Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Pour faire suite aux arrêtés du Conseil fédéral concernant les pays et circonscriptions qui doivent être considérés comme contaminés de peste, du 20 Février, du 6 Mars et du 11 Mai 1900;

Sur la proposition de son Département de l'Intérieur, arrête:

ART. 1er. A teneur des rapports officiels parvenus au Conseil fédéral, le port et la ville d'Alexandrie en Egypte doivent être considérés comme infectés de peste.

Sont, en conséquence, applicables aux provenances de cette circonscription les dispositions des articles 33 à 35 (surveillance des voyageurs au lieu d'arrivée) et 37 à 48 (prescriptions concernant les marchandises et les bagages) de l'ordonnance susmentionnée du 30 Décembre 1899, articles déclarés en vigueur par arrêté du Conseil fédéral du 19 Janvier 1900.†

ART. 2. Le présent arrêté entre immédiatement en vigueur.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The holding of markets fairs sales or exhibitions of cattle sheep or swine within the parish of Chilcompton, in the administrative county of

Somerset, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine is held in the parish of Chilcompton in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or fair or sale or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle or of each sheep or pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission

thereto, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or fair or sale or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred.
