

the said diocese of Winchester and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The new parish of Saint Augustin Bournemouth comprising:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth the new parish (sometime district) of Saint John Moor-down and the new parish (sometime district) of the Holy Trinity Bournemouth all in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester which taken together are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bournemouth from the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth aforesaid at the junction of Wimborne-road with Bradley-road and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading into Meyrick Park and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as the Central Drive in Meyrick Park and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the London and South Western Railway over the same road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where it is intersected by the boundary of the municipal borough of Bournemouth and extending thence north-eastward along the said borough boundary for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point where it intersects the middle of Wimborne-road aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth from the new parish of Saint John Moor-down aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the last-named road) for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Bournemouth Cemetery and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts till it meets the wall or fence which forms the north-eastern boundary of the said cemetery and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to a point on the south-western side of Idlesleigh-road opposite to the middle of the road which passes along the backs of the houses and premises upon the north-western side of Fortescue-road and which leads past the Refuse Destructor and premises of the Corporation of Bournemouth and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said road leading past the Refuse Destructor aforesaid for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its present north-eastern end and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a further distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the

borough boundary aforesaid and extending thence generally south-eastward along the said borough boundary for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts thereby passing along the backs of the houses and premises situate upon the north-eastern side of King's-road and also passing along the south-western side of the road called Richmond-park and crossing at the Charminster-road the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Moor-down from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Bournemouth aforesaid to the point where the said road called Richmond-park is joined by Saint Leonards-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stewart-road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bournemouth from the new parish of Saint Paul Bournemouth in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence still south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing Lowther-road and Wellington-road and passing along the middle of Beechey-road) to the junction of the last-named road with Lansdowne-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wimborne-road aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bournemouth from the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said last-named road) for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to the point at the junction of such road with Bradley-road as aforesaid where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the three cures out of which it is intended that the district or new parish recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.
