that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued for information and guidance with the observation that the above-mentioned goods as well as—in general—those that would be considered suspect from a sanitary point of view, which would be introduced into the Austrian Monarchy during the time that the present decree is in force, will be sent to the nearest lazaretto at the expense of the parties, and there they will be subjected by the authorities to destruction, or to disinfection according to the case, without taking into consideration the damage of the goods, and this will be done at the expense of the parties without granting any compensation.
