and seventy-five feet measured in a south-westerly direction from a line drawn at right angles to the side of the said Roath Dock Lock through the south-west end of the Gate Recess of the centre pair of Lock Gates, thence in a north-westerly direction for eighty-four feet six inches or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of two hundred and sixty-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in an easterly direction for one hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence for thirty feet or thereabouts and a brick wall for one hundred and forty feet or thereabouts, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of seventy feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence,
