**REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.**

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levées.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of August in any year, both days inclusive, except with respect to the following birds:—

Wryneck, Swallow, Martin, Swift, Bearded Tit, Red-backed Shrike, Kestrel, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Peregrine Falcon, Raven, Kentish Plover, Bustard, Black-headed Bunting, Corn Bunting, Yellow Hammer, Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Flycatcher (both species), Landrail, Merlin, Nuthatch, Redstart, Stonechat, Long-tailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Wagtails (all species), Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler, Blackcap, Dartford Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Chiffchaff, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Tree Sparrow.

#### *Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During the period from the 1st day of September in any year to the last day of February following, both days inclusive, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Oriole, Chough, Kingfisher, Hoopoe, Dartford Warbler, Bearded Tit, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Common Kite, Nightjar or Goatsucker, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, White Owl, Common Bittern, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Avocet, Great Crested Grebe, Goldfinch, Crossbill, Woodlark, Pied Flycatcher, Little Bittern, Siskin, Redpole, Wheatear, Raven, Tree Sparrow.

#### *All Birds protected on Sundays in certain areas.*

V. During that period of the year to which the protection given by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended by clause II of this

Order does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Sussex, except in so much of the Poor Law Union of Cuckfield as is comprised in the parishes of Bolney and Twineham which area is outlined in red on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 17th April, 1900

#### Eggs.

#### *All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.*

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

*All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Parishes.*

IV. During the period from the 13th day of August in any year to the last day of February following, both days inclusive, the taking or killing of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within so much of the County of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District, namely in the following parishes:—Beckenham, Bexley, Bromley, Chislehurst, Crayford, Down, Erith, Farnborough, Footscray, Hayes, Keston, St. Mary Cray, Mottingham, North Cray, Orpington, St. Paul's Cray, East Wickham and West Wickham.

*Act of 1880 applied to Certain Birds outside the Metropolitan Police District.*

V. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within so much of the County of Kent as is not within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Chaffinch, Flycatchers (2), Hawfinch, Hen Harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kentish Plover, Kestrel, Martin, Merlin, Moorhen, Osprey, Peregrine Falcon, Swallow, Swift, Turtle Dove, Wryneck.

*Act of 1880 applied to Certain Birds within the Metropolitan Police District.*

VI. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within so much of the County of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—Shrike, Kestrel, Wryneck, Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie.

*Eggs.*

*All Eggs Protected in Certain Areas.*

VII. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs is prohibited within the following areas in the county of Kent for the space of two years, from the date of this Order.

1. So much of the Isle of Sheppey (including therein Elmley Island) as lies south of the road running from Queenborough, through Eastchurch, to Warden Point.

2. An area bounded on the west by so much of the Sittingbourne and Sheerness Railway as lies between Kingsferry and the Sittingbourne Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the London Chatham and Dover Railway from Sittingbourne Railway Station to Whitstable Railway Station, and bounded on the east by the

main road from Whitstable Station to the sea, and bounded on the north by the Swale and Whitstable Bay.

3. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District:—Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls, Shrike, Kestrel, Wryneck, Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Redstart, Flycatchers (2), Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Longtailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wagtails (4), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (3), Starling, Landrail or Corn-crake, Coot.

*Repeal of Former Order.*

X. The Order of the 25th February, 1899, is hereby repealed.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke in the saloon or lower compartment of any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number-plate printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor,

might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from mounting any carriage, and shall not mount any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor, or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person, not being an official of the Company, shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

19. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded firearms.

20. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

21. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

23. The expression "conductor" shall include

any officer or servant in the employment of the Company.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1900.
