No. 401.—CAPE COLONY—SIMONS BAY.

Rambler Rock—Position and Particulars of:

INFORMATION, dated 2nd June, 1900, has been received from Commander H. E. Purey-Cust, Her Majesty's surveying-ship "Rambler," of the existence of a rocky patch, named Rambler Rock, with a depth of 27 feet over it, situated with Roman Rocks Lighthouse bearing N. 31° W. distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and Noah's Ark S. 77° E.

Approximate position, lat. 34° 11' 0" S., long. 18° 27' 55" E..

No 402.—WEST INDIES—GUADELOUPE.

Pointe-à-Pitre—Alteration in Buoyage.

THE French Government has given notice that the following alteration would be made, on 1st July, 1900, in the buoyage of Pointe-à-Pitre, Guadeloupe:—

a. The light-buoy moored $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables N. 76° W. from Caye d'Argent would be coloured black and exhibit a green fixed light.

b. The light-buoy moored 1 cable S. 43° W. from Caye d'Argent would be coloured red and exhibit a red fixed light.

c. The light-buoy moored three-quarters of a cable westward of Rat Island would be coloured red and exhibit a red fixed light.
