THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Officers whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval for their conspicuous bravery in South Africa, as stated against their names:—

The Gordon High- landers	Captain Matthew Fontaine Maury Meiklejohn	At the Battle of Elandslaagte on the 21st October, 1899, after the main Boer position had been captured, some men of the Gordon Highlanders, when about to assault a kopje in advance, were exposed to a heavy cross-fire and, having lost their leaders, commenced to waver. Seeing this, Captain Meiklejohn rushed to the front and called on the Gordons to follow him. By his conspicuous bravery and fearless example, he rallied the men and led them against the enemy's position, where he fell, desperately wounded in four places.
5th Dragoon Guards	Second Lieutenant John Norwood	On the 30th October, 1899, this Officer went out from Ladysmith in charge of a small patrol of the 5th Dragoon Guards. They came under a heavy fire from the enemy, who were posted on a ridge in great force. The patrol, which had arrived within about 600 yards of the ridge, then retired at full speed. One man dropped, and Second Lieutenant Norwood galloped back about 300 yards through heavy fire, dismounted, and picking up the fallen trooper, carried him out of fire on his back, at the same time leading his horse with one hand. The enemy kept up an incessant fire during the whole time that Second Lieutenant Norwood was carrying the man until he was
The Gordon High- landers	Sergeant - Major (now Quarter- master and Hono- rary Lieutenant) William Robertson	quite out of range. At the Battle of Elandslaagte, on the 21st October, 1899, during the final advance on the enemy's position, this Warrant Officer led each successive rush, exposing himself fearlessly to the enemy's artillery and rifle fire to encourage the men. After the main position had been captured, he led a small party to seize the Boer camp. Though exposed to a deadly cross-fire from the enemy's rifles, he gallantly held on to the position captured, and continued to encourage the men until he was dangerously wounded in two places.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage, except in a compartment thereof specially provided for that purpose.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter into or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor or any officer of the Corporation.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might, for any other reason, be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter into or mount upon or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering into or mounting upon any carriage, and shall not enter into or mount upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. No passenger or other person, not being an engineer, manager, inspector, driver or conductor of the Corporation tramways, shall be permitted to travel on any step or platform of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

13. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter into or mount upon any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to contain, no additional person shall enter into, mount upon, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

15. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the authorized number to enter into, or mount upon, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

16. No person shall enter into, mount upon, or leave, or attempt to enter into, mount upon, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage.

18. No person shall travel in or upon any carriage of the Corporation with loaded firearms.

19. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation.

20. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws to the best of his ability.

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

22. The expression "conductor" shall include

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.
