The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the Rural Deaneries or some of them which are within the Archdeaconry of Winchester in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas there are at present three Archdeaconries within the said diocese of Winchester, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Winchester, the Archdeaconry of Surrey and the Archdeaconry of the Isle of Wight.

"And whereas the statutory schedule (prepared under the provisions of the hereinbefore lastly-mentioned Act) of the Rural Deaneries within the said three Archdeaconries of Winchester, of Surrey, and of the Isle of Wight respectively is dated the twenty-second day of February in the rear one thousand eight bundred and seventy-five.

"And whereas by Orders of Your Majesty in Council dated respectively the eleventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the eighteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the fourth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and the ninth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two all which said Orders of Your Majesty in Council have been duly published

in the London Gazette certain alterations were effected in the areas and the names of certain Rural Deaneries within the said diocese of Winchester.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the Rural Deaneries or some of them within the said Archdeaconry of Winchester are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve certain alterations of the areas of certain of the Rural Deaneries within the said lastly-named Archdeaconry and the extinction or absorption of the Rural Deanery of Landport and the formation of the Rural Deanery of Havant in place thereof

in the same Archdeaconry.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester (in testimony whereof he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said Archdeaconry of Winchester shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in order under the name of the said Archdeaconry in the Schedule to this scheme annexed and that the name which in the said Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of any specified Rural Deanery in the said Archdeaconry shall belong to and be and form a part of that Archdeaconry and of that Rural Deanery under the respective names of which it may appear as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of the same Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of the same Rural Deanery and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean, the intent of these our recommendations and proposals being that the said Schedule to this scheme annexed shall as to the first column thereof be (in so far as the same
