And the creditors contributories and Liquidators of the said Company and all other persons interested were to be at liberty to apply as there might be occasion. And it was ordered that the costs of the petitioner and of the said Company and of the several creditors supporting the said petition be taxed and paid out of the assets of the said Company and that on such taxation one set of costs is to be allowed the said creditors supporting the said petition and that such costs of the petitioner and of the said Company include the costs of and incidental to the Summons dated 8th day of June 1900 heard before the Registrar and the time within which this Order was to be advertised in the "London Gazette" was extended until the 22nd day of July 1900.—Dated the 9th day of July 1900.
