THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Philip Butt, of Dorville-road, in the parish of

Lee, in the county of London, Gentleman, and to Hannah Elizabeth, his wife, second but eldest surviving daughter of James Gow-Stewart (formerly James Gow), late of Fowlers Park, in the parish of Hawkhurst, in the county of Kent, and of Little Colonsay, in the county of Argyll, Gentleman, deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that they may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of the said James Gow-Stewart, take and henceforth use the surname of Gow in addition to and after that of Butt, that he, the said Philip Butt, may bear the arms of Gow quarterly with those of his
