PRESENT, The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty. Lord President. Marquess of Londonderry. Lord Chamberlain.

WHEREAS by the eighty-eighth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act 1894" it is enacted as follows :-

"Where, in accordance with 'The Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890' Her Majesty exercises jurisdiction within any port, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council to declare that port a port of registry and by the same or any subsequent Order in Council to declare the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships at that port of registry, and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat."

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means Her Majesty the Queen has jurisdiction in and over Cyprus and within all the ports thereof in accordance with the said Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient to declare the Port of Larnaca in the Island of Cyprus a port of registry and to declare the description of persons who shall be registrars of British ships thereat and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat.

And whereas the provisions of section one of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with.

Now therefore Her Majesty by virtue of the powers vested in Her in this behalf by the hereinbefore recited Acts or some or one of them and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to declare and order as follows :--

#### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Cyprus Maritime Order in Council 1900."

#### Larnaca a Port of Registry.

2. The Port of Larnaca in the Island of Cyprus shall be a port of registry for British ships.

Registrar—Appointment. 3. The Registrar of British ships at the said port shall be such officer in the public service of the Island of Cyprus as the High Commissioner of Cyprus from time to time appoints by writing | previously registered, from the port of Larnaca t)

signed by him and in default of such appointment shall be the Collector of Customs at the said port.

Deputy of Registrar. 4. The High Commissioner of Cyprus may from time to time in case of the absence or intended absence from Larnaca or in case of the illness of the Registrar appoint by writing under his hand a fit person to be the Deputy of the Registrar for the time therein mentioned; but every such appointment shall be revocable at pleasure by the High Commissioner by writing under his hand.

The person so appointed shall during the continuance of his appointment have all the power and authority of the Registrar.

#### Seal of Registrar.

5. The Registrar shall have and use a seal bearing such style and device as the High Commissioner shall from time to time direct.

#### Presumption as to Signature and Seal.

6. Every signature or seal affixed to any instrument purporting to be the signature or seal, as the case may be, of the Registrar, shall for all purposes under this Order without any proof thereof, be presumed to be genuine and shall be taken as genuine until the contrary is proved.

#### Powers of Registrar.

7. The Registrar of Shipping at Larnaca shall have the same powers as any Registrar of shipping appointed under "The Merchant Shipping Act 1894" and for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of the said Act and of this Order the said Registrar shall have the same powers as by the said Act are conferred for the purposes of registration and measurement on any officer of Customs or any officer of the Board of Trade.

#### Powers of High Commissioner respecting Ship registere t at Larnaca.

8. The High Commissioner of Cyprus shall with regard to the performance of any act or thing relating to the registry of a ship registered at Larnaca or of any interest therein be considered as in all respects occupying the place of the Board of Trade and the Commissioners of Customs.

## The High Commissioner of Cyprus may grant Pass to a Ship unregistered to proceet to any port in Her Majesty's Dominions.

9. Where it appears to the High Commissioner of Cyprus that by reason of special circumstances it would be desirable that permission should be granted to any British ship to pass without being any port within Her Majesty's dominions, the High Commissioner may grant a pass accordingly, and such pass shall for the time being and within the limits therein mentioned have the same effect as a certificate of registry.

#### Fees.

10. Fees not exceeding the amounts named in the Schedule to this Order shall be taken in respect of the matters mentioned in the same Schedule.

#### Disposal of Fees.

11. All fees authorized to be taken under this Order shall be applied to general revenue. A. W. FitzRoy.

V HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy ; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninetyseven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fiftyfive; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the tenth day of May in the year one thousand nine hundred in the words and figures following; that is to say :

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and lifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter Humshaugh situate within the limits of the parish of Simonburn in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Simonburn and of the parish of Warden in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Simonburn and of the said parish of Warden should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter Humshaugh situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this representation and caused his episcopal seal to be affixed hereto) with the consent of Your Majesty's Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland as the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Simonburn (in testimony whereof two of the said Commissioners for executing the said office of Lord High Admiral have respectively signed and sealed this representation) and with the consent of the Reverend George Cruddas of Nether Warden Hexham in the said county of Northumberland Clerk in Holy Orders as the patron of the vicarage of the parish of Warden aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Simon-burn and of the said parish of Warden which are described in the Schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Peter Humshaugh situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter Humshaugh.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing

Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter Humshaugh being :---

"1. All that portion of the parish of Simonburn in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle which is comprised within and coextensive with the limits of the township of Haughton of the township of Humshaugh (inclusive of the territory called Black Carts and Ryehill) and also of that portion of the township of Walwick which lies to the north-east of the site of the Roman Wall.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Warden in the said county and diocese which is bounded upon the north-east by the above-described portion of the parish of Simonburn aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-west upon the south-west and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Simonburn from the parish of Warden aforesaid where the middle of the road leading from Simonburn past the house called Sharpley

crosses the site of the said Roman Wall and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the high road leading from Carlisle to Newcastle-upon-Tyne and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of one mile and twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point at or near the houses called or known as Walwick where such high road crosses the site of the said Roman Wall upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Warden from the parish of Simonburn aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle. 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that it would in our opinion be expedient that all [ that part of the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Philip situate at West Bromwich as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip West Bromwich.'

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the new parish of Gomersal and of the new parish of Christ Church Liversedge all in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twentyseventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and published in the London Gazette upon the twelfth day of July following a part of the parish of Birstal in the said county of York and at that time in the diocese of Ripon was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint John situate within the limits of such parish and the same was called 'The Chapelry District of Saint John Cleckheaton.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six and published in the London Gazette on the twentyfourth day of March in the last-mentioned year another part of the said parish of Birstal was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and the same was called 'The District of Gomersal.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of November in the said lastmentioned year and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of the same month the boundaries of the said district of Gomersal were altered so as to dissever a certain portion of such district and to restore such portion to the parish of Birstal aforesaid.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date

thousand eight hundred and forty-seven and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-seventh day of the same month the boundaries of the said chapelry district of Saint John Cleckheaton were altered.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty and published in the London Gazette on the day following another part of the said parish of Birstal was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church situate at Liversedge in the same parish, and the same was called 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church Liversedge.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint John Cleckheaton and the said district chapelry of Christ Church Liversedge have under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become new parishes of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the abovementioned Act of the thirty-second and thirtythird years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas the said district of Gomersal has under the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty also become a new parish.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and published in the London Gazette on the twentieth day of the same month, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton were again altered.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton of the said new parish of Gomersal and of the said new parish of Christ Church Liversedge should be further altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney Bishop of the said diocese of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose (1) that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton of the said new parish of Gomersal and of the said new parish of Christ Church Liversedge shall be altered so that there shall be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and shall be annexed to the said new parish of Gomersal all those portions of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured yellow and that from and after the day of the last-mentioned date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order as aforesaid, the said portions of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton so to be dissevered from such new parish shall be included within and shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Gomersal. (2) And also, that from and after the day of the date last mentioned as aforesaid, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the said new parish of Gomersal shall be further

altered so that there shall be dissevered from the said new parish of Gomersal and shall be annexed to the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton all those portions of the said new parish of Gomersal which are described in the second schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink and that from and after the day of the said last-mentioned date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order as aforesaid the said portions of the new parish of Gomeral aforesaid so to be dissevered from such new parish shall be included within and shall become and be and form part of the soid new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton. (3) And also that from and after the said day of the same last-mentioned date as aforesaid, the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church Liversedge and of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton as aforesaid shall be altered so that there shall be dissevered from the said new parish of Christ Church Liversedge and shall be annexed to the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton aforesaid all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church Liversedge which is described in the third schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green and that from and after the day of the said last-mentioned date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order as aforesaid the said portion of the new parish of Christ Church Liversedge aforesaid, so to be dissevered from such new parish shall be included within and shall become, and be, and form part of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### Scheme or Representation has reference. "THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield and to be annexed to the new parish of Gomersal in the same county and diccese being :---

"I. HIS Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 112 of the 22nd May, 1900, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :-

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage, cases of cholera, yellow fever,

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or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever, or

plague. (b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East. (c.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the C.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal, take in provisions and cargo under quarantine restrictions.

(a.) Vessels arriving from Indian and Arabian ports without a clean bill of health which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health, which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations. (c.) Vessels arriving from Egypt.

3. Quarantine for a period of 12 days.

Passengers arriving from Egypt will be required to undergo a period of 12 days' quarantine.

#### 4. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

#### 5. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from Chinese, Indian, and Arabian ports on board vessels that do not carry a doctor, shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments where they will be subjected to strict medical inspec tion until their clothing and all other articles of personal use, likely to retain infection, shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

(b.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from the above places on board vessels that carry a doctor shall be permitted to land; but no luggage shall be landed before it is disinfected in one of the quarantine establishments.

(c.) Every passenger arriving at Malta from any Mediterranean port eastward of Gibraltar shall, before being allowed to land, declare on oath before an Inspector of Marine Police, or other superior officer, that he has not been in Egypt or Smyrna within 12 days; whenever such person does not make this declaration on oath, he shall undergo a period of quarantine of 12 days.

#### 6. Goods.

The importation of coffee, beans or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health is prohibited.

The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

The importation of rags is prohibited.

The importation is forbidden before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, feathers, bones and jute goods.

The importation from India is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, besides those mentioned in the next preceding subsection : used sacks, as also carpets and embroideries which have been in use, raw skins, fresh skins, and untanned skins; animal débris, such as hoofs, manes, hair; raw silk, wool, and human hair.

The importation of hides from any port subject quarantine or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinfection.

The importation of vines, vine shoots and fruit packed in vine leaves, is prohib ted. The importation of plants, or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate from the

Prescot Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Prescot Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Prescot Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts in the form of the Certificate referred to in the said Orders ;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

ARTICLE I .- The Guardians of the Poor of the Prescot Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II .- Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appoint-ment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.-No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV .- The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.-After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form :---

If he find the stock to be in any respect incor-

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

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.







THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order cease to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred.
