Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly voritten on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, February 20, 1990. THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, information to the effect that an Italian Ordinance has been issued, declaring the ports of New Caledonia, of the Hawaiian Islands, and of Ohaman (sic) infected with plugue, and that the provisions of the Ordinances of 8th May, 1897, No. 3, 15th July, 1897, No. 6, and 23rd January, 1900, No. 1, will be applicable to ships arriving from those ports. The sanitary measures to be performed exclusively in the ports of Genoa, Leghorn, Naples, Palermo, Messina, Brindisi, and Venice, which will thus be the only points where such ships can touch Italy for the first time.

Extent of Bye-laws.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

Speed of Car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than 4 miles an hour on the average, and not in any case exceeding 8 miles an hour; and in passing along Margaret-street, the driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed not exceeding 4 miles an hour.

Distance from other Cars.

3. The driver of every car, except a trailer car, shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards.

Stopping for Passengers.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made; provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

Prohibiting Stopping at Certain Places.
