WILD BIRD (ENGLAND). The Wild Birds Protection (County of Southampton) Order, 1900. Dated 29th May, 1900.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Southampton, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Southampton) Order,

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880. II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Southampton to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:-
