

In the High Court of Justice.—Companies
(Winding-up).

Mr. Justice Wright.
No. 00292 of 1899.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts 1862 to 1893 and in the Matter of the Ship and Turtle (Painters) Limited.

BY an Order dated the 4th October 1899 made in the above matters by Mr. Justice Darling sitting as Vacation Judge on the petition of Archibald Edward Dobbs a contributory of the Company it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the Ship and Turtle (Painters) Limited be continued but subject to the supervision of the Court and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Court should think fit. And it was ordered that James Thorne the Liquidator in the voluntary winding up of the said Company do every three months file with the Registrar Companies (Winding-up) a report in writing as to the position of and the progress made in the winding up of the said Company and with the realization of the assets thereof and as to any other matters connected with the winding up as the Court may direct the first of such reports to be filed on the 4th January 1900. And that no bills of costs charges or expenses or special remuneration of any Solicitor employed by the Liquidator or any remuneration of such Liquidator or of any Manager Accountant Auctioneer Broker or other person be paid out of the assets of the said Company unless such costs charges expenses or remuneration shall have been taxed or allowed by the said Registrar and it was ordered that all such costs charges expenses and remuneration be taxed and ascertained

accordingly and it was ordered that the costs of the petitioner of the Company and of the contributories supporting a supervision Order be taxed and paid out of the assets of the said Company, only one set of costs to be allowed between the Company and the contributories and the creditors contributories and Liquidator of the Company and all other persons interested were to be at liberty to apply as there might be occasion and the time for advertising the said Order was extended to the 20th October 1899.—Dated the 17th day of October, 1899.
