

Rural District Council; the Acquisition and Appropriation of Lands and Construction of Works; the Breaking up and Interference with Streets; the Laying Down and Erection of Electric Lines, Wires, Posts, and Apparatus; the Taking and Recovery of Rates and Charges; Incorporation of Acts and other Provisions.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Urban District Council of the Urban District of Romford, in the county of Essex (hereinafter called "the Council"), and whose address is at the Council Offices, Market-place, Romford, intend to apply to the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes, that is to say:—

1. To authorize the Council to generate and supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electric Lighting Acts within the whole of the Urban District of Romford and the parish of Romford Rural in the district of the Romford Rural District Council in the county of Essex aforesaid (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To enable the Council to acquire by agreement, or take on lease and hold lands and premises or interests or easements in or over lands, and to appropriate for the purposes of the Order any lands belonging to or held by them, and to construct and maintain upon such lands all necessary stations and works for the generation and supply of electricity, together with all buildings, engines, apparatus, works and appliances necessary for the purposes aforesaid, and to empower the Council to sell or dispose of any lands not required for the purposes of the Undertaking.

3. To authorize the Council to break up the following streets, viz.:—In the Urban District, Birkbeck-road, Cottleigh-road, Como-street from Mawney's-road to the River Rom, Cedar-street, Carlton-road, East-road, Errul-road, Grosvenor-road, Gilbert-road, Honiton-road, Junction-road from the High-road to the Old Junction-road, Kingston-road, Lilliput-road, Linden-street, Laurie-square, Mildmay-road from Marks-road to Palm-road, and from Palm-road to Oak-street, Marks-road, Mawney's-road from Olive-street to Vine-street, and from Vine-street to the boundary of the Urban District, Moss-lane, Nursery-walk, Oak-street, Olive-street, Palm-road from Mawney's-road to Mildmay-road, and from Mildmay-road to Marks-road, Poplar-street, Stockland-road, Vine-street, Wolseley-road, West-road, Willow-street, and the new road from Mawney's-road to Mildmay-road, the roadway under the Great Eastern Railway bridge at Jutsom's-lane from the bridge to the level, and the roadway over the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway in Victoria-road.

And in the parish of Romford Rural:—Beech-road, Cross-road, Catherine-road, Elm-road, Essex-road, Factory-road, Forest-road, Hainault-road East House Estate, Hainault-road Mawney's Estate, Hamilton-road, Heath Park-road, Margaret-road, Marlborough-road, Mawney's-road from the boundary of the Urban District to Collier-row-lane, Rosedale-road, Salisbury-road, White Hart-lane from opposite Gobion's to Havering Lodge.

4. The names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—South-street from Victoria-road to the Market-place Corner, High-street from the Market-place Corner to Waterloo-road, the Mar-

ket-place from the Corner to Hill House, now in the occupation of Mr. J. S. Hammond, North-street from the Market-place Corner to Como-street, Victoria-road throughout its whole length within the Romford Urban District.

5. To authorize the Council to take, collect and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of electricity, and the use of any machine, lamps, meters, fittings, or apparatus connected therewith and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged for electricity.

6. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary, or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

7. To incorporate with the Order the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting Clauses Act, 1899.

And notice is hereby given, that the draft of the Order will be deposited at the offices of the Board of Trade, on or before the 21st day of December next, and printed copies of the Draft Order when deposited, and of the Order when made, may be obtained (at the price of one shilling for each copy) at the Council Offices, Romford, and at the office of the undermentioned Solicitor and Parliamentary Agents respectively.

And notice is hereby further given, that a map showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply, and the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time, and a copy of this advertisement as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited on or before the 30th day of November instant for public inspection at the offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, at his office at Chelmsford, and at the Council Offices, Market-place, Romford, and at the offices of the Romford Rural District Council situate in North-street, Romford.

And notice is hereby further given, that every other authority, company, or person desirous of bringing before the Board of Trade any objection respecting the application must do so by letter addressed to the Board of Trade, marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it "Electric Lighting Act" on or before the 15th day of January, 1900, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned Solicitor or Parliamentary Agents.
