Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven and of the Act of the fifth year of Her Majesty (Session two) chapter twenty-six duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-second day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven and of the Act of the fifth year of Your Majesty (Session two) chapter twenty-six have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for providing the Bishop of Bangor with a

more convenient house of residence.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of February in the same year a sale of the house and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging situate in the city of Bangor and vested as and for an episcopal house of residence in the said Bishop of Bangor was authorized and the proceeds of such sale were ordered to be applied firstly in defraying all costs charges and expenses of and incident to such sale and secondly in defraying the cost of providing in such manner and at such times as shall be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners a more suitable episcopal house of residence with the appurtenances thereto which shall be within a reasonable distance from the city of Bangor aforesaid.

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order a house and premises with the appurtenances thereto situate within the parish of Llandegfan in the county of Anglesey and within a radius of two miles from the said city of Bangor has been approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as suitable to be acquired as and for a new episcopal house of residence for the said Bishop

of Bangor.

"And whereas the moneys which will be available from the proceeds of the sale of the present episcopal house of residence will be insufficient for the purpose of acquiring the proposed new

episcopal house of residence.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Watkin Herbert now Bishop of Bangor is desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of acquiring the said proposed new episcopal house of residence a sum of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong to the bishoprick of Bangor.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Watkin Herbert Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the pro-

three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in manner following that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term of thirty-five years computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one thirtieth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding periods of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for a space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said Watkin Herbert now Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the said sum of three thousand: two hundred and fifty pounds shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that, upon the receipt of the said sum ofthree thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards the provision of the said proposed new episcopal house of residence.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein-before named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by

and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bangor.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, March 10, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notice respecting quarantine at Malta,

Government Notice No. 45.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 323 of the 7th December, 1899, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz .:-

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.

(a) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage, cases of cholera, yellow fever, or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholern, yellow fever, or plague.

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.
(c.) Vessels arriving from Arabian posts in the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal and take in provisions under quarantine restrictions.

(a.) Vessels arriving from Indian and Arabian ports without a clean bill of health which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health, which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations.

3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergostrict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from Indian and Arabian ports on board vessels that do not carry a doctor, shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments, where they will be subjected to strict medical inspection until their clothing and all other articles of personal use, likely to retain infection, shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

(b.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from the above places on board vessels that carry a doctor, shall be permitted to land; but no luggage shall be landed before it is disinfected in

one of the quarantine establishments.

5. Goods. The importation of coffee, beans or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health is prohibited.

The importation of cotton seed from any port

subject to quarantine is forbidden.

The importation of rags is prohibited. The importation is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, viz, wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, feathers, bones and jute goods.

The importation from India is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, besides those mentioned in the next preceding subsection: used sacks, as also carpets and embroideries which have been in use, raw skins, fresh skins, and untanned skins; animal débris, such as hoofs, manes, hair; raw silk, wool, and human hair.

The importation of hides from any port subject to quarantine or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinfection.

The importation of vines, vine shoots and fruit packed in vine leaves, is prohibited. The importation of plants, or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate from the British Consular Authority that Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK SALES AND MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Alteration of Boundaries of Scheduled District.

1.-(1.) The Scheduled District for the purposes of this Order and of the Norfolk and Suffolk Sales and Movement (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 shall after the commencement of this Order be the District described in the First Schedule to this Order.

(2.) Part II of the Norfolk and Suffolk Sales and Movement (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 is revoked, and the following provisions are substituted therefor.

Movement within Scheduled District for purposes other than Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area) to any other premises within such District for purposes of breeding, feeding, isolation, or lambing, provided that the animal is accompanied

- (2.) The Licence shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the
 - (i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period; and

(ii.) that the animal is not affected with Footand Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and

(iii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

- (3.) Where the Licence is expressly stated to be for movement for breeding purposes, the Licence shall be available for the movement of the animal back to the premises from which it was moved under the Licence, provided that such movement takes place within the four days during which such Licence is available.
- (4.) No Licence shall be granted for movement for breeding purposes to premises in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area.
- (5.) The License may be granted either by an Inspector of the Board or by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.
- (6.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.
- (7.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and be accompanied by the

Movement into Scheduled District between different Farms in the same occupation.

3. Where a person occupying a farm or premises within the Scheduled District also occupies another

by a Movement Licence as required by this | farm or premises outside the Scheduled District an animal may be moved from the last-mentioned farm or premises to the farm or premises of such person within the Scheduled District with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Board upon such a Declaration, and subject to such other conditions, as are prescribed by the preceding Article of this Order.

Revocation of Orders.
4. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the com. mencement of this Order revoked to the extent there mentioned: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under an Order hereby revoked, or affect any obligation or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, an Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

5. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any Disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of March, one thousand nine
