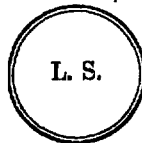
PERTSHIRE AND CLACKMANNANSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the PERTSHIRE AND CLACKMANNANSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1900.
