THE Netherlands Government has given notice, that on 1st November, 1899, a light-vessel, named Uitlegger (Guardship), would be established in Vlie Roadstead, northern entrance to the Zuider Zee.

Uitlegger Light-vessel exhibits from the foremast a green fixed light over a white fixed dioptric light, elevated 52 feet and 39 feet respectively above the sea, and visible in clear weather, the green light 4 miles and the white light 6 miles.

During thick or foggy weather a fog horn will give one blast of ten seconds duration every three minutes.

This Light-vessel is painted black, has two masts, with a blue flag hoisted at the fore, and is moored about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. by S. from the east point of Vlieland.

When temporarily withdrawn, owing to ice or other causes, the Light-vessel will be replaced, if practicable, by a pilot boat showing similar lights and flags.

If out of position or drifting, a red flag will be hoisted at the fore by day, and at night a red light will be exhibited at each end of the vessel.

N.B.-This change of wind is usually followed by strong winds or gales from the southward.

Westerly Gales .- The cone hoisted point downwards will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the westward—that is, from about west, changing by the south-west towards south.

N.B.-After these gales have moderated the wind generally backs to the north-west or to the north ; but should the southerly gale continue for alonger time than usual the wind may be ex-e pcted to work round as far as south-east.
