ORDER of the Postmaster-General under Section 3, Sub-section (5), of the Telegraph Act, 1899.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3, subsection (5), of the Telegraph Act, 1899, that if the licence of an existing Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") is under the provisions of section 3 of the sail Act extended in respect of any exchange area for a period of not less than eight years the Company shall, at the request of any other licensee of the Postmaster-General providing public telephonic communication in the whole or any part of that exchange area (which other licensee is hereinafter referred to as "the new licensee") and

under such circumstances and on such terms and conditions as within six months from the passing of this Act may be prescribed by an order of the Postmaster-General made with the approval of the Treasury, afford all proper facilities for the transmission of telephonic messages between persons using the system of the Company (either in the whole or in part of the exchange area, as the Postmaster-General may prescribe) and persons using the system of such other licensee, provided that the licensee so requiring inter-communication shall in any such case afford similar facilities:

Now, therefore, I, Henry, Duke of Norfolk, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, by virtue of the powers vested in me for that purpose as aforesaid, and of all other powers vested in me in that behalf, do, with the approval of the Treasury, order as follows:—

- 1. When the subscribers of the new licensee at the date when inter-communication is requested equal or exceed in number one-fourth of those of the Company at that date, in the area specified in the new licence, or number 500, whichever first happens, but not before, mutual inter-communication shall be afforded by the Company and the new licensee between their respective subscribers and other persons using their respective systems in the area specified in the new licence only. Such inter-communication as aforesaid is hereinafter referred to as "restricted inter-communication."
- 2. In any case in which the Company's exchange area, as defined by agreement with the Postmaster-General, exceeds in extent the area specified in the new licence, then, when the subscribers of the new licensee at the date when inter-communication is requested equal or exceed in number one-fourth of those of the Company throughout the whole exchange area of the Company and that date, but not before, mutual intercommunication shall be afforded by the Company and the new licensee between their respective systems throughout the whole exchange area of the Company. Such inter-communication as last aforesaid is hereinafter referred to as "unrestricted inter-communication."
- 3. The fact that restricted inter-communication exists with reference to the system of any new licensee shall not prejudice that licensee in requesting unrestricted inter-communication, and the two kinds of inter-communication may exist side by side on different terms.

4. The Company and the new licensee may make terminal charges not exceeding the following:—

In the case of restricted inter-communication— Per call.

(a.) When the subscribers of the new licensee at the date when intercommunication is requested number 500, but are less than one-fourth in number of the Company's subscribers at that date in the area specified in the new licence ...

(b.) When the subscribers of the new licensee equal or exceed in number one-fourth (but do not equal in number one-half) of the Company's subscribers for the time being in the area specified in the new licence ...

(c.) When the subscribers of the new licensee equal or exceed in number one-half of the Company's subscribers for the time being in the area specified in the new licence

In the case of unrestricted inter-communication— Per call.

(a.) When the subscribers of the new licensee at the date when intercommunication is requested equal or exceed in number one-fourth (but do not equal in number one-half) of those of the Company at that date in the whole of the Company's exchange area,—in respect of inter-communication with the subscribers of the Company and other persons using the system of the Company's exchange area which is not included in the area specified in the new licence

(b.) When the subscribers of the new licensee equal or exceed in number one-half of those of the Company for the time being in the whole exchange area,—in respect of such intercommunication as last aforesaid ...

5. Any new licensee requesting facilities for inter-communication shall satisfy the Postmaster-General that such licensee possesses the required number of bonâ fide subscribers actually working.

6. When inter-communication has once been established—

(a.) it shall be maintained, notwithstanding that the number (actual or relative) of the subscribers to one or other of the inter-communicating systems may subsequently fall below the number which would entitle a new licensee to request inter-communication, and

(b.) no terminal charge shall be increased because the number (actual or relative) of the subscribers to one or other of the intercommunicating systems may fall below the number which first justified such charge, and

(c.) if terminal charges have ceased, they shall not under any circumstances be reimposed.7. The term "subscriber" means any person

7. The term "subscriber" means any person with whom the Company, or the new licensee (as the case may be) has entered into an agreement for at least one year, for the purpose of enabling such person to communicate from time to time with other persons through the medium of an exchange, and does not include persons using call offices on an exchange.

THE COMPANIES (WINDING-UP) ACT, 1890.

GENERAL RULES MADE PURSUANT TO THE COMPANIES ACTS, 1862 TO 1893.

Enforcement of Orders.

Arrests, Commitments, and Execution of Process.

1. [20 a.] (1.) Every Order of a Court having jurisdiction to wind up a Company made in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts and Rules, may be enforced by such Court as if it were a Judgment or Order of the Court made in the exercise of its ordinary jurisdiction.

(2.) Every such Order of a County Court, and every process issued thereon, may be enforced, executed, and dealt with, not only by such Court, but by any County Court, whether such County Court has or has not jurisdiction to wind up a Company, as if such Order or process were made or issued for the enforcement of a Judgment or Order made by such last-mentioned Court under its ordinary jurisdiction.

its ordinary jurisdiction.

2. [20 6] A Warrant of Arrest, or any other warrant, issued under the provisions of the Acts and Rules may be addressed to such Officer of the Court, or to such High Bailiff or Officer of any County Court, whether such County Court has jurisdiction to wind up a Company or not, as the

Court may in each case direct.

Prison to which Person arrested on Warrant is to be taken.

3. [20 c.] Where the Court issues a Warrant for the arrest of a person, under any of the provisions of the Acts or Rules, the prison (to be named in the Warrant of Arrest) to which the person shall be committed shall, unless the Court shall otherwise order, be the prison used by the Court in cases of Orders of Commitment made in the exercise by the Court of its ordinary jurisdiction.

Execution of Warrants of Arrest outside ordinary jurisdiction of Court.

4. [20 d.] Where a Warrant for the arrest of a person has been issued by a Court other than the High Court, under any of the provisions of the Acts and Rules, the High Bailiff of the Court or other Officer of the Court to whom the Warrant is addressed may send the Warrant of Arrest to the Registrar of any other Court (other than the High Court) within the ordinary jurisdiction or district of which such person shall then be or be believed to be, with a Warrant annexed thereto, under the hand of the High Bailiff or Officer and Seal of the Court from which the Warrant originally issued, requiring execution of the Warrant by the Court to which it is so sent, and the Registrar of the last-mentioned Court shall seal or stamp the Warrant with the Seal of his Court, and issue the same to the High Bailiff or other proper Officer of his Court, with an endorsement thereon in the Form 41 B in the Appendix, and thereupon such lastmentioned High Bailiff or Officer may and shall in all respects execute the said Warrant according to the requirements thereof, and all constables and peace officers shall aid and assist within their respective districts in the execution of such Warrant.

To what Prison a Person arrested is to be conveyed.

5. [20 e.] (1.) Where a person is arrested under a Warrant of Commitment issued under any of the provisions of the Acts and Rules other than Sections 115 and 118 of the Companies Act, 1862, and Rule 76 of the Rules, he shall be forthwith conveyed in custody of the Bailiff or Officer apprehending him to the prison of the Court within the ordinary jurisdiction of which he is apprehended, and kept therein for the time mentioned in the Warrant of Commitment, unless sooner discharged by the Order of the Court which originally issued the Warrant of Commitment, or otherwise by law.

Production and custody of Persons arrested under Compunies Act, 186?, Sections 115 and 118 and Rule 76.

(2.) Where a person is arrested under a Warrant, issued under section 115 or section 118 of the Companies Act, 1862, or under Rule 76 of the Rules, he shall be forthwith conveyed in custody of the Bailiff or Officer apprehending him to the prison of the Court within the ordinary jurisdiction of which he is apprehended, and the Governor or Keeper of such prison shall produce such person before the Court as it may from time to time direct, and shall safely keep him until such time as the Court shall otherwise order, or such person shall be otherwise discharged by law. Provided that where any such person is conveyed to a prison other than the prison used by the Court which originally issued the Warrant in cases of Orders of Commitment made by such Court in the exercise of its ordinary jurisdiction, the Court may by Order direct such person to be transferred to such last-mentioned prison; and on receipt of such Order the Governor or Keeper of the prison to which such person has been conveyed shall cause such person to be conveyed in proper custody to the prison mentioned in such Order, and the Governor or Keeper of such last-mentioned prison shall on production of such Order and of the Warrant of Arrest receive such person and shall produce him before the Court as it may from time to time direct, and shall safely keep him until such time as the Court shall otherwise order, or such person shall be otherwise discharged by law.

6. [20 f.] (1.) In these Rules the expression "the Rules" means the Companies (Winding-up) Rules, 1890, and all Rules subsequently made under the provisions of the Acts, and the expression "the Acts" means the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1893.

(2.) These Rules shall come into operation on the 1899. They may be day of cited as the Companies (Winding-up) Rules, 1899, and shall be construed with and deemed to form part of the Companies (Winding-up) Rules, 1890, and each of these Rules may be cited with reference to those Rules by the number in square brackets set against the Rule at the commencement thereof. Denbighshire, Flintshire, and Shropshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Overton, being a detached portion of the county of Flint; the petty sessional division of Oswestry, the municipal borough of Oswestry, and the parishes of Whitchurch-Urban, Whitchurch-Rural (except the detached portion), Ightfield, Whixall, Welsh Hampton, Ellesmere-Urban, Ellesmere-Rural, Cockshutt, Hordley, and Ruyton of the Eleven Towns, in the county of Salop; and also comprising the petty sessional division of Bromfield, together with the detached portion of the petty sessional division of Ruabon, in the county of Denbigh, and the detached portion of the county of Flint situate within the first named petty sessional division; and also comprising the borough of Wrexham. (19 May, 1899).

Essex and Suffolk.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Lexden and Winstree, and Tendring, and the municipal borough of Harwich, in the county of Essex; the petty sessional divisions of Boxford, Cosford, and Melford, and the municipal borough of Sudbury, in the county of West Suffolk; and also comprising the borough of Colchester (28 October, 1899).

Flintshire.—See Denbighshire, Flintshire, and Shropshire.

Glamorganshire.—An Area comprising the petty aessional divisions of Caerphilly Higher, Caerphilly Lower, Miskin Higher, Miskin Lower, and Kibbor, in the county of Glamorgan; and also comprising the borough of Cardiff (3 August, 1899).

Gloucestershire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Tewkesbury (except the parishes of Twyning, and Forthampton), Newent, Gloucester, Cheltenham, Stroud, Whitminster, Horsley, Dursley, and Berkeley; and also comprising the municipal borough of Tewkesbury, and the boroughs of Cheltenham and Gloucester (13 June, 1899).

Lancashire.—(1.)
