No. 622.—FRANCE—NORTH COAST.

*Cherbourg—Intended Alterations in Lights.*

THE French Government has given notice, dated 16th September, 1899, that the following alterations will be made in certain lights at Cherbourg in the course of this year:—

1. Ile Pelée Light will be altered from fixed white to an occulting white light every four seconds, elevated 67 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The light is exhibited from a metallic tower, 29 feet high, painted white.

Approximate position, lat. 49° 40' N., long. 1° 35' W.

2. Also, that the light on the eastern head of the breakwater will be altered from fixed green to fixed white, showing a green sector between the bearings S. 65° W., through west and north, and N. 8° E. (123°).

The white light will be 59 bees Carcel, 590 candles, in power, and visible 13 miles; the green light 75 candles power, and visible 7 miles.

No. 623.—SPAIN—EAST COAST.

*Intended Light at Peñíscola.*

THE Spanish Government has given notice, that on 15th October, 1899, a light will be established on Papa Luna Battery at Peñíscola.

Peñíscola Light will be a fixed and flashing cata-dioptic light of the 3rd order, the fixed white light being varied by a red flash every minute. It is elevated 180 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of 15 miles in clear weather, between the bearings S. 18° W., through west and north, and N. 54° E.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 21½' N., long. 0° 24½' E.

No. 624.—NORTH ATLANTIC.

*Madeira—Intended Light on Porto Santo Islands.*

INFORMATION has been received from Her Majesty's Consul at Madeira, dated 21st September, 1899, that early next year a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse in course of construction on Cima Islet, Porto Santo Islands.

The light will be elevated 387 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of 18 miles. It will at first be of a temporary character.

Approximate position, lat. 33° 3' 15" N., long. 16° 16' 20" W.
