HEREAS by "The Dockyard Ports Regulation Act 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentione; and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary with a view to the proper protection of Her Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of Her Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain regulations and rules were made by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of February one thousand eight I undred and ninety-seven, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth:

And whereas it appears expedient that such

regulations should be amended:

And whereas the provisions of section one of "The Rules Publication Act 1893," have been complied with:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Her vested, is pleased by and with the advice

of Her Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordere I as follows:-

1. This Order shall take effect from the date hereof.

2. On this Order taking effect the following clause shall be inserted in the First Schedule of the Order in Council of the twenty-sixth February one thousand eight bundred and ninety-seven, after clause 15 and shall be numbered 15a:—

No merchant or other private vessel laden wholly or in part with petroleum shall pass within the limits of the harbour until cer ificates to the effect hereinafter mentioned have been lodged with the Queen's Harbour Master, and his permission has been obtained.

First. A test certificate from the port of shipment signed by a person skilled in the testing of petroleum and countersigned if the port of shipment be a foreign port by the British Consul and if the port of shipment be a British p rt by the Collector or other proper Officer of Castoms to the effect that the oil does not give off inflammable vapour below the temperature of seventy-three degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer.

Second. A certificate from the importers or brokers of the petroleum to the same effect.

Any ship laden as above shall anchor near the edge of the Spit Sand with the Spit Fort bearing north-east by east, until permission to pass within the limits of the Harbour is obtained.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and expressed to be made in pursuance of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and of "The Mersey Channels Act, 1897," Her Majesty, on the application of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, being the Harbour Trust or Body Corporate owning or exercising jurisdiction upon the waters of the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches thereto, was pleased to make cert in rules, set for h in the Schedule to such Order, concerning the lights or signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches to the River Mersey between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest

point seawards to which such channels or approaches respectively, are, for the time being,

buoyed on both sides.

And whereas the said Mersey Docks and Harbour Board bave applied to Her Majesty in Council to make, and have submitted for approval, certain new rules concerning lights and signals to be carried, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches thereto within certain specified limits, to be substituted for and in lieu of the rules set forth in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in such new rules there are embodied, subject to certain exceptions and additions therein mentioned, the " Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and which may from time to time be in force.

And whereas the provisions of section one of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been

complied with.

And whereas the new rules so submitted as aforesaid appear to be reasonable and proper.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in Her vested by the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897," and of any other powers Her thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to declare that the said Order in Council of the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, shall, as from the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred, be revoked, and Her Majesty is further pleased to make the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to direct that the same shall continue in operation as from the said seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred.

SCHEDULE.

Rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the Sea Channels or approaches thereto, between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such Sea Channels or approaches respectively are for the time being buoyed on both sides.

1. Every vessel, of whatever description, used in navigation, when in any part of the River Mersey, or in the Sea Channels or approaches thereto as above defined shall, on and after the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred, observe and obey the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," hereinafter called "the General Regulations," which may from time to time be in force, with the exceptions and additions mentioned in the following Rules.

2. A vessel when lying at any stage shall carry the lights prescribed by Articles 2 and 5 of the General Regulations and Rule 5 hereof.

3. A vessel being towed shall, in addition to the lights prescribed by Article 5 of the General Regulations, carry the white light at her stern prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, and if such vessel is a steam vestel with steam up she shall, although being towed, also carry the masthead light prescribed by Article 2 (a), and may carry the

additional light allowed by Article 2 (e) of the General Regulations.

4. (a) A steam vessel when towing another vessel or vessels or when attached for the purpose of towing or manœuvring such vessel or vessels, shall carry the compulsory lights prescribed by Article 3 of the General Regulations, and such steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid to a vessel of four hundred and fifty feet or upwards in length shall carry the additional bright white light prescribed by the said Article 3.

(b) Further, a steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid shall carry abaft the funnel or after-mast a small white light fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twelve points of the compass, viz., for six points from right aft on each side of the vessel, and such steam vessel if less than one hundred and sixty feet in length shall not carry the stern light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, but if she is one hundred and sixty feet or upwards in length she may carry such stern light.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her certificate of registry.

5. In lieu of Article 10 of the General Regulations, a vessel under way shall carry at her stern a white light. The light shall be fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twelve points of the compass, viz., for six points from right aft on each side of the vessel, so as to be visible at a distance of at least a mile. Such light shall be carried as nearly as practicable on the same level as the side lights.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz., steam vessels of less than forty, and vessels under oars or sails of less than twenty, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats), shall not be obliged to carry the light prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry such light they shall, when being overtaken by another vessel, show from the stern a white light or a flare up light as required by Article 10 of the General Regulations.

6. In lieu of Article 11 of the General Regulations, a vessel when at anchor, except when lying at any stage, shall carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height of not less than twenty, and not exceeding forty, feet above the hull, a white light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile, and at or near the stern of the vessel and at such a height that it shall not be less than fifteen feet lower than the forward light, another such light.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz., steam vessels of less than forty, and vessels under oars or sails of less than twenty, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats) when at anchor shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry them each of such vessels shall carry in a place where it can best be seen, and at a height above the gunwale of not less than nine feet, a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.

7. A steam vessel when at anchor, except when lying at any stage, shall, between sunrise and sunset, carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height of not less than twenty, and not exceeding forty, feet above the hull, a black ball not less than two feet in diameter. Provided that in the case of a steam vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations, such black ball may be

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carried at a height above the gunwale of not less than nine feet.

8. A vessel, having on board any explosive, except ships' ammunition, shall, when at anchor, carry a red light, in a globular lantern not less than ten inches in diameter, six feet above the forward white light prescribed by Rule 6 hereof.

Provided that a vessel entitled to carry and carrying the white light prescribed by the proviso to Rule 6, shall carry the red light above described, not less than three feet above such white

9. A vessel anchored to mark the position of a wreck or other obstruction, shall carry, in all weathers from sunset to sunrise, two bright white lights, in lanterns so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile, which lights shall be placed horizontally on a cross yard on the foremast, at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull and not exceeding twenty feet apart, and the said vessel shall carry, in all weathers between suprise and sunset, two black balls placed as hereinbefore ordered with regard to the lights aforementioned.

: 10. A vessel of three hundred and fifty feet or upwards in length when at anchor shall, during fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms,

whether by day or night,

(1) ring in the forward part of the vessel the beli prescribed by Article 15 (D) of the

General Regulations.

(2) sound at or near the stern of such vessel a loud-toned gong or a loud-toned triangle or other loud-toned article that cannot be mistaken for a bell, whistle, siren, or fog-

The bell shall be rung, and the gong, triangle, or other article sounded, respectively, for a period of about five seconds at intervals of not more than one minute.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her certificate of registry.

11. Every steam vessel under way shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such vessel.

Dredgers.

12. The word "Dredger" shall mean any vessel fitted with plant or apparatus for dredging or excavating or fitted with plant or apparatus for eroding or dispersing sand and other material.

13. A dredger, when at work or in position for working, shall carry the following Lights and

Signals, viz.:-

Lights between Sunset and Sunrise.

(1) (a) FORWARD. In the forward part of the dredger, at a height of not less than twenty, and not exceeding forty, feet above the hull, a white light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, unifo m and unbroken light, visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.

Three such white lights (b.) AMIDSHIPS. placed in triangular form not less than eight feet apart, the base of the triangle to be at least ten feet higher than the forward light, and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the credger.

(c.) Arr. One such white light, at or near the stern of the dredger, and at such a height that it shall be not less than fifteen feet lower than the

forward light.

red and green side lights and the stern light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof.

Signals between Sunrise and Sunset.

AMIDSHIPS. Three red balls of not less than two feet in diameter placed in triangular form not less than eight feet apart, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the dredger.

14. The Lights and Signals required to be carried by Rule 13 are to be taken by other vessels as signals that the vessel showing them is not under command, and cannot therefore get out

of the way.

15. A dredger, when not at work nor in position for working, shall carry the ordinary Lights and Signals required to be carried by vessels for avoiding collisions, as provided by these Rules and by the Rules and Regulations now and from time to time in force under the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897."

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fiftyfive; duly prepared and laid before Her Majestv in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of April in the year one thousand nine hundred in the words and figures following;

that is to say :-

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Martin, Gouray, situate within the parish of Saint Martin in the Island of Jersey and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Martin and of the parish of Grouville, in the said Island and in the diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Saint Martin and of the said parish of Grouville should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of . Saint Martin Gouray situate as afore-aid.

"And whereas the arrangements hereinbefore referred to were purported to be effected by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and (2) A dredger when not making any way published in the London Gazette on the twenty-through the water shall not carry side or stern ninth day of the same month, but the validity of lights, but when making way shall carry the usual the said Order in Council has been questioned by reason of the fact that the Acts therein recited or some or one of them were not at that date (as they now are) applicable to the said Island of Jersey.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet one of Your Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the patron in right of the Crown of the rectory of the said parish of Saint Martin and also of the rectory of the said parish of Grouville (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Martin and of the said parish of Grouville which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Martin Gouray situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Gouray.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in

Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Gouray,

"All those two contiguous portions of the parish of Saint Martin and of the parish of Grouville both in the Island of Jersey and in the diocese of Winchester which said portions are together bounded on the east by the sea and upon all other sides that is to say on the south, on the west, and on the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the eastern boundary of the said parish of Grouville at a point upon the shore of Grouville Bay due east of the south-eastern angle of the Redoubt called or known as Fort William and extending thence westward and in a direct line for a distance of two hundred and ninety-five yards or thereabouts (thereby passing to the south of the said Redoubt and crossing Gouray Common and the line of the Jersey Eastern Railway) to the point at La Planque where the Grouville main road is joined by the lane leading to the house called or known as La Vallette and extending thence south-westward for a distance of fifty yards along the middle of the first-mentioned road to a point opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'G.C.C., 1875, No. 1' and placed on the north-western side of the same road and extending thence northwestward to such boundary stone and continuing thence still north-westward and in a straight line for a distance of two hundred and twenty-five yards or thereabouts in a direction parallel to and distant fifty yards to the south-west of the middle of the said lane to a boundary stone inscribed G.C.C., 1875, No. 2' and placed on the southeastern side of the road or lane which leads from the house called or known as Oaklands to the house called or known as La Vallette as aforesaid at a di-tance of fifty-six yards measured along the same road or lane to the south-west of its junction with the lane leading from the last-mentioned house to the Grouville main road at La Planque as aforesaid and continuing thence, that is from the said last-described boundary stone in the

same direction, and in a straight line for a distance of two hundred and forty yards or thereabouts to a boundary stone inscribed 'G.C.C., 1875 No. 3' and placed on the southern side of . the lane leading from the Water Mill in the Queen's Farm Valley towards the village of Gouray and extending thence that is from the lastdescribed boundary stone first northward to the middle of the last-described lane and then northeastward for a distance of two hundred and forty yards or thereabouts along the middle of the same lane to its junction with the lane leading from the said village of Gouray past the house called or known as Daisy Hill to Mallet's Farm and extending thence that is from the said point of junction for a distance of three hundred and eighty yards or thereabouts first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the last-described lane to the point where it joins the main road at Mallet's Farm aforesaid such point being upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Grouville from the parish of Saint Martin aforesaid and extending thence north-westward and in a direct line diagonally across the said main road to a boundary stone inscribed 'G.C.C., 1875 No. 4' and placed on the northern side of the same road at or near to the south-western angle of the house called or known as Mallet's Farm as aforesaid and extending thence northward and in a direct line for a distance of ninety-three yards (thereby passing along the western side of the said house) to a point distant one hundred yards (measured in a direct line) from the nearest point in the middle of the same main road and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of three hundred and twenty-five yards or thereabouts in a curvilineal direction parallel to and distant one hundred yards to the north-west of the middle of the same main road to a boundary stone inscribed 'G.C.C. 1875 No. 5' and placed upon the north-eastern side of the lane leading from the said main road and passing between the farms called or known respectively as La Tourelle and Grasford at a point distant one hundred yards (measured along the last-described lane) to the north-west of the middle of the same main road and extending thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary stone for a distance of two hundred and ten yards or thereabouts northward still in a curvilineal direction parallel to and distant one hundred yards to the west of the said main road to a point to the west of the middle of the western end of the lane leading from the same main road past the house called or known as Temple View to the Bay of Anne Port and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned point eastward and in a direct line for a distance of ninety-three yards to the western side of the said main road at a point opposite to the middle of the western end of the last-described lane and continuing thence for a distance of six hundred yards or thereabouts first in the same direction then south eastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the same lane to its junction with the lane which leads to Anneville and extending thence for a distance of four hundred yards or thereabouts first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the lastdescribed lane to its junction at Anneville aforesaid with the lane leading to the headland called or known as La Crete and extending thence for a distance of four hundred yards or thereabouts first north-eastward and then south-eastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the lastdescribed lane to its junction on the southern side of the headland called or known as La Crete as. aforesaid with the Coast-road and extending.

thence that is from the said point of junction south-eastward and in a direct line to the eastern boundary of the parish of Saint Martin aforesaid upon the shore of the Bay of Anne Port aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, enclosing the following translation of a communication received by him regarding the sanitary restrictions adopted in Spanish ports against healthy vessels from Glasgow, viz.:—

(Translation.)

The port of Glasgow (Scotland) was declared foul in the Gazette of August 21, and it was ordered that ships proceeding from that port should, from August 24, be subject to the rules which govern such cases in the "Regulations for Exterior Sanitation" (Reglamento de Sanidad exterior). But in certain ports where there are no sanitary stations, the works for the establishment of a disinfecting apparatus not yet having been completed, steamers arriving in a good state of health, but subject to disinfection, will proceed to the nearest lazaretto, not to undergo quarantine, but to be disinfected.

They will then be immediately granted free

The following ports possess disinfecting apparatus: Valencia, Las Palmas, Teneriffe.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Montevideo, intimating that in consequence of the disappearance of plague in Paraguay the quarantine measures hitherto in force have been cancelled, and vessels will be admitted to free pratique if disinfected before their departure, otherwise they will be disinfected at Montevideo. Vessels leaving Paraguay before the promulgation of this Decree will have to undergo the sanitary observation as previously ordered.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Montevideo, intimating that four or five days' quarantine are imposed on arrivals from suspended and infected ports respectively, ten days' if cases on board. Vessels carrying Sanitary Inspector are allowed to count days of departure, but disinfection in any case of cargo.

To all Sonitary Authorities in England and Wales as herein defined:—

To all M. dical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS England and Wales appear to be threatened with Plague and it is desirable that Regulations should be made as hereinafter contained:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in the exercise of the powers given to Us by the Public Health Acts, and any other Acts enabling Us in this behalf, do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations, and declare the same to be in force in the District of every Sanitary Authority in England and Wales, and to apply to all vessess within the jurisdiction of a Port Sanitary Authority or a Riparian Authority:

I.—In this Order -

The expression "Sanitary Authority" me ns every Port Sanitary Authority and every Council of a County Borough and every Urban or Rural District Council, and in the Administrative County of London every Sanitary Authority for the execution of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891.

The expression "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed or employed by a Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of any Regulations made by Us in pursuance of any of the enactments referred to in this Order.

II.—In the District of every Sanitary Auth rity which is situate without the Administrative County

of London the persons mentioned in Section 3 of the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, and the Sanitary Authority shall, under this Order, have the same powers and duties in relation to the notification of cases of Plague as they would have under that Act if Plague were an infectious disease to which that Act applied.

In the District of every Sanitary Authority in the Administrative County of London, and in the District of the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London, the persons mentioned in Section 55 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891 (including the Managers of the Metropolitan Asylum District), and the Sanitary Authority shall, under this Order, have the same powers and duties in relation to the notification of cases of Plague as they would have under that section if Plague were an infectious disease to which that Section applied.

The Sanitary Authority shall forthwith cause Circular Letters to be sent to all legally qualified Medical Practitioners in the District informing them of their duties under this Regulation.

III.—It shall be the duty of every Medical Officer of Health to report forthwith to us any case of Plague which may be notified to him, or which may otherwise come or be brought to his knowledge and which may occur in the District or area assigned to his charge.
