REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVÉES TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act 1838," as amended by "The Pluralities Act 1850," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only * * * and for determining if such united benefice shall be in two dioceses to which

"of such dioceses such benefice shall belong, and such Order or Orders shall be registered in the registry or registries of the diocese or respective dioceses to which such united benefice shall be determined to belong, and to which either or any of the united benefices sinecure rectories or vicarages shall have belonged when separate, which Order or Orders the registrar or registrars of such diocese or respective dioceses immediately on the receipt thereof are hereby required to register accordingly; and such Order or Orders shall thenceforth be binding on all parties whatsoever."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned Frederick Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend John James Stewart Lord Bishop of Worcester as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the rectory of Shennington in the county of Oxford and the Right Reverend William Lord Bishop of Oxford as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the rectory of Alkerton in the county of Oxford have represented unto Us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons may with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice and that such united benefice should belong to the said diocese of Oxford under the provisions of 'The Pluralities Act 1838' and the Acts amending the same, We enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to Us that such union might be usefully made and is not of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Victor Albert George Earl of Jersey being the patron or person entitled to present to the said rectories of Shennington and Alkerton consents to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid joint representation of the said Lord Bishops to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to Us the said Archbishop against such Union and no such cause has been shown.

"The joint representation of the said Lord Bishop of Worcester and the said Lord Bishop of Oxford, Our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patrons and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And We do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for determining that such united benefice shall belong to the diocese of Oxford."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to

order as it is hereby ordered that the rectory of Shennington in the county of Oxford and diocese of Worcester and the rectory of Alkerton in the county and diocese of Oxford shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is further pleased to order and determine as it is hereby ordered and determined that the said united benefice shall belong to the diocese of Oxford.

Le Conseil fédéral suisse, en application de l'article 49 de l'ordonnance du 30 décembre 1899, concernant les mesures protectrices à prendre contre le choléra et la peste en ce qui concerne les entreprises de transport et le service des voyageurs, des bagages et des marchandises*);

Sur la proposition de son Département de l'Intérieur.

Arrêt:

ART. 1er. A teneur des rapports parvenus au Conseil fédéral, Port Saïd en Égypte, tous les ports de la Mer-rouge et Sydney en Australie doivent être considérés comme infectés de peste ou suspects.

Sont, en conséquence, applicables à ces circonscriptions les dispositions des articles 37 à 44 de l'ordonnance précitée, mise en vigueur par arrêté du Conseil fédéral du 19 janvier 1900†), articles qui se rapportent à la circulation des marchandises et des bagages. Il y a lieu, en particulier, de soumettre dans chaque cas, à la révision et, au besoin, à la désinfection prescrite à l'article 42, le bagage des voyageurs dès leur arrivée à destination, alors même que le voyage aurait duré

plus de dix jours, ce qui exempte le voyageur de la surveillance médicale.

En outre, les voyageurs qui auront quitté depuis moins de dix jours une circonscription contaminée (par exemple Port Saïd ou un port de la Mer-rouge) seront soumis, au lieu d'arrivée, à la surveillance médicale jusqu'à l'expiration du délai de dix jours (articles 33 à 35 de l'ordonnance).

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a Quarantine Notice issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, viz. :—

Translation of Circular No. 5740 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board to all the Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers, and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

By decree of May 7th, 1900, issued by the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance (B.L.I., No. 81), in conjunction with the Royal Hungarian Government on account of case of plague verified at Port Saïd, the importation and transit of the following goods and articles is prohibited from Egypt, in order to prevent the introduction of plague from Egypt :—

1. Of used body-linen clothes, of old clothing (personal effects), old bed-clothing; when such articles are forwarded as personal baggage or as household effects in consequence of change of residence, they are subject upon passing the frontier to special regulations and treatment by the sanitary police :

2. Of rags and tatters, not excluding rags compressed by hydraulic power, which are packed in bales as articles of commerce ;

3. Of used sackings, carpets, and used embroideries ;

4. Of raw uncalcined hides, of those that are not perfectly dried, or uncalcined, or not prepared with chalk, arsenic or otherwise.

5. Of animal substances raw unprepared as bones, hoofs, bladders, and intestines (fresh not dry), or not salted, horse-hair, and hogs' bristle.

6. Of hair.

Permission will be granted for transit of the goods and articles enumerated, when proof is forthcoming that if such goods have passed through infected territory, they have done so packed in such a manner as has rendered infection impossible.

The present Order comes into force on the day

that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued for information and guidance with the observation that the above-mentioned goods as well as—in general—those that would be considered suspect from a sanitary point of view, which would be introduced into the Austrian Monarchy during the time that the present decree is in force, will be sent to the nearest lazaretto at the expense of the parties, and there they will be subjected by the authorities to destruction, or to disinfection according to the case, without taking into consideration the damage of the goods, and this will be done at the expense of the parties without granting any compensation.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 22ND MAY 1900.)

HERTFORDSHIRE AND BEDFORDSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Animals on a Highway between different parts of a Farm in the same Occupation.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Order described in the Schedule hereto an animal may be moved by the nearest available route along or across a highway or thoroughfare in the District defined by the said Order from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm being in the same occupation, provided that the animal to be moved is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and that the animal is not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, and that the movement of such animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture given under any Order of the Board.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the HERTFORDSHIRE AND BEDFORDSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.
