Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

OFFICIAL VOCABULARY FOR CODE TELEGRAMS.

SECOND EDITION.

NOTICES on the subject of a second edition of the Official Vocabulary for Code Telegrams published by the International Bureau of Telegraph Administrations, appeared in the London Gazette of 23rd February, 1897, 13th April, 1897, 16th July, 1897, and 3rd December, 1897.

In the notice of 23rd February, 1897, it was intimated that, under the decision of the International Telegraph Conference, held at Budapest in 1896, a new edition of the Vocabulary was to be compiled, the use of which was to become obligatory both for European and extra-European telegrams, but not until a date to be fixed by a future Conference.

This edition is now approaching completion. It will appear in four volumes containing in all about 1,300,000 words. The first volume has been published and the remaining volumes will appear at intervals of a few months.

The work will be sold in this country by the Post Office at a charge of £3 4s. 0d., payable in advance. Application for copies should be addressed to "The Secretary, General Post Office, London."

The notice of 23rd February, 1897, contained a translation of a circular from the International Bureau explaining that the second edition would be compiled on an entirely different principle from the work published in 1894. It was stated that the new Vocabulary would not be suitable for use as a code, but would bear the character of a vocabulary pure and simple, i.e., a standard collection of words from which codes might be compiled, and that no attention would accordingly be paid to typographic, telegraphic, or phonetic similarity between words.

In these circumstances, persons who may have purchased the 1894 edition as a selection of words sufficiently dissimilar to admit of all the words being used for code telegrams as they stand, will find the new edition unsuitable for this purpose; in fact there will be confusion if words are taken from the new standard list without careful selection.

The following extracts from the observations of the International Bureau in the preface to the first volume give a further description of the nature of the new Vocabulary:—

Extracts from Preface to the Second Edition of the Official Vocabulary.

"The Official Vocabulary has been created with the object of remedying certain abuses and inconveniences which in course of time arose in connection with telegrams in preconcerted language. Consequently the Vocabulary is destined to serve as a guide for the choice of words to be used in this class of telegraphic correspondence."

"In order to adapt it exclusively to this use, the Administrations of the Telegraph Union have entrusted the International Bureau with the elaboration of a second edition, which differs from the first in this, that it will be a mere list of words, absolutely free from those features which might give it the character of a code and permit it to be used as such. The words of the eight languages, authorized for telegraphic correspondence in preconcerted language, appear in this work in alphabetical order, without being numbered, and are inserted without regard to their orthographic resemblance, or their telegraphic or phonetic similarity."

"The regulations of the international service, revised at Budapest in 1896, provide that, from a

date to be fixed by a later Conference, all the words used in private telegrams worded in preconcerted language must be taken from the Official Vocabulary."

"The new Official Vocabulary includes the words of the first edition, and in addition, all legitimate words contained in codes and private vocabularies transmitted to the Bureau for the purpose of having the words inserted."

"According to the present plan the new edition of the work will contain about 1,300,000 words, divided into four volumes."

"In conclusion it is repeated that the Official Vocabulary, not being a code, cannot be used as such for correspondence in preconcerted language."
