Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

Ry Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levées.



(i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period; and

- (ii.) that the animal is not affected with Footand-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
- (iii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) Where the Licence is expressly stated to be for movement for breeding purposes, the Licence shall be available for the movement of the animal back to the premises from which it was moved under the Licence, provided that such movement takes place within the four days during which such Licence is available.

(4.) No Licence shall be granted for movement for breeding purposes to premises in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area.

(5.) The Licence may be granted either by an Inspector of the Board or by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

(6.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.

(7.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and be accompanied by the Licence.

Movement into Scheduled District between different Farms in the same occupation.

2. Where a person occupying a farm or premises within the Scheduled District also occupies another farm or premises outside the Scheduled District an animal may be moved from the lastmentioned farm or premises to the farm or premises of such person within the Scheduled District with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Board upon such a Declaration, and subject to such other conditions, as are prescribed by the preceding Article of this Order.



4. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty, upon, or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the

Company. 5. No passenger shall smoke inside any in or on any carriage.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or per-

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7. No person shall swear, or use obscene or offensive language, whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passengers.

8. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to mount or enter upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

9. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed or other notice in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor; and if found in the interior of any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly-authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly-authorised servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

14. Personal luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers), shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior, or on the roof of any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the carriage any luggage which, from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

15. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain

in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so. Any passenger refusing to leave after being so warned shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Bye-Laws.
