THE following Despatch has been received by the Secretary of State for the Colonies from Her Majesty's Commissioner and Consul-General, Niger Coast Protectorate:—

Sir R. Moor to Mr. Chamberlain. (No. 234.)

Her Britannic Majesty's Consulate-General, SIR, Old Calabar, December 29, 1899.

REFERRING to your despatch, No. 214, of 16th November, 1899, I have the honour to enclose herewith a copy of a despatch relating to field operations from Brevet Major Carter, Commandant of the Force. The operations in question took place during the current year 1899, and the despatch enclosed gives the recommendations of the Officer Commanding with regard to the recognition of the services of the Officers engaged.

2. Central Division Expedition.—These operations took place in the Kwo Ibibio country in February and March last as reported in my despatch, No. 71, of the 14th May. On this occasion the Force engaged was called upon to destroy 19 towns, the result of which was that 175 towns came in and made their submission, surrendering 1,000 guns, and bringing 9,000 others to be stamped as required by the Arms Ordinance of 1894. During these operations one Officer was invalided owing to sunstroke and subsequently died; three men of the Force were killed

and five wounded. Of the carriers attached to the Force, three were wounded and several missing. The final result of these operations has been that a large tract of country has been brought under direct Government control.

I am of opinion that the services of the Officer Commanding, Brevet Major Carter, are deserving of recognition; for the operations were carried out successfully with very little loss of life, and there can be no doubt that the natives were well armed, and that there was organized opposition to the Government. I would also endorse the recommendation in the enclosed despatch with reference to Captain R. E. P. Gabbett, the Acting Adjutant during the expedition, who for a portion of it was in command of the troops, and conducted the operations to a successful issue.

3. Benin Territories Expedition .- These operations were undertaken in April and May last, and full report was made in my despatch, No. 78, of 27th May. They constitute the final scene of the tragedy which commenced with the massacre of seven European Officers and over 150 carriers, in January, 1897, after which operations were undertaken in February and March, 1897, which resulted in the taking of Benin city itself, and the major portion of the territories of ahout 4,000 square miles. The principal leader of the massacre, Chief Ologbosheri, escaped on this occasion, and, gathering a large number of followers, established a war camp in a portion of the territories in and about Okemue. He was in league with Chiefs Abohun and Oviaware, who also had established war camps, being opposed to European administration. The operations were undertaken to break up the war camps, capture and bring to trial Chief Ologbosheri, and bring the Chiefs Abohun and Oviaware, together with the territories, under the centrol of the Administration. The war camps were utterly destroyed, together with five considerable villages in league with and supplying the rebel chiefs, and the followers of the chiefs were dispersed. Chief Ologbosheri was captured, brought to trial and hanged; Chief Oviaware was killed during the operations; and Chief Abohun was captured and deported from his country for a period of six months, being lately allowed to return; as he is an able and intelligent man, and willing to assist the Administration in the control of the territories.

During the operations one Officer was killed and one Officer slightly wounded; seven men of the force and five carriers were also wounded. Considering the number of the enemy and the preparations made to oppose the Government, the casualty list must be considered as particularly small, which was due to a great extent to the enemy's ammunition being bad and suffering from wet, the weather during the operations having been rainy. The operations were excessively arduous, owing to their being undertaken somewhat late in the year, when the wet season was commencing. The marching was very heavy, the main column accomplishing a distance of 243 miles in a period of three weeks, and the second column 285 miles in three weeks and two days.

I would specially mention the services as particularly deserving of recognition of Brevet Major Carter, the Royal Scots, Officer Commanding the Force, to whose able handling of the troops the success of the operations was mainly due.

I endorse the recommendations of Brevet Mejer Carter with regard to the following Officers:---

fficers: Captain W. C. G. Heneker, Connaught Rangers, whose knowledge of the territories was

invaluable, which, with the energy and zeal he displayed, contributed largely to the success.

ii. Captain R. E. P. Gabbett, Royal Welsh-Fusiliers, who after the bard work of the operations was left in charge at Okemue, and effectu- ? ally drove out the scattered followers of the rebel chiefs, and effected the capture of Chiefs Ologbosheri and Abohun.

I should also wish to specially mention the following Officers of the political and other branches who were attached to the Force for the carrying out of these operations:

Had it not been for the volunteering of these Officers, it would not have been possible to carry out the operations without co-operation or assistance from other Forces, and I should therefore wish to bring forward their names: as having displayed exceptional zeal in the public service in undertaking risks which the positions they held in the public service did not require them to take.

Despatch relating to Field Operations. Head-Quarters, Niger Coast Protectorate Force, Old Calabar, West Africa,

December 18, 1899. I HAVE the honour to bring to your notice specially, the services of the following Officers who were engaged in the Central Division Expedition in February and March, 1899, and also in the Benin Territories Expedition in April and May, 1899.

Central Division Expedition.—Captain R. E. P. Gabbett (Royal Welsh Fusiliers), Niger Coast Protectorate Force, Acting Adjutant to the Expedition, rendered me the most valuable assistance on every occasion, and on my handing over to him the command of the expedition on February 22nd, 1899, he conducted the operations to the close in a thoroughly able and competent manner, displaying great tact and ability.

Benin Territories Expedition,-Captain W. C. G. Heneker (Connaught Rangers), Niger Coast Protectorate Force, who acted as Intelligence and Survey Officer, ably assisted me by his intimate knowledge of the country, and throughout the operations was conspicuous for his dash, energy, and tact.

Captain R. E. P. Gabbett (Royal Welsh Fusiliers), Niger Coast Protectorate Force, was specially selected to be left in command of the flying detachment in the Okemue district, on the conclusion of the Expedition, and at all times showed great zeal and ability, which eventually effected the capture of the rebel Chief Ologbosheri.

Lord Strathcona's Corps	Sergeant Arthur Herbert Lindsey Richardson	On the 5th July, 1900, at Wolve Spruit, about 15 miles north of Standerton, a party of Lord Strathcona's Corps, only 38 in number, came into contact, and was engaged at close quarters, with a force of 80 of the enemy. When the order to retire had been given, Sergeant Richardson rode back under a very heavy cross-fire and picked up a trooper whose horse had been shot and who was wounded in two places and rode with him out of fire. At the time when this act of gallantry was performed, Sergeant Richardson was within 300 yards of the enemy, and was himself riding a wounded horse.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that from the 7th instant, the import and carriage in transit of rags, wearing apparel in use, and unwashed personal linen and bedding from Glasgow is prohibited. This prohibition applies as well to baggage brought by travellers, in so far as their unwashed bed and personal linen is concerned, but that it does not, however, extend to the import and carriage in transit of goods which may have been forwarded from Glasgow, but of which there is sufficient proof that they have some other place of origin, and that they are transported or packed in such a manner that they cannot possibly come in contact with any objects of contamination. Moreover, the prohibition as regards carriage in transit is not to extend to goods packed in such manner as they can neither be handled nor touched en route.

A Royal Proclamation has this day been issued

as follows :-

"Notice is hereby given by virtue of section 2 of the Quarantine Act of the 12th July, 1848, that the town of Glasgow and the ports of Paraguny shall be regarded as infected with Oriental Pest until further notice, and that the Quarantine Regulations relating to Pest, as set forth in the Act above referred to and in the No ice of the 12th September, 1899, are to come into force immediately.

"Whereunto all those whom it may concern

have humbly to submit themselves.'

In bringing this Proclamation to your notice, I would remind you that by former Notices of the 1st February, 1897, 27th June and 22nd August, 1899, and the 10th March, 18th April, 23rd May, and 17th June, 1900, the following shall until further notice be regarded as pest-smitten:

Town of Smyrna in Asia Minor, Arabia, Persia, India, China, Manila, Formosa, the town of Osaka in Japan, ports in Egypt, Mauritius, the town of Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, Sandwich Islands and New Caledonia, and the towns of Sydney and Melbourne in Australia.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Notice respecting the plague at Glasgow, which has been received from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, viz. :-Notice regarding Savitary Regulations concerning the Plague Infection at Glasgow.

According to information received, Glasgow must be considered to be infected with the plague. Consequently the regulations in sections 26-35 concerning plague in the Notice from the Ministry of Justice, No. 104, of the 14th May last, come into force with regard to the same place.

The further import from Glasgow of the articles mentioned in the aforesaid Notice is prohibited (subject to the exceptions therein mentioned), and, in accordance with section 39 of the said Notice, disinfection of used clothing and bedding arriving from Glasgow, the import of which is not forbidden by the said section 38, is obligatory.

a. The Regulations in sections 13-21 and 24 concerning Asiatic cholera in above-mentioned Notice of May 14 last apply to the following

places:

1. Red Sea ports.

2. Egyptian ports. 3. Ports in Tonquin and Cochin China, as well as East India, including the Dutch East Indian Colonies.

b. The Regulations in sections 26-35 and 38 concerning the plague in the above-mentioned Notice of the 14th of May last apply to Port

Said, Smyrna, and Glasgow.

Used clothing and bedding, of which the import, in conformity with the above-mentioned Regulations in sections 24 and 38 of the Circular of May 14th last, is not forbidden, may, however, only be imported from the above-mentioned places after being properly disinfected under proper public control.

This Notice becomes operative forthwith. Whereof public notice is hereby given. The Ministry of Justice, September 1, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Alexandria, containing the following information as to the steps to be taken in cases of ships arriving from Glasgow, viz.:—The Plague Regulations drawn up by the Quarantine Board last year for ships arriving from the Mediterranean, coming from plague-infected ports, will be applied to arrivals from Glasgow. The application of the regulations will involve very little delay to vessels arriving in Egypt from Glasgow, for all such vessels will have taken more than ten days on the passage, and with a ten days' voyage there is no detention in Egypt unless the ship is infected.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Hamburg, enclosing the following Regulations respecting inspection by Sanitary Police of ships lying in Kiel Harbour, viz.:—

Police Regulation respecting inspection by the Sanitary Police of Ships lying in Kiel Harbour.

(Translation.)

By virtue of sections 138 and 139 of the General Administration Law of 30th July, 1883, I hereby decree, conditionally upon the consent of the District Committee, as follows:—

1. All ships entering or lying in Kiel Harbour to the south of the Line Bellevue Mönkeberg are

subject to inspection by the port doctor.

2. Immediate notice is to be given to the office of the Harbour Police by the ship's master or his representative of all internal illnesses existing among the passengers or crew of the ship at the time of her arrival in the harbour, or occurring during her stay there.

3. The ship's captain, or his representative, shall give all information in his power to the port doctor in reply to his official questions on visiting the ship. Especially all cases of death and illness which have occurred during the voyage are to be notified to the port doctor, and also all internal complaints existing at the time of the ship's arrival in the harbour, or occurring during her stay there.

.4. The Harbour Police Authorities are authorized to order, and to cause to be carried out, any isolation, disembarkation, inoculation, or other measure which they may consider necessary in the

interests of the public health.

5. All ships coming from foreign ports will be inspected with regard to the state of health of the crew and passengers. Before release of the ship, the same may not be quitted by the crew or passengers; nor is access to the ship, before her release; granted to any private person. These two clauses do not apply to passenger steamers on regular voyages, nor to pleasure steamers.

6. These regulations do not apply to ships of His Imperial Majesty's Navy.

7. Violations of these Police Regulations, and resistance to the orders of the authorities competent to carry them out, are punishable by a fine not exceeding 60 marks, or a corresponding term of imprisonment in eases of inability to discharge the fine.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 13TH SEPTEMBER 1900.)

WILTSHIRE AND SOMERSETSHIRE (FOOT-AND MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animal Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sleep, goats, or swine, shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.
2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE AND SOMERSETSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.
