ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 17TH NOVEMBER 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The holding of a market or fair of cattle sheep or swine in any highway or thoroughfare within the Urban District of Usk, in the county of Monmouth, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a market or fair of cattle sheep or swine is held in contravention of this Order, the person holding the same, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereof of any cattle sheep or swine, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or fair to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred.
