The West York- shire Regiment	Captain Conwyn Mansel-Jones	On the 27th February, 1900, during the assault on Terrace Hill, north of the Tugela, in Natal, the companies of the West Yorkshire Regiment on the northern slope of the hill met with a severe shell, Vickers-Maxim, and rifle fire, and their advance was for a few moments checked. Captain C. Mansel-Jones, however, by his strong initiative, restored confidence, and, in spite of his falling very seriously wounded, the men took the whole ridge without further check, this Officer's self-sacrificing devotion to duty at a critical moment having averted what might have proved a serious check to the whole assault.

Arrête :

ART. 1er. 1° Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 des arrêtés royaux du 15 Juillet 1895 et 5 Avril 1897 susvisés sont rendues applicables aux provenances du littoral arabique de la mer Rouge au sud de Jambo, contaminés par le choléra et la peste ;

2° Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 5 Avril 1897 susvisés, sont rendues applicables aux provenances des ports de Smyrne et de Rio de Janeiro contaminés par la peste.

ART. 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escut et dans les ports d'Ostende et de Nieuport, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, aux régimes stipulés par le titre VIII de la Convention sanitaire internationale de Dresde et par les chapitres II, III et IV du règlement sanitaire général annexé à la Convention sanitaire internationale de Venise, en date du 19 Mars 1897.

FOR the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical quantity when supplied on the constant potential continuous current system, viz. :—

The meter deposited at the Board of Trade by the Bastian Meter Company, of Bartholomew Works, Lawford-road, Kentish Town, London, N., and sealed by the Board of Trade and known as the Bastian Meter.

The Board of Trade further approve of the following manner of fixing meters of this description, and of connecting them with the service lines :—

The meter is to be fixed by screws to a vertical support.

In connecting the meter with the service lines, one service line is to be cut and the ends bared of insulation, and the conductors are to be tightly clamped in their terminals ; the insulation between the conductor and the case is to be good ; and the ends of the conductors are not to project beyond the terminal blocks.

The electrolyte with which the tube of the meter is to be filled must be a mixture of pure sulphuric acid one part, and water ten parts, the specific gravity of the mixture being 1.38.
