Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Quarantine Ordinance issued by the Italian Government, viz.:—

(Translation.)

Ministry of the Interior.

1900. Sanitary Maritime Ordinance. No. 8.

The Minister of the Interior:—

With a view to according to navigation and commerce all the facilities compatible with the exigencies of the sanitary service, and especially with the object of avoiding delay in the admission to free pratique of steamers, which, though having a clean bill of health, have to undergo the doctor's visit and disinfection for the sole reason that they come from ports infected with bubonic plague;

With reference to Law No. 5849 (Series 3A) of December 22nd, 1888, on the protection of public health and hygiene;

Decreases:

ART. 1. On steamers coming from places which are declared to be infected with bubonic plague and bound for Italian ports, a doctor will be embarked, nominated, as occasion arises, by this Ministry, when a formal request is made by the various owners and captains.

ART. 2. The said doctor is charged with the general supervision on board during the passage; and, during the twenty-four hours which precede the arrival of the steamer in an Italian port, he must satisfy himself that the disinfection of soiled objects of personal and domestic use has been carried out, and he will proceed to medically examine all the persons on board.

ART. 3. He is further bound, on the arrival of the steamer, to present to the Port Authorities his written declaration indicating the hygienic and sanitary conditions on board as well as any steps in the way of treatment that should be taken. Should everything be declared to be in perfect order, the steamer, in respect of its sanitary condition, will be forthwith admitted to free pratique; if, on the other hand, anything abnormal is reported on board, the steamer will be submitted to such measures as are prescribed for various cases by the Sanitary Maritime Ordinances at present in force.

ART. 4. The above-mentioned doctor has the right to a free first-class passage and board, and his fees, fixed for each case by arrangement with this Ministry, shall be at the charge of the Company or owners of the steamers.

ART. 5. The provisions of the Sanitary Maritime Ordinance No. 3 of March 8th, 1897, remain substantially unchanged, only being modified by the present Ordinance in the manner of the carrying out of the doctor's visit and of the disinfection, and only for those steamers which, from their departure to their arrival, have been constantly kept in normal condition.

The Prefects of Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of the present Ordinance.

Circular from the Royal Government of Norway. Department of Justice and Police,

Christiania, March 15, 1900.

SIR,—A Royal Proclamation has been issued, dated the 10th instant as follows:—

With reference to Royal Proclamations of the 1st February, 1897, 27th June, 22nd August, 10th and 27th October, and 12th July, 1899, notice is hereby given by virtue of the Quarantine Act of the 12th July, 1848, section 2, that all ports in Japan, Argentina, the Sandwich Islands, and New Caledonia, are to be regarded until further notice as infected by the Oriental plague, and that the Plague Quarantine Regulations set forth in the Act above-mentioned and in the notice of

the 12th September, 1899, are to come into force immediately.

Notice is also given, that the ports in Egypt and Santos in Brazil, which were declared to be pest-smitten in the above-mentioned Proclamations of the 27th June and the 27th October, 1899, shall no longer be regarded as infected.

Whereunto all those whom it may concern have humbly to submit themselves.

In bringing the above Proclamation to your notice I would point out that, by virtue of the above-mentioned Proclamations of the 1st February, 1897, 27th June, 22nd August, 10th and 27th October, and 5th December, 1899, the following places shall, until further notice, be regarded as infected by the oriental plague:—Oporto (town of), Portugal; Mozambique, including Lorenzo Marques; Arabia; Persia; India; China; Formosa; Mauritius; Madagascar; Paraguay (port of).

London County Council (Money).

(Annual Capital Expenditure of the Council, 1st April, 1900, to 31st March, 1901, and following six months; Subjects and Items of Expenditure; Provisions as to Loans by the Council; Raising of Money by the Creation and Issue of Stock and Bills; Use of the Consolidated Loans Fund, &c.; Amendment of Acts.)

THE London County Council (in this notice called the Council) intend to apply to Parliament in the present session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following purposes, namely:—

To define the amounts which the Council may expend for the various purposes for which capital expenditure is necessary during the financial year commencing 1st April, 1900, and (on account of the next financial year) during the following six months.

These purposes include (among others):—

Providing sites for stations, buildings, piers for river stations, new float, additions to permanent plant, and hydrants for the purposes of the Fire Brigade Act, 1865.

Purchase, acquisition, laying out, planting and improvement of parks, gardens, and open spaces.

Fencing, drainage, buildings, entrance gates, bandstands, shelters, gymnasiums, appliances and conveniences of various kinds in parks and open spaces, formation and improvement of lakes ponds new river-wall camp shedding and water supply.

Contributions towards purchase, acquisition, laying out and improvement of open spaces, gardens, and recreation grounds.

Purchase of property, compensations, and works in connection with the tunnel authorized by the Thames Tunnel (Blackwall) Acts, 1887 and 1888, including formation of approaches and provisions for rehousing persons displaced.

Purchase of property, compensations, and construction of subway, authorized by the Thames Tunnel (Greenwich to Millwall) Act 1897.

Schemes and contributions to schemes, acquisition of lands, erection of dwellings, and other expenditure under the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890.

Purchase of sites for and the erection of Coroners' Courts under the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and Acts amending the same.

Purposes mentioned in section 144 of the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and section 72 of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

General expenditure upon improvements and works sanctioned by Parliament.

Provision of dwellings in connection with the rebuilding of Battersea Bridge under the Metropolitan Board of Works (Bridges) Act, 1884.

Purchase of property, compensations, and works in connection with the St. George's-place, Knightsbridge, improvement under the London Council (General Powers) Act, 1891.

Electric lighting on Victoria Embankment and Westminster Bridge.

Highgate Archway reconstruction.

Tower Bridge southern approach, purchase of property, compensations, and works, and dwellings for rehousing persons displaced.

Rebuilding Vauxhall Bridge, including the formation of approaches.

Construction of steps at the southern approach to Wandsworth Bridge.

Purchase of property, compensations, and works, dwellings for persons displaced, and incidental expenses in connection with the Tower

Bridge northern approach, and the widening of the Strand at Holywell-street, and Tottenham Court-road at Bozier's-court.

Purchase of property, compensations, and works, and the rehousing of persons displaced in connection with the widening of Long-lane, Battersea Park-road, Holloway-road, Old-street, and Goswell-road, and formation of a new street in Southwark.

Purchases of property, compensations, and works under London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1898, viz. :—

- (a.) Roehampton-street, Westminster continuation.
- (b.) York-road, Battersea and Wandsworth widening.
- (c.) Albert Embankment widening.
- (d.) Rosemary Branch Bridge over Regent's Canal widening.
- (e.) Removal of certain gates, bars, or other obstructions in streets.

Purchases of property, compensations, and works, rehousing of persons displaced, and other incidental expenditure under the London County Council (Improvements) Act, 1899, viz. :—

- (a.) New street, Holborn to Strand.
- (b.) Southampton-row widening.

Provision of reformatories for inebriates, erection and adaptation of buildings, furnishing, equipment, and incidental expenditure in connection therewith.

Provision of sites for and erection of stations for the verification and stamping of weights and measures and the provision of standards and appliances.

Acquiring sites for and providing new offices for the Council.

Provision of workshops, erection of buildings, machinery, &c.

Widening and reconstructing certain county bridges.

Improving spans and headways of railway bridges over or under streets.

Purchase of tramways under the Acts relating to tramways, cost of extensions, purchase of lands, and erection of new or enlargement of existing depôts, doubling of lines, provision of additional horses and rolling stock, and equipment of experimental line for electrical traction, and incidental expenses.

Providing sites for and building gas-meter testing stations and providing apparatus for testing gas-meters.

Provision of electric testing plant.

Extensions of precipitation and other works at

pumping stations and outfalls, new pumping stations, engines, boilers, machinery, &c., sewerage works, including new main sewers and relief sewers.

Other purposes authorized by statute but not included above.

The execution of any powers which may be conferred upon the Council by any other Acts of the present session if their Bills now pending in Parliament or any of them are passed into law :—including street improvements, embankment and other works, contribution towards cost of Dollis Hill, construction, reconstruction, or widening of tramways, including adaptation for working by electrical traction, generating station, railway siding, &c., purchase of land, construction of tunnel under the River Thames, purchase of Spitalfields Market, acquisition of Undertakings of the London Water Companies and Staines Reservoirs Joint Committee, and construction of new waterworks, reservoirs, aqueducts, &c.

The execution of powers to be conferred on the Council by any Order under the Light Railways Act, 1896.

Generally all other subjects in respect of which capital expenditure is or may be necessary during the current financial year, commencing April, 1900, and (on account of the next financial year) during the following six months.

To enable the Council from time to time to raise money by the creation and issue of Consolidated Stock or Bills, or by borrowing to such amount as may be necessary for the purposes defined in the intended Act, and to make provisions as to the redemption of such stock or repayment of such bills or loans and the payment of dividend or interest thereon out of the Consolidated Loans Fund or otherwise, and to include in their estimates and precepts for the purpose of the county rate such sums as may be requisite for those purposes.

To make further provisions as to the redemption or conversion of stock and the purchase of such stock from time to time by the Council with a view to the extinction thereof.

To confer further powers with respect to the Consolidated Loans Fund and the management investment and use of money standing to the credit of that fund and other moneys of the Council.
