The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act 1838" as amended by "The Pluralities Act 1850," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to " the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to " his own diocese, and whenever it shall be "represented to him by the Bishop of any "diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one " or more benefice or benefices, and one or " more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish " or contiguous to each other, and of which the "aggregate population shall not exceed one "thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united " into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the " Province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear " to him that such union may be usefully made, " and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, " sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-" ages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, " such consent being signified in writing under the " hands of such patron or patrons, the said Arch-" bishop shall, six weeks before certifying such " inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-" after directed, cause, with respect to his own dio-" cese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in "other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid " representation to be affixed on or near the prin-"cipal outer door of the church, or in some public " and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, " sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to " any person or persons interested, that he, she, or "they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in " writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, "to the said Archbishop, against such union; " and if no sufficient cause be shown within such "time, the said Archbishop shall certify the in-" quiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in "Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for "Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an "Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-"ages, into one benefice, with cure of souls,

" for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the twenty-third day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninetynine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned Frederick, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to

Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend Ernest Roland Lord Bishop of Chichester as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Saint Martin and the rectory of Saint Olave both in the city of Chichester and county of Sussex having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons may with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and is not of inconvenient extent and that the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity of Chichester being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said rectories of Saint Martin and Saint Olave Chichester respectively consent

to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Chichester, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patrons and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Saint Martin situate in the city and diocese of Chichester and the rectory of Saint Olave, situate in the same city and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Henry Baron James of Heretord Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster acting for and on behalf of Your Most Gracious Majesty (being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Owmby if the same were now vacant and the Very Reverend Edward Charles Wickham, Clerk, Doctor of Divinity, Dean of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln and the Chapter of the same church being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefice of Normanby if the same were now vacant) consent to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no cause has been shown.

"The representation of the Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the patrons before referred to and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said benefices after the same shall be united into one benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say, the first and second turns shall belong to and be exercised by Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria in right of Her said Ducky of Lancaster, Her successors or assigns and the third turn in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln their successors or assigns and so on in the same order for ever and that on the present vacancy the turn shall belong to and be exercised by Her said Majesty and shall be reckoned as the first of the above-mentioned two turns.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Owmby situate in the county and

diocese of Lincoln, and the vicarage of Normanby, situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say: - the first and second turns shall belong to and be exercised by Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria in right of Her Duchy of Lancaster, Her successors or assigns, and the third turn in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, their successors or assigns, and so on in the same order for ever, and that on the present vacancy the turn shall belong to and be exercised by Her Majesty and shall be reckened as the first of the above-mentioned two turns.

"We Frederick by Divine Providence Archbishop of Canterbury do hereby in pursuance of 'The Pluralities Act 1838' certify to Your Majesty in Council that it having appeared to us that the benefice (being a rectory) of Elmstone and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Preston next Wingham both in the county of Kent and our diocese of Canterbury might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice for ecclesiastical purposes we enquired into the circumstances of the case and on such enquiry it appeared:

"That the benefices are contiguous and when united will not be of inconvenient extent.

"That the aggregate population of the parishes of Elmstone and Preston next Wingham according to the latest returns of population made under the authority of Parliament does not exceed five hundred and sixty-eight persons the population of the said parish of Elmstone being seventy-four and the population of the said parish of Preston next Wingham being four hundred and ninetyfour.

"That there is a church belonging to each of The churches are distant the said benefices. about one mile and a quarter from each other.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence belonging to Elmstone but the house formerly occupied as the vicarage of Preston next Wingham but not considered suitable for a residence is let and the rent added to the income of the benefice.

"That the net yearly value of the said-benefice of Elmstone is one hundred and sixty-five pounds or thereabouts and the net yearly value of Preston next Wingham is three hundred and twenty-two pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said benefice of Elmstone belongs to the Reverend Walter Delmar Lindley, M.A. the present Incumbent thereof and the patronage of the said benefice of Preston next Wingham belongs to the Dean and Chapter of Both the said patrons consent to the union of the said two benefices for ecclesiastical purposes only and that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said benefices after the same shall be united into one benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows: -subject to the right of the patron of Elmstone to present on the first vacancy of the united benefice the right of presentation thereto shall for ever thereafter belong to and be vested in and exercised by the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury.

"The copies of the statement of facts and notice before referred to and the consents of the patrons before mentioned are hereunto annexed. "And we do hereby certify the enquiry consents and matters aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council nay in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present and nominate to the said benefices after the same shall be united into one benefice from tine to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say :- subject to the right of the patron of Elmstone to present on the first vacancy of the united benefice the right of presentation thereto shall for ever thereafter belong to and be vested in and exercised by the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury.'

And Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say :- The patron of Elmstone shall present on the first vacancy of the united benefice and on the second and every subsequent vacancy of the united benefice the right of presentation thereto shall belong to, and be vested in and exercised by, the Dean and Chapter of Canterburg.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninetyseven; and of the Act of the ninetcenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fiftyfive; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your

Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime particular district) of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill, of the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton, in the said county and diocese, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill, in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such cures respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill, of the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton, and of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Ilill should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill situate as afore-

" Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick Archbishop of Canterbury as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton, with the consents of the Reverend George Edward Tate of Number 37 Arundel-gardens Kensington Park in the county of Middlesex, Prebendary of Wells Clerk in Holy Orders of the Venerable John Richardson of Saint Edmunds Number 163 Tulse Hill in the said county of Surrey, Archdeacon of Southwark Doctor in Divinity; of the Reverend Handley Carr Glyn Moule Doctor in Divinity Norrisian Professor of Divinity in the University of Cambridge of the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone of the Glade Hampstead in the said county of Middlesex, Minister of Saint John's Chapel Hampstead aforesaid, and Honorary Canon of Christ Church Oxford, and of the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot Vicar of Saint Jude's South Kensington in the said county of Middlesex and Prebendary of Wells, Clerk in Holy Orders (commonly known as the Simeon Trustees) as the patrons of the vicarage of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill aforesaid and with the consents of the Reverend Nathaniel Arthur Garland of Number 109 Church-road Richmond in the said county of Surrey Clerk in Holy Orders, William Brown of Summerhurst, Hungershall Park Tunbridge Wells in the county of Kent Esquire Anthony George Yeates of Number 85 Tulse-hill aforesaid Esquire, Herbert Dalton of Number 12 Broadwater-down Tunbridge Wells aforesaid Esquire, and Joseph Moore of Culross, Faygate, Horsham in the county of Sussex Ésquire, as the patrons of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said

new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill, of the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton and of the new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill aforesaid which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in

Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias,

Upper Tulse Hill comprising: -

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime particular district) of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill of the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill, all in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour, Brixton Hill from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill aforesaid at a point in the middle of the road called Upper Tulse-hill at a distance of five chains or thereabouts from its junction with the road called Brixton-hill and extending thence south-e-stward along the middle of the firstnamed road for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private roadway leading to Tulse Hill House and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said private roadway for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the southeastern corner of the said house where the said private roadway bends towards the north and extending thence still eastward and in a direct line for a distance of seven and a half chains or thereabouts to a point upon the line of fences which forms the western boundary of the houses and premises situate upon the western side of the road called Tulse-hill, and extending thence northward along the said line of fences for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby passing in part along the eastern end of Craster-road, and along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Medora-road and along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of the southern end of Leander-road and thereby passing for a short distance along the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill from the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton aforesaid) to the point where the said line of fences is joined by the line of fences dividing the houses and premises situate on the north-eastern side of the northern end of the said Leander-road from the houses and premises situate on the south-western side of the south-western branch of Appach-104d aforesaid, and extending thence north-westward along the last-described line of fences for a distance of seven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as Number 1 Leanderroad from certain houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of the road called Josephineavenue and extending thence first south-westward
