

of Cornwall; and also in the old part of the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In reserved grave spaces on the north side of the church burials may be allowed, at their decease, of the widows and widowers of persons already interred in the old part of the churchyard, and also of other parishioners who had attained the age of sixty years on the twenty-second of June last provided that no grave less than five feet in depth is made.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of the "Exeter Corporation Act 1900" the boundary of the existing City is extended in the manner therein specified and by the 29th Section of the same Act it is enacted that the City shall be divided into fourteen Wards (that is to say, the existing City into eleven Wards and the added area into three Wards) with such Boundaries and Names as shall be determined by a Scheme to be prepared by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by a Secretary of State upon the application of the Corporation such appointment to be made within three weeks after the date of such application.

And whereas application for the appointment of the Commissioner aforesaid was duly made by the Corporation on the seventh day of August 1900.

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department did on the fourteenth day of August, 1900 duly appoint Chester Jones Esquire, Barrister at Law, to be such Commissioner for the purposes of the said Act.

Now I the said Chester Jones do hereby in pursuance of the said appointment make the following Scheme for determining the Boundaries and Names of the said several Wards and I determine that the Boundaries and names of the said several Wards shall be as follows:—

"Number 1 or Rougemont Ward.

"I determine that No. 1 or Rougemont Ward shall consist of so much of the parish of Exeter (the expression Parish of Exeter whensoever used in these presents shall mean the Parish of Exeter as constituted by the said Act) as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of High-street where a line drawn along the centre of Queen-street cuts High-street thence proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Queen-street to a point where a line along the centre of New North-road cuts Queen-street, thence continuing in a north-westerly direction along the centre of New North-road to a point in the centre of Howell-road thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Howell-road crossing Saint David's-hill to the centre of the footpath leading to Saint David's Railway Station thence along the centre of the said footpath to the centre of Bonhay-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bonhay-road to a point where a line drawn along the centre of Bonhay-road cuts a line drawn along the centre of the road the property of the Great Western Railway Company leading to Saint David's Station

aforesaid thence in a westerly direction and crossing the railway line and in a line parallel to the south wall of the said station to the boundary line between the parish of Exeter and the parish of Saint Thomas (the expression Parish of Saint Thomas whensoever used in these presents shall mean the 'added area' added by the said Act to the existing City) thence in a northerly direction following the said boundary to its termination and thence continuing in a northerly, easterly, southerly, easterly and southerly direction following the boundary of the parish of Exeter to a point in the centre of the Pennsylvania-road at Mary Pole Head thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Pennsylvania-road and Longbrook-street crossing London Inn-square to a point in the middle of the road at East-gate thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of East-gate and High-street to the point of commencement, and I determine that the name of this Ward is Rougemont Ward.

"Number 2 or Saint David's Ward.

"I determine that Number 2 or Saint David's Ward shall consist of so much of the parish of Exeter as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of Queen-street where a line drawn along the centre of Paul-street cuts Queen-street thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Paul-street Bartholomew-street East to the centre of the pathway on the top of the city wall dividing the old city burial ground from the lower cemetery thence along the centre of the said pathway to a point opposite the centre of Barbican-steps, thence in a north-westerly direction down the said steps to a point in the centre of Exe-street opposite the said steps, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Exe-street to a point in the centre of Bonhay-road opposite Exe-street thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bonhay-road to a point in the centre of the said road opposite the overflow leat on the north side of the Bonhay Pleasure Ground, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said leat to the boundary line between the parishes of Exeter and Saint Thomas in the River Exe thence in a north-westerly direction following the said boundary until it cuts the southern boundary of Rougemont Ward thence in an easterly, northerly, easterly and southerly direction following the boundary of Rougemont Ward to the point of commencement of this Ward, and I determine that the name of this Ward is Saint David's Ward.

"Number 3 or Saint Paul's Ward.

"I determine that Number 3 or Saint Paul's Ward shall consist of so much of the Parish of Exeter as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of High-street where a line drawn along the centre of Queen-street cuts High-street thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the centre of High-street, Fore-street, New Bridge-street and Exe Bridge to the boundary between the Parishes of Exeter and Saint Thomas thence in a north-westerly and a northerly direction along the said boundary to the point where the said boundary is cut by the southern boundary of Saint David's Ward, thence in a south-easterly northerly south-easterly and easterly direction following the boundary of Saint David's Ward to its point of commencement in Queen-street thence along the centre of Queen-street in a southerly direction to the point of commencement of this Ward and I determine that the name of this Ward is Saint Paul's Ward.

"Number 4 or Saint John's Ward.

"I determine that Number 4 or St. John's
