WHEREAS by "The Pharmacy Act, 1868," section two, it is enacted that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain may from time to time, by Resolution, declare that any Article in such Resolution named ought to be deemed a poison within the meaning of that Act; and thereupon the said Society shall submit the same for the approval of the Privy Council, and that, if such approval shall be given, then such Resolution and approval shall be advertised in the London Gazette, and on the expiration of one month from such advertisement the Article named in such Resolution shall be deemed to be a poison within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did on the fourth day of

July, one thousand nine hundred, resolve and declare, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, that liquid preparations of Carbolic Acid and its homologues containing more than three per cent. of those substances, except any preparation prepared for use as sheep-wash or for any other purpose in connection with agriculture or horticulture, and contained in a closed vessel, distinctly labelled with the word "Poisonous," the name and address of the seller and a notice of the agricultural or horticultural purpose for which the preparation has been prepared, ought to be deemed poisons within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, and ought to be deemed poisons in the second part of the Schedule A of the said Pharmacy Act, 1868:

And whereas the said Society have submitted the said Resolution for the approval of the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Privy Council are of opinion that the said Resolution should be approved:

Now, therefore, their Lordships are hereby pleased to signify their approval of the said Resolution.
