NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 645 to 657 of the year 1899.)

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 645.—NORWAY.—WEST COAST.

New Lights Exhibited, and Alterations Made.

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that on 15th September, 1899, the following lights would be exhibited:—

1. Biugnskier, Fosen, Light is an occulting light, showing white between S. 25° W. and S. 13° W., red between S. 13° W., through south, and S. 80° E., and white from S. 85° E., through east and north, and N. 64° W. The white light is visible 6 miles and the red 4 miles, between 1st August and 15th May. Illuminating power is, white 40 and red 10 candles.

Approximate position, lat. 63° 45' 35" N., long. 9° 33' 45" E.

[Variation 13° Westerly in 1899.]

2. Bremstenen Light, near Vega, Søndre Helge, is an occulting light on Sorholmnakken, west side of the harbour, showing green between S. 28° W. and S. 80° W., white between S. 80° W. and S. 81° W., red between S. 81° W. and N. 85° W., white between N. 89° W. and N. 86° W., green between N. 86° W. and N. 77° W., white between N. 77° W. and N. 69° W., red between N. 69° W. and N. 57° W., obscured between N. 57° W., through north, and N. 31° E., and white between N. 31° E., through east and south, and S. 28° W. The white light is visible 6 miles and the red 4 miles. Illuminating power is, white 40 and red 10 candles.

Approximate position, lat. 65° 37' 0" N., long. 11° 24' 30" E.

[Variation 12° Westerly in 1899.]

3. Maltsekken, near Grotö, is an occulting light, showing green between S. 7° W. and S. 35° W., red between S. 35° W., through west and north, and N. 54° E. Elsewhere it is obscured. The red light is visible 4 miles and the green 3 miles. Illuminating power is, red 10 candles and green 5 candles.

Approximate position, lat. 67° 50' 10" N., long. 14° 40' 10" E.

[Variation 10° Westerly in 1899.]

4. Oksholmen Lantern Light (the lower leading light for entering Grotö) is altered to show green between S. 2° E. and S. 21° E., white between S. 21° E. and S. 27° E., and red between S. 27° E. through east, and N. 67° E. Elsewhere it is obscured.

Approximate position, lat. 67° 50' 15" N., long. 14° 50' 15" E.

[Variation 10° Westerly in 1899.]

5. Slaakö, near Guldbrandsö, light is an occulting light, showing white between S. 48° E. and S. 53° E., red between S. 53° E. and S. 70° E., white between S. 70° E., through east, and S. 81° E., green between S. 81° E. and N. 9° E., white between N. 9° E. and N. 76° W., and red between N. 76° W. and S. 8° W. Elsewhere it is obscured. The white light is visible 6 miles, the red 4 miles, and the green 3 miles. Illumi-
