Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the

necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards. with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 23rd FEBRUARY 1900.)

BEDFORDSHIRE AND HERTFORDSHIRE SALES AND MOVEMENT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Markets &c. in Scheduled District.

1. The holding of a market, or of a public sale or exhibition of cattle, sheep, or swine, within the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District) is hereby prohibited.

Movement out of into or within Scheduled District. 2.-(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of or into the Scheduled District.

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved along a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement within Scheduled District for Slaughter. 3.-(1.) An animal may be moved from any

premises in the Scheduled District (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place) to a slaughter-house within such District provided that the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence and marked as required by this Article.

- (2.) The Licence shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to

the effect:

(i.) that the animal is not affected with Footand-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to

the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence, in the case of an animal within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, may be granted by an Inspector of the Board for movement to the nearest available slaughterhouse, and in the case of any other animal may be granted either by such Inspector or by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

(4.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the animals are to be moved.

(5.) Every animal shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense

of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow A about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep .- By the clipping of a broad arrow A on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition namely: -Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm: or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.

(6.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and be accompanied by the Licence and shall be slaughtered after its arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

Movement within Scheduled District across a highwoy between different parts of a Farm in the same occupation.

4. An animal may be moved by the nearest available route along or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled District from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm being in the same occupation, provided that the animal to be moved is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and that the animal is not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area, and that the movement of such animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Movement of Animals by Railway through Schrduled District.

5. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal out of or into the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Saving for Regulations of Local Authority. 6. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any (ii.) that the movement of the animal is not Disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and

also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of this Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.
8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a market or a public sale or exhibition of cattle, sheep, or swine is held in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or sale is held, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in

charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows an animal to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of

an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture: "Animal" includes cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894,

Revocation of Order.

11. The Order described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked, or affect any obligation or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the Bedford-SHIRE AND HERTFORDSHIRE SALES AND MOVE-MENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.
