THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Officers, Non-Commissioned Officer, and Trooper whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for their conspicuous bravery in South Africa, as stated against their names:—

Regiment.	Name.	Acts of Courage for which recommended.
The Gordon Highlanders	Captain Ernest Beckwith Towse	<p>On the 11th December, 1899, at the action of Majesfontein, Captain Towse was brought to notice by his Commanding Officer for his gallantry and devotion in assisting the late Colonel Downman, when mortally wounded, in the retirement, and endeavouring, when close up to the front of the firing line, to carry Colonel Downman on his back; but finding this not possible, Captain Towse supported him till joined by Colour-Sergeant Nelson and Lance-Corporal Hodgson.</p> <p>On the 30th April, 1900, Captain Towse, with twelve men, took up a position on the top of Mount Thaba, far away from support. A force of about 150 Boers attempted to seize the same plateau, neither party appearing to see the other until they were but 100 yards apart. Some of the Boers then got within 40 yards of Captain Towse and his party, and called on him to surrender. He at once caused his men to open fire and remained firing himself until severely wounded (both eyes shattered), succeeding in driving off the Boers. The gallantry of this Officer in vigorously attacking the enemy (for he not only fired, but charged forward) saved the situation, notwithstanding the numerical superiority of the Boers.</p>
The Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment)	Captain Charles FitzClarence	<p>On the 14th October, 1899, Captain FitzClarence went with his squadron of the Protectorate Regiment, consisting of only partially trained men, who had never been in action, to the assistance of an armoured train which had gone out from Mafeking. The enemy were in greatly superior numbers, and the squadron was for a time surrounded, and it looked as if nothing could save them from being shot down. Captain FitzClarence, however, by his personal coolness and courage inspired the greatest confidence in his men, and, by his bold and efficient handling of them, not only succeeded in relieving the armoured train, but inflicted a heavy defeat on the Boers, who lost 50 killed and a large number wounded, his own losses being 2 killed and 15 wounded. The moral effect of this blow had a very important bearing on subsequent encounters with the Boers.</p> <p>On the 27th October, 1899, Captain FitzClarence led his squadron from Mafeking across the open, and made a night attack with the bayonet on one of the enemy's trenches. A hand-to-hand fight took place in the trench, while a heavy fire was concentrated on it from the rear. The enemy was driven out with heavy loss. Captain FitzClarence was the first man into the position and accounted for four of the enemy with his sword. The British lost 6 killed and 9 wounded. Captain FitzClarence was himself slightly wounded. With reference to these two actions, Major-General Baden-Powell states that had this Officer not shown an extraordinary spirit and fearlessness the attacks would have been failures, and we should have suffered heavy loss both in men and prestige. On the 26th December, 1899, during the action at Game Tree, near Mafeking, Captain FitzClarence again distinguished himself by his coolness and courage, and was again wounded (severely through both legs).</p>
10th Hussars	Lieutenant (now Captain) Sir John P. Milbanke, Bart.	<p>On the 5th January, 1900, during a reconnaissance near Colesberg, Sir John Milbanke, when retiring under fire with a small patrol of the 10th Hussars, notwithstanding the fact that he had just been severely wounded in the thigh, rode back to the assistance of one of the men whose pony was exhausted, and who was under fire from some Boers who had dismounted. Sir John Milbanke took the man up on his own horse under a most galling fire and brought him safely back to camp.</p>

Regiment.	Name.	Acts of Courage for which recommended.
Protectorate Regiment	Sergeant H. R. Martineau	On the 26th December, 1899, during the fight at Game Tree, near Mafeking, when the order to retire had been given, Sergeant Martineau stopped and picked up Corporal Le Camp, who had been struck down about 10 yards from the Boer trenches, and half dragged, half carried, him towards a bush about 150 yards from the trenches. In doing this Sergeant Martineau was wounded in the side, but paid no attention to it, and proceeded to staunch and bandage the wounds of his comrade, whom he, afterwards, assisted to retire. The firing while they were retiring was very heavy and Sergeant Martineau was again wounded. When shot the second time he was absolutely exhausted from supporting his comrade, and sank down unable to proceed further. He received three wounds, one of which necessitated the amputation of his arm near the shoulder.
Protectorate Regiment	Trooper H. E. Ramsden	On the 26th December, 1899, during the fight at Game Tree, near Mafeking, after the order to retire was given, Trooper H. E. Ramsden picked up his brother, Trooper A. E. Ramsden, who had been shot through both legs and was lying about 10 yards from the Boer trenches, and carried him about 600 or 800 yards under a heavy fire (putting him down from time to time for a rest) till they met some men who helped to carry him to a place of safety.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, July 4, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 25th June, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, communicating the following summary of the contents of an Order (No. 292) of the Bulgarian Minister of the Interior prescribing the manner in which the medical inspection of travellers arriving from non-infected parts of the Ottoman Empire is to be carried out:—

1. Paragraph 5 of the Order No. 225 of the 28th of April (11th of May) is cancelled.

2. Passengers by the Orient Express from Constantinople will consequently be subjected at Hebitchevo to medical inspection in the same manner as passengers by other trains coming from Turkey, in conformity with paragraph 4 of Order No. 225.

3. The inhabitants of Turkish frontier districts may enter Bulgaria without undergoing a medical inspection.

4. But the frontier-guards will be careful to prevent any other persons from entering the country under cover of the above permission.

5. The Mayors of places in which persons arriving from Turkey take up their residence will keep a watch upon them and inform the medical authority immediately of the appearance of any illness among them.

at Berne, enclosing the following Notice respecting quarantine in Switzerland, viz. :—

Arrêté du Conseil fédéral concernant les pays et circonscriptions qui doivent être considérés comme contaminés de peste (Smyrne en Asie Mineure).

(Du 25 juin 1900.)

Le Conseil fédéral suisse,

En application de l'article 49 de l'ordonnance du 30 décembre 1899*, concernant les mesures protectrices à prendre contre le choléra et la peste en ce qui concerne les entreprises de transport et le service des voyageurs, des bagages et des marchandises ;

Pour faire suite aux arrêtés du Conseil fédéral concernant les pays et circonscriptions qui doivent être considérés comme contaminés de peste, des 20 février, 6 mars, 11 mai et 5 juin 1900 ;

Sur la proposition de son Département de l'Intérieur,

Arrête :

ART. 1er. A teneur des rapports officiels parvenus au Conseil fédéral, le port et la ville de Smyrne, en Asie Mineure, doivent être considérés comme infectés de peste.

Sont, en conséquence, applicables aux provenances de cette circonscription les dispositions des articles 33 à 35 (surveillance des voyageurs au lieu d'arrivée) et 37 à 48 (prescriptions concernant les marchandises et les bagages) de l'ordonnance susmentionnée du 30 décembre 1899, articles déclarés en vigueur par arrêté du Conseil fédéral du 19 janvier 1900.

ART. 2. Le présent arrêté entre immédiatement en vigueur.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, July 4, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Montevideo, reporting that an Ordinance has been issued by the Board of Health reducing the quarantine imposed on arrivals from the port of Buenos Aires from ten days to five.

By a further Ordinance of the Board of Health, Montevideo, dated 2nd June, 1900, the Ordinances imposing quarantine of observation on vessels and passengers coming from the Argentine Republic, are revoked. Disinfection is only to be carried out on vessels which terminate their voyages in ports of the Republic of Uruguay.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular addressed by the Imperial and Royal Marine Authorities in Trieste to the subordinate Port and Health Officers respecting the extension of the prohibition against the importation and transit of certain wares and articles from Egypt to Smyrna, and the Vilayet of Aidin in Asia Minor :—

(Translation.)

CIRCULAR of the Imperial and Royal Maritime Government to all its Officers and functionaries.

By a Decree of the 9th of June, 1900, issued by the Ministries of the Interior, Trade, and Finance, in consequence of the detection of cases of plague at Smyrna, the importation and transit of the goods and objects enumerated in the Ministerial Decree of May 7, 1900, are forbidden from Egypt to Smyrna or to the Vilayet Aidin in Asia Minor, in order to prevent the introduction of contagious disorders.

This Decree comes into force on the day when it reaches the respective customs officials of the Office of Health.

In connection with the Circular of the 9th of May, No. 5740, notice is given for the information of whom it may concern that the packages of goods, suspected of being of that character and introduced into the Austrian monarchy during the duration of this Decree in force, will be forwarded to the nearest lazaret at the expense of the parties concerned and subjected there to the authorities, who will decide whether they must be destroyed, or whether they can be disinfected, taking no account of any depreciation of value which this process may cause, and without being liable to any demand for damages.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 29th June, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, forwarding the following French translation of the Order of the Bulgarian Ministry of the Interior, declaring the whole of European Turkey to be infected with the plague :—

(Traduction.)

Ordonnance No. 305.

Considérant que des informations officielles établissent qu'il a été constaté à Xanthie (Skétéché) vilayet d'Andrinople, un cas suspect de peste, j'ordonne, conformément à la décision prise le 13 courant par le Conseil Médical Supérieur en base du VIème Arrêté du Conseil des Ministres du 6 Mars, 1899, l'application des mesures quarantaines ci-après :—

1. Toute la Turquie d'Europe est déclarée infectée de peste ;

2. Les voyageurs arrivant de Constantinople ne seront admis que par les voies de Varna, Bourgas et Hébibtchévo ; quant à ceux venant de Macédoine, ils ne le seront que via Dévé—Bair et Kotchérinovo ;

3. Les voyageurs doivent observer une quarantaine de onze jours, et leurs effets et bagages doivent subir la désinfection par la vapeur, ainsi que l'eau de "zem-zem" des pèlerins. Les provisions de bouche dont les voyageurs seraient porteurs, doivent être détruits par le feu ;

4. Les lazarets doivent être installés d'après le principe des hopitaux, et il sera fourni à tous ceux qui y seront entrés la nourriture nécessaire, conformément au Règlement en vigueur ;

5. La taxe est de deux (2) francs par jour ;

6. Ceux des sujets bulgares qui seraient pauvres seront admis à titre gratuit. Toutefois, ils doivent, à leur sortie du lazaret, établir leur état d'indigence moyennant des certificats délivrés par leur commune respective. En cas contraire, la taxe sera perçue par voie d'exécution ;

7. A leur sortie du lazaret, les voyageurs seront l'objet d'une observation de cinq (5) jours au lieu

de leur domicile ou de séjour, conformément aux instructions données par la circulaire de la direction sanitaire du 3/16 courant No. 2965 ;

8. Les trains venant de Turquie doivent stopper à Hébibchévo et, après avoir débarqué les voyageurs et leurs bagages, retourner à leur point de départ ;

9. Les voyageurs à leur sortie du lazaret, doivent prendre place dans des trains nets, dans leur voyage pour l'intérieur de la Bulgarie ;

10. Les trains de "l'Orient-Express" sont admis de la même façon que celle exposée au §2 de mon ordre du 11/24 courant No. 292 ;

11. Le médecin qui, au lazaret de Hébibchévo, monte sur le train, doit l'accompagner jusqu'à la frontière de Serbie. Il observe l'état sanitaire des voyageurs et du personnel du train ;

12. Il est rigoureusement défendu aux voyageurs et aux employés de l'Orient-Express de descendre dans les stations, tant que le train parcourt le territoire de la Bulgarie. De même il est défendu à ces voyageurs et à ces employés de se mettre en contact avec qui que ce soit dans les stations de Bulgarie ;

13. Les water-closets des trains de l'Orient-Express doivent être disposés de façon à y retenir les matières fécales et à ne les laisser s'écouler qu'après désinfection.

14. Les effets des employés qui accompagnent les trains et qui resteront en Bulgarie seront désinfectés à Tzaribrod ;

15. Les habitants de la zone frontière qui ont des propriétés sur territoire turc, ne sont admis qu'après visite médicale, ainsi qu'il est dit dans la circulaire de la direction sanitaire du 3/16 courant No. 2965 ;

16. Les maires des communes doivent tenir registre exact des noms des habitants qui viennent en Bulgarie et retournent en Turquie dans le but de cultiver leurs terres ;

17. Les Karakatchans venant de Turquie ne peuvent en aucune façon être admis en Bulgarie ;

18. L'entrée en Bulgarie de toutes espèces de marchandises venant de Turquie d'Europe est absolument défendue ;

19. Messieurs les Préfets et Sous-Préfets sont tenus de mettre à la disposition des médecins de lazarets le nombre de gendarmes dont ceux-ci auraient besoin, et

20. Toutes dispositions qui seraient contraires à celles de mon présent ordre sont abolies.
