PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

ORDER of Secretary of State, No. 3 (e), dated September 23, 1899, adapting General Rules to the Packing for Conveyance of Explosives other than Gunpowder.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).

WHEREAS by Part I (section 33) of the Explosives Act, 1875 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), General Rules are set forth to be observed with respect to the packing of gunpowder for conveyance:

And whereas by Part II (section 39) of the Act, it is declared that, subject to the provisions subsequently in such Part II contained, Part I of the Act relating to gunpowder shall apply to every other description of explosive in like manner as if the provisions of such Part I were re-enacted in such Part II, with the substitution of that description of explosive for gunpowder:

And whereas by Part II (section 40, subsection 3) of the Act, it is provided that a Secretary of State may from time to time alter the General Rules relating to the packing of gunpowder contained in Part I of the Act, for the purpose of adapting the same to the packing of any other explosive:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the power aforesaid, I, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

Part I, Rule 2, of the Order of the Secretary of State, No. 3 aforesaid, relating to the packing of explosives of the 1st Division of the 3rd (Nitro-compound) Class, shall be amended by the addition of the following words at the end of the said rule:—

“Provided that, with the consent of a Government Inspector, there may be substituted for the said inner package such arrangement or contrivance as shall, in the opinion of the said Government Inspector, secure adequate safety.”

SHORE OR BANKS OF THE SEA IN THE VICINITY OF PORTSMOUTH.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

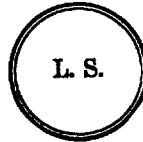
