

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

THE Board of Trade have, after modification, confirmed an Order made by the Light Railway Commissioners, and entitled the South Staffordshire Light Railway Order, 1900, authorizing the construction of Light Railways in the boroughs of Wolverhampton and Wednesbury and the Urban Districts of Willenhall, Darlaston, Cosley, and Bilston, in the county of Stafford.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 16TH AUGUST 1900.)

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. Notwithstanding the existence of any foot-paths or right of way across or through any field, shed, or other place in the Infected Area declared by this Order, no person shall enter such field, shed, or other place while any cattle, sheep, or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture.

3. No dog shall be allowed to be at large within the Infected Area declared by this Order.

4.—(1.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If the owner or person in charge of any dog permits such dog to be at large in contravention of this Order, such owner or person shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the parish of Rhuddlan, in the administrative county of Flint, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the junction of the Pendyffryn and Rhuddlan roads, thence in a southerly direction along the Pendyffryn-road to Pont-y-gwytter Corner, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the Parliamentary borough of Rhuddlan to the south-western corner of Rhydorddwy-

wen Covert, thence in a northerly direction to the commencement of the Rhydorddwy-wen-lane and along such lane to the Rhyl and Dyserth-road, thence in a westerly direction along the said road to the Pendyffryn-road, and thence in a southerly direction along the said road to the starting point aforesaid; the said roads and lane not being included in the Area.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 17TH AUGUST 1900.)

EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement out of into or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District).

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into the Scheduled District, or along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement for Slaughter into Kingston-upon-Hull and Beverley.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved by railway into the city of Kingston-upon-Hull or the borough of Beverley from any place outside the Scheduled District, provided that the animal is so moved without being untrucked within the said District; and an animal so moved into the city or borough may be moved from the railway premises by the nearest available route to a slaughter-house within the city or borough, and shall be there detained and be slaughtered within four days from the date of its arrival in the city or borough.

(2.) An animal may be moved by ferry boat across the river Humber into the city of Kingston-upon-Hull from any place outside the Scheduled District; and an animal so moved into the city may be moved from the landing-place by the nearest available route to a slaughter-house within the city, and shall be there detained and be slaughtered within four days from the date of its arrival in the city.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence.

3.—(1.) An animal may, if accompanied by a Licence under this Article, be moved by the nearest available route from any premises in the Scheduled District to any other premises within such District.

(2.) A Licence for movement under this Article may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved, but only on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:

(i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days
