THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Vi-nna, enclosing the following information respecting quarantine, viz.:—

Owing to the presence of cases of the plague at Port Said the importation into, or transit through, Austria-Hungary of the articles hereinafter mentioned, proceeding from Egyptian ports, is prohibited until further notice by virtue of a Minist rial Decree dated the 7th instant.

The prohibited articles comprise the fol-

lowing: -

1. Soiled bedy-linen, old articles of wearing

apparel and used bedding.

Should any of these articles form part of a passenger's luggage or household effects they will be subjected to the special treatment prescribed by the port or frontier sanitary authorities.

2. Rags and tatters, including hydraulic-pressed rags, which may be consigned as articles of com-

merce.

- 3. Old sacks, likewise carpets and embroideries which have already been in use.
- 4. Vegetable matter; further, hides and skins in a raw condition.
- 5. Raw animal products of all kinds, such as bones, claws, hoofs, bladders, and entrails; further, hair and bristles.

6. Human hair.

The transit of the above enumerated articles through Austro-Hungarian territory into a neighbouring country—provided the permission of such country has been previously obtained, and evidence thereof satisfactorily produced—will only be allowed if the articles in question are packed in such a way that manipulation en route is quite impossible.
