## No. 523.—CHINA, CANTON RIVER-THE BROADWAY.

Moto Island-Shoal Off, Decreased Depth Extending.

THE German Government has given notice, that Captain Lans, His Imperial Majesty's steamship "Iltis," reports that, owing to the decreased depths of water, his vessel, drawing 12 feet, was unable to proceed farther up the river than Moto Island, a depth of 6 feet having been obtained with Moto Fort bearing N. 23° E., distant 7 cables, and south extreme of Moto Island, East.

From this it would appear that the bank between Moto Mun and Moto Island is extending to the southward.
