## PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

**VICTORIA, R.I.**

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India. To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS We, taking into Our Royal consideration that there do not exist adequate means whereby We can reward important and useful services rendered to Us in Our Indian Empire in the advancement of the public interests of Our said Empire, and taking also into consideration the expediency of distinguishing such services by some mark of Our Royal favour: now for the purpose of attaining an end so desirable as that of thus distinguishing such services aforesaid, We have instituted and created, and by these presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, do institute and create a new Decoration—to be designated as hereinafter described—and We are graciously pleased to make, ordain, and establish the following Rules and Ordinances for the Government of the same which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept.

*Firstly.*—It is ordained that this Decoration shall henceforth be styled and designated "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India."

*Secondly.*—It is ordained that any person without distinction of race, occupation, position, or sex, shall be eligible for this Decoration who shall have distinguished himself (or herself) by important and useful service in the advancement of the public interest in India.

*Thirdly.*—It is ordained that there shall be two classes of the Decoration to be styled respectively "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India" of the First Class and "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India" of the Second Class.

*Fourthly.*—It is ordained that awards of the Medal of the First Class shall be made by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by Warrant under Our Sign Manual, and countersigned by One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and such awards shall only be made on a recommendation to Us by Our Secretary of State for India.

*Fifthly.*—It is ordained that awards of the Medal of the Second Class shall be made by Our Governor-General of India for the time being.

*Sixthly.*—It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of an oval-shaped Badge or Decoration,—in gold for the First Class and in Silver for the Second Class,—with Our Royal Cypher in the centre on one side and on the reverse the words "Kaisar-i-Hind, for Public Service in India," and that it shall be suspended on the left breast by a dark blue ribbon.

*Seventhly.*—It is ordained that the names of those persons to whom a Medal of either class may be awarded shall be published in the "Gazette of India," and in the Gazette of the Local Government under the jurisdiction of which the service was rendered, and shall be entered in all Civil and Official lists, and that a registry of such names shall be kept in the Office of the Home Department of the Government of India.

*Eighthly.*—It is ordained that if any one, after having received either of the Medals, again renders such service as, if he had not received such Medal, would have entitled him to it, such further service shall be recorded by a bar attached to the ribbon by which the Medal is suspended; and for every such additional service an additional bar may be added.

*Ninthly.*—In order to make such additional provisions as shall effectually preserve pure this

honourable decoration, it is ordained that if any person on whom the Medal of the First Class is conferred be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our Judgment disqualifies him for the same, his name shall, by an especial Warrant under Our Sign Manual, to be countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, be forthwith erased from the lists of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred, and his Medal forfeited and returned to Us, Our Heirs and Successors; and in the case of those who have been awarded Medals of the Second Class, such erasure of their names from the lists of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred and forfeiture of their Medals shall be effected under the Order of Our Governor-General of India for the time being, to whom their Medals shall be returned. And every person to whom the said Medal is given shall, before receiving the same, enter into an engagement to return the same if his name shall be erased as aforesaid.

Provided that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall at all times have power to restore the Medal of the First Class to any person who may have been deprived of it when circumstances render such restoration just and expedient, and that in like circumstances Our Governor-General of India for the time being shall have power by his Order to restore the Medal of the Second Class to any person who may have been deprived of it.

*Lastly.*—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these regulations or any part thereof by a Notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's* this tenth day of *April*, one thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Our reign.

**SEA FISHERIES.**

*Territorial Waters of Denmark.*

NOTICE is hereby given to British Fishermen that a new Law has come into force in Denmark by which the penalty for illegal trawling in the territorial waters of that country has been increased.

Translation of the Law is appended.

It should be borne in mind that as regards the Danish Coast bordering on the North Sea, south of Hanstholm Lighthouse, Articles II. and III. of the North Sea Fisheries Convention, 1882, to which Denmark is a party, apply.

These Articles are as follows:—

"ART. II. The fishermen of each country shall enjoy the exclusive right of fishery within the distance of three miles from low-water mark along the whole extent of the coasts of their respective countries, as well as of the dependent islands and banks.

"As regards bays, the distance of three miles shall be measured from a straight line drawn across the bay, in the part nearest the entrance, at the first point where the width does not exceed ten miles.

"The present Article shall not in any way prejudice the freedom of navigation and anchorage in territorial waters accorded to fishing boats, provided they conform to the special police regulations enacted by the Powers to whom the shore belongs.

"ART. III. The miles mentioned in the preceding Article are geographical miles, whereof 60 make a degree of latitude."

**LAW concerning an Increase of the Punishment fixed by the Law No. 56 of April 5th, 1888, section 58, as far as Illegal Trawl Fishery is concerned.**

Illegal fishery by means of trawl, in Danish Territorial Waters (see Law No. 56 of April 5th, 1888, section 1, No. 2), is to be punished with fines of from 500 to 4,000 Crowns, payable to the Treasury.

In fixing the punishment regard is to be had to

whether the illegal fishery has been carried out by means of steam, which is to constitute an aggravating circumstance. The illegal fishing instruments, including the hawser which has been used for the illegal fishery, as well as the captured fish on board, are to be forfeited to the Treasury. The vessel may be laid under embargo, in accordance with an eventual decree to that effect, and sold to cover fines and costs.

This Law is to take effect immediately.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 11TH MAY 1900.)

**NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 2).**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

***Movement out of into or within Scheduled District.***

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Scheduled District.

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or along a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

***Movement into part of Scheduled District.***

2.—(1.) An animal may, if accompanied by a Licence under this Article, be moved by the nearest available route from any premises outside the Scheduled District to any premises within that District which are specified in the Licence, provided that the last-mentioned premises are not situated within such part of the Scheduled District as is mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

(2.) A Licence for movement under this Article



may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place to which the animal is to be moved, but only on a Declaration by the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect that such movement is necessary or expedient for grazing purposes, and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.

(4.) No Licence shall be granted for movement from or to premises in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

*Movement within part of Scheduled District of Animals across a highway between different parts of a Farm in the same occupation without Licence.*

3. An animal may be moved by the nearest available route along or across a highway or throughfare in the Scheduled District (except such part thereof as is mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order) from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm being in the same occupation, provided that the animal to be moved is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease or in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, and that the movement of such animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

*Movement within Scheduled District with Licence.*

4.—(1) An animal may, if accompanied by a Licence under this Article, be moved by the nearest available route from any premises in the Scheduled District to any other premises within such District.

(2.) A Licence for movement under this Article may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved, but only on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:

- (i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period; and
- (ii.) that the animal is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
- (iii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.

(4.) No Licence shall be granted for movement from or to premises in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

*Movement of Animals by Railway through Scheduled District.*

5. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal out of or into the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

*Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

6. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any Disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of this Order.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

9.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

10. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:

“Animal” includes cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Revocation of Orders.*

11. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the com-

mencement of this Order revoked : Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

*Commencement.*

12. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred.

*Short Title.*

13. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 2).
