## CONSTANTINOPLE AND OTHER PLACES IN THE OTTOMAN EMPIRE.

IN pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 22nd day of May, 1900, has been made, on his representation, by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, ordering, directing, and declaring that, on and from the 1st day of June, 1900, the rates of postage payable on outgoing letters from the British Post Offices at Constantinople and other places in the Ottoman Empire shall be those which are prescribed by the said Warrant.

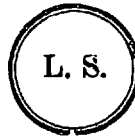

## (SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.*

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board, dated the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the
