ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACTS, 1870, 1873, THE SCHOOL BOARDS ACT, 1885, AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION ACT, 1899.

MINUTE BY THE BOARD OF
EDUCATION.

THE Board of Education read, and approved,

The Board of Education, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Elementary Education Acts, 1870, 1873, and the

Board of Education Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

1. The Returning Officer for the election of the School Board for London shall be Sir John Braddick Monckton, Town Clerk of the City of London, or his Deputy.

2. The School Board for London shall consist of fifty-five members, and the number of such members to be elected and the Deputy Returning Officer in each Division shall be the numbers and the persons respectively mentioned in the second and third columns of the Schedule annexed.

PART II.

Time of Election.

1. An election of Members of the School Board for London shall be held on Thursday, the 29th of November, 1900.

Notice of Election.

2. On or before Saturday, the 3rd day of November, the Deputy Returning Officer of each Division shall, in each Parish, or if the Parish be divided into Wards, in each Parish-Ward, or in the case of the City Division, in each City-Ward of the Division, publish such notice of election as is hereinafter prescribed.

3. The notice shall specify the number of Members to be elected for the Division with the

day appointed for the election, viz.: Thursday, the 29th day of November, and shall also specify a place for the reception of the nomination papers hereinafter mentioned, and of such other notices or papers as the Deputy Returning Officer may specify.

The notice may be in the form annexed to this Order.

Nomination and Withdrawal of Candidates.
4. After publication of the said notice of election, but not later than Wednesday, the 7th day of November, any person may be nominated as a candidate for any Division by a nomination paper stating the Division for which the candidate is nominated, and his Christian name, surname

place of abode, and description. Such nomination paper shall be subscribed (in the case of the City Division) by two persons entitled to vote for Common Councilmen, and (in the case of any other Division) by two ratepayers of such Division, and shall be sent to or delivered at the place appointed as aforesaid. In either case the subscribers shall add their places of abode and descriptions, and the premises in the Division for which they are respectively rated. Provided however that ratepayers in respect of property in areas which under the London (South Hornsey) Order in Council, 1900, and the London (Mitcham detached) Order in Council, 1900, will be added to the Finsbury and West Lambeth Divisions respec--tively-will, and ratepayers in respect of property. in areas which under the London (Clerkenwell detached) Order in Council, 1900, the London (Penge) Order in Council, 1900, and the London (Putney detached) Order in Council, 1900, will be taken out of the Finsbury, Greenwich, and West Lambeth Divisions respectively will not be qualified nominators.

The Deputy Returning Officer shall forthwith send notice of such nomination to each candidate.

5. No nomination paper shall be received after 4 o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, the 7th day of November, and no person shall be a candidate unless he has been nominated within the time and in the manner aforesaid.

6. On or before Friday, the 9th day of November, the names, places of abode, and descriptions of the several candidates nominated for each Division as aforesaid, shall be published by the several Deputy Returning Officers in their respective Divisions.

7. On or before Tuesday, the 13th day of November, any candidate for a Division may be withdrawn by delivering to the Deputy Returning Officer of such Division, or at such place as he may appoint, a notice of such withdrawal signed by the candidate.

Such notice shall not be delivered or received later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

Election.

8. If, after 4 o'clock of Tuesday, the 13th day of November, no more persons remain as candidates for a Division than there are members to be elected for such Division, the Deputy Returning Officer for the Division shall certify the same to the Returning Officer, and such persons shall be deemed to be elected on the day fixed for the election.

9. If, after 4 o'clock of Tuesday, the 13th day of November, more persons remain as candidates for a Division than there are members to be elected, the Deputy Returning Officer for such Division shall forthwith cause to be published in each Parish, Parish-Ward, or City-Ward of the Division, the names of such candidates, and give notice that a poll will take place on Thursday, the 29th day of November, between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 9 o'clock in the afternoon.

Polling Places.

10. The Deputy Returning Officer for each Division shall determine the number and situation of the polling-places for his Division, and shall publish the same in each Parish, Parish-Ward, or City-Ward of such Division, not later than Saturday, the 24th day of November.

The Deputy Returning Officer shall appoint one polling-place at least for each Ward, unless, in his opinion, it be clearly unnecessary to do so.

The Deputy Returning Officer of the Division

to "The Metropolis Management Act, 1855," is situate, shall appoint a convenient polling-place for every such place, unless, in his opinion, it be clearly unnecessary to do so.

No public-house shall be used as a polling-

place or for the purpose of an election.

11. The Deputy Returning Officer of each Division, or some person or persons appointed by him, in writing for the purpose, shall preside at each polling-place within his Division, provided that only one person shall preside at the same time.

Persons Entitled to Vote.

12. The persons entitled to vote for the members of the School Board to be elected for the City Division shall be the same persons as would be entitled to vote in case of an election of Common Councilmen for the City.

13. The persons entitled to vote for the members of the School Board to be elected for the Divisions other than the City shall be the ratepayers, as defined by the Elementary Education

Acts, 1870 and 1873.

14. With respect to the places mentioned in Schedule C to "The Metropolis Management Act, 1855," any person assessed or liable to the last rate, or contribution in the nature of a rate, in respect of property situate in any such place as aforesaid under the said Act, and the Acts amending the same, shall be entitled to vote in the election of members for the Division within which such place or any part thereof is situate.

Place of Voting.

15. Each voter shall give his vote in the Place, Parish, Parish-Ward, or City-Ward, in which the property in respect of which he is entitled to vote is situate, and if it is situate in more than one Place, Parish, or Ward, within the same Division, he shall vote in any one of the Places, Parishes, or Wards in which it is situate.

If there be any Ward or Place for which no separate polling-place is appointed, the voter shall give his vote at the polling-place appointed by the Deputy Returning Officer for the purpose.

16. The poll shall commence at 8 A.M. and

close at 9 P.M.

17. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the poll shall be taken in like manner as a poll at a contested Municipal Election is directed by the Ballot Act, 1872, to be taken; and the provisions of that Act shall apply to the Election in like manner as if they were contained in this Order, with the substitution of the term "School Board Election" for the term "Municipal Election":

Provided that-

a. Every voter for a division shall be entitled to a number of votes equal to the number of the members of the School Board to be elected for such Division, and may give all such votes to one candi 'ate, or may distribute them among the caudidates as he thinks fit.

b. The voter may place against the name of any candidate for whom he votes the number of votes he gives to such candidate in lieu of a cross, and the form of directions for the guidance of the voter in voting, contained in "The Ballot Act, 1872," shall be altered accordingly.

The provisions of sections three, four, eleven, and twenty-four of "The Ballot Act, 1872," shall be deemed to be regulations contained in this Order, which involve a penalty within the meaning of section ninety of "The Elementary

Education Act, 1870."

18. The person presiding at the poll may, and within which any place mentioned in Schedule C.I if required by any two voters shall, put to any

voter at the time of his applying for a Ballot! Paper, but not afterwards, the following questions, or one of them, but no other:

(a) In the City:

(1.) Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. on the list of persons entitled to vote in the election of Common Councilmen for the City?

(2.) Have you already voted at the present

Election?

(b) Outside the City:

(1.) Are you the ratepayer whose name appears as A.B. in respect of the property described as in the Rate Book containing the Rate made on

day of . Specify date and property in Rate Book.

(2.) Have you already voted at the present Election?

And no person required to answer any of the said questions shall be permitted or qualified to vote until he has answered the same.

19. At the close of any poll the person presiding at the poll shall, if he is not the Deputy Returning Officer, as soon as possible transmit the Ballot Papers to the Deputy Returning Officer of the Division.

20. The Deputy Returning Officer shall proceed in the usual manner to ascertain the result of the poll, and shall certify to the Returning Officer the number of votes given for each candidate.

Declaration of Result.

21. The Returning Officer shall ascertain the candidates who have obtained the largest number of votes in each Division, and such candidates shall be deemed to be elected on the day fixed for the Election; and in case of an equality of votes the Returning Officer shall determine by lot the persons to be elected.

22. The Returning Officer shall publish notice of the result of the poll in the several Divisions, and a list of the names of all the persons elected, with their places of abode and descriptions as members of the School Board, and shall forthwith transmit a copy of such notice and list to the Board of Education. The Ballot Papers shall be kept by him for six months subject to the directions of

the Board of Education.

Expenses.

. 23. The expenses incident to the election shall be ascertained and determined by the Returning Officer, who shall, within three weeks after the date of the election, deposit at the Office of the School Board a detailed statement of all such expenses, whether incurred by himself or by the Deputy Returning Officers, and of his own and the Deputy Returning Officers' remuneration, with

vouchers or bills in support of the same.

This statement, with the vouchers, shall be prepared in twelve distinct parts, containing respectively the charges of the Returning Officer himself and the charges of each of the eleven Deputy Returning Officers. Such statement and vouchers shall remain so deposited for four weeks, and shall be open to inspection by any person or persons authorized by any of the several Rating Authorities in that behalf; and the Returning Officer immediately after so depositing them shall inform the several Rating Authorities of their deposit, and of the time for which they will remain deposited.

... If any of the several Rating Authorities desire that any of the said twelve parts of the Returning Officer's Bill shall be taxed, and shall give notice of such desire to the Returning Officer before the four weeks shall have expired, such part of his Bill shall be forthwith referred by him at the end of the said four weeks of deposit to the Registrar of the Court of the Lord Mayor of the city of London, whose decision as to how much of the said part shall be payable shall be final and conclusive.

The fee for taxation of the said part shall be :-1.) For the first two hundred pounds, ten shillings for every fifty pounds or fractional part of fifty pounds.
(2.) For the excess over two hundred pounds,

five shillings for every fifty pounds or fractional

part of fifty pounds.

Such fee shall be deposited, on behalf of the Rating Authority or Rating Authorities who shall desire taxation, with the Registrar before the end

of the said four weeks of deposit.

Immediately after the Registrar has completed his taxation of such of the twelve parts of the Returning Officer's Bill as may have been so referred to him, and has given his decision as to all such parts, or if none of the twelve parts of the Returning Officer's Bill have been so referred, immediately after the expiration of the four weeks of deposit the Returning Officer shall apportion his Bill, deducting therefrom such amounts (if any) as may have been taxed off from any of the twelve parts of the Bill by the Registrar.

The apportionment shall be according to the last apportionment of the amount required to be raised to meet the deficiency of the school fund of the Metropolis, and the several Rating Authorities shall pay to such person or persons as the Returning Officer shall by precept direct the several amounts so apportioned out of the rates or funds out of which their contributions to the School Fund are payable (which rates, and any increase therein, may be levied for that purpose); and for obtaining payment of the amount specified in any such precept the Returning Officer shall have the like powers as the School Board under section 37 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870.

If the Registrar decide to reduce any of the twelve parts of the Returning Officer's Bill by an amount exceeding the amount of the fee for taxation of such part, the Returning Officer shall, out of the moneys received by him under the said apportionment, return to the person or persons who deposited with the Registrar the fee for taxation of the said part, such portions of the said fee as were severally deposited with the Registrar by the said person or persons. And if the said part be the charges of one of the Deputy Returning Officers, the Returning Officer shall, before paying such part to such Deputy Returning Officer, reduce it by the amount of the said fee for taxation.

General.

24. Notices and other matters required by these regulations to be published shall be published in the manner provided by the 26th section of "The Metropolis Management Act, 1855," and in such other manner as is usually adopted in elections of vestrymen in the Metropolis.

25. Words used in this Order shall, so far as is consistent with the context, have the same meaning as the same words used in the Elementary

Education Acts, 1870 and 1873.

NOTICE is hereby given that -

1. An Election of the Members of the School Board for London will take place on Thursday, the 29th day of November, 1900.

2. The number of persons to be elected as Members of the School Board by this Division is

3. [In the case of City Division] Any two persons entitled to vote for Common Councilmen.

[In the case of any other Division] Any two Ratepayers of the Division may nominate any one person whatever of full age as a Candidate for the Division, by a nomination paper containing the Christian name, surname, place of abode, and description of the Candidate, and signed by the persons nominating, who shall add their places of abode, descriptions, and the premises in the Division for which they are respectively rated. Ratepayers in respect of property in areas which under the London (South Hornsey) Order in Council, 1900, and the London (Mitcham detached) Order in Council, 1900, will be added to the Finsbury and West Lambeth Divisions respectively will, and ratepayers in respect of property in areas which under the London (Clerkenwell detached) Order in Council, 1900, the London (Penge) Order in Council, 1900, and the London (Putney detached) Order in Council, 1900, will be taken out of the Finsbury, Greenwich, and West Lambeth Divisions respectively will not be qualified nominators. The same person may not join more than once in nominating a candidate for the same Division.

The nomination papers must be delivered at the Office of the Deputy Returning Officer not later than 4 o'clock of Wednesday, the 7th November.

4. Public notice will be given of the List of Candidates on or before Friday, the 9th No-

5. Any Candidate may be withdrawn by the delivery at the said Office, not later than 4 o'clock of Tuesday, the 18th November, of a notice signed by the Candidate.

6. The voting will take place in each Parish, or if the Parish is divided into Wards, or, in the case of the City, in each Ward; and notice of the numbers and situation of the polling-places will be published on Saturday, the 24th November.

Each voter must vote in the Ward in which the property in respect of which he is entitled to vote is situate, and if it is situate in more than one Ward in the Ward which he selects.

7. The poll will be open from 8 A.M. until

8. [In the City] Every person entitled to vote for Common Councilmen is entitled to vote in this Election.

[In other Divisions] Every Ratepayer is entitled to vote in this Election as provided by par. 1 (c) of the Second Schedule to "The Elementary Education Act, 1873."

 The voting will be by ballot.
 Each voter in this Division has all of which he may give to one Candidate, or he may distribute all or some of them among the Candidates as he thinks fit.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, October 5, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Calais, intimating that vessels proceeding from any port in the United Kingdom to that port must bring a clean bill of health with the visa of a French Consular Officer, failing production of which they would be liable to detention outside the port for 24 hours, for inspection and, if deemed necessary, disinfection, and that vessels from Glasgow will not be admitted, but will have to proceed to Dunkirk and undergo quarantine there.

(F. & H. 13,623.) Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour

Department), London, October 5, 1900. THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, viz. :- "Six days' quarantine at Sulina imposed on arrivals by sea from Glasgow, neighbouring districts, and ports, arrivals from England subjected at ports only to medical inspection. Importation of following articles prohibited :-Firstly, used clothes, bodylinen, and bedding, if as luggage subjected to special treatment. Effects of deceased soldiers and sailors when returned to country of origin will be assimilated to above-mentioned articles; secondly, rags and old clothes, including rags in bales compressed by hydraulic pressure and imported as merchandise; thirdly, fresh débris of animals, horns, hoofs, hair of horses and other animals, raw silks, and wools; fourthly, hair; fifthly, used sacks, carpets, and embroideries; sixthly, raw, untanned, and green hides."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following copies of Telegrams from the Governor of Newfoundland respecting quarantine on arrivals from Glasgow, viz. :-

"Quarantine authorities issue notice that all vessels arriving in any port in this Colony from Glasgow will be subject to quarantine regulations published in Royal Gazette Extraordinary 31st August, 1892."

"Referring to your Telegram of 3rd October.

"According to regulations vessels on arrival in port less than 14 days from Glasgow, may be detained in quarantine, but as period incubation bubonic is short, quarantine authorities grant free pratique to vessels arriving in less time, provided that on examination no trace can be found of sickness on board and no dead rats. Sending home by mail Quarantine Regulations."

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, October 9, 1900.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following Notice respecting quarantine at Malta, viz. :-

Government Notice [No. 213]

His Honour the Officer administering the Government, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 200 of the 15th September, 1900, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the I-lands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the

Collector of Customs may direct.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage cases of cholera, yellow fever or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever or plague.

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.

(c.) Vessels arriving from the Persian Gulf and from Arabian ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal, take in provisions and

cargo under quarantine restrictions.

(a.) Vessels arriving from Indian and Arabian ports without a clean bill of health which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health which do not fall under the

provisions of Head 1.

(c.) Vessels arriving from Alexandria or Glasgow which have not been admitted to free pratique at an intermediate port and disinfected there to the satisfaction of the Port Authorities.

- (d.) Vessels falling under the provisions of Sections (a) and (b) shall be admitted to free pratique after a period of 30 days from their departure from an infected port, and those falling under Section (c), viz : those arriving from Alexandria, after a period of 10 days, and those arriving from Glasgow, after a period of 20 days from date of departure.
- 3. Quarantine for a period of 12 days. Passengers arriving from any infected port will be required to undergo quarantine for a period of 12 days.

4. Medical Inspection.

All vessels shall, on arrival, undergo strict medical inspection.

5. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from Chinese, Indian, and Arabian ports, Alexandria, or Glasgow, on board vessels that do not carry a doctor, shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments where they will be subjected to strict medical inspection until their clothing and all other articles of personal use, likely to retain infection, shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

(b.) Passengers and crews of vessels arriving from the above places on board vessels that carry a doctor, shall be permitted to land; but no luggage shall be landed before it is disinfected in one of the quarantine establishments.

(c.) Every passenger arriving at Malta, shall, before being allowed to land, declare on oath before an Inspector of Marine Police or other superior officer, that he has not been in Alexandria and Glasgow within 14 days; whenever such person does not make this declaration on oath, he shall undergo a period of quarantine of 14 days.

6. Goods.

The importation of coffee, beans or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health, is prohibited.

Vessels falling under the provisions of Head 2, shall be allowed to discharge such goods as admit of being disinfected or are not susceptible.

Cereals imported from infected ports are to be kept for 21 days at the lazaretto or any other place to be appointed by the Collector of Customs, to be aired under the direction of the quarantine authorities.

The importation of rags is prohibited.

The importation is forbidden before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials,

feathers, bones and jute goods.

The importation from any infected port is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, besides those mentioned in the next preceding sub-section: used sacks, as also carpets and embroideries which have been in use, raw skins, fresh skins, and untanned skins; animal débris, such as hoofs, mains, hair; raw silk, wool, and human hair.

The importation of hides from any port subject to quarantine or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinfection.

The importation of vines, vine shoots and fruit packed in vine leaves, is prohibited. The importation of plants, or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate from the British Consular authority that Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

Journal Officiel du 3 Octobre, 1900. Le Président de la République française,

Vu l'Article 1er de la loi du 3 Mars, 1822, sur la police sanitaire;

Vu le décret du 4 Janvier, 1896, portant règlement de police sanitaire maritime ;

Vu les décrets des 15 Avril, 1897, et 15 Juin, 1899, relatifs aux provenances des ports contaminés de peste,

Décrète:

ART. 1er.—Les navires provenant des localités reconnues contaminées de peste ou portant des objets énumérés à l'Article 3 du décret du 15 Avril. 1897, ne peuvent pénétrer en France ou en Algérie que par les ports de Dunkerque, le Havre, Saint-Nazaire, Pauillac, Marseille et Alger.

Le ministre de l'intérieur déterminera les autres ports qui pourraient également être ouverts à ces provenances par exception ou sous réserve de conditions spéciales résultant de l'état sanitaire des navires à leur arrivée ou de la nature de leur chargement.

ART. 2.—L'Article 4 du décret du 15 Avril, 1897, et l'Article I er du décret du 15 June, 1899,

sont abrogés.

ART. 3.—Le président du conseil, ministre de l'intérieur et des cultes, et le ministre des finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera publié au Journal officiel et inséré au Bulletin des lois.

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the part of a District of a Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article

shall not apply to-

(a.) packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) dogs while being taken to or from exhibitions, shows, or other places, if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to

bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

8.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rubies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way

been exposed to the infection of rabies.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the part of a District to which this Order applies.

GLAMORGANSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the part of a District of a Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.
(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article

shall not apply to-

(a.) packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) dogs while being taken to or from exhibitions, shows, or other places, if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so se zed shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it

shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there period as the Local such kept for Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the in-fringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention: If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the part of a District to which this Order applies.

Offences.

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Anima's Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order-

"Disease" means rabies, "diseased" means affected with rabies, and "suspected" means suspected of rabies:

The day was clear with a perfect condition of

visibility, but no island could be seen.

Ykima Island appears to have been placed originally on a Chart of the China Sea, published by the East India Company's Hydrographer (Horsburgh) in 1835. No mention was made of its existence in any of the earlier editions of Horsburgh Directory, nor is any account of it given in any edition of that Directory

In 1843 Sir E. Belcher, in Her Majesty's ship "Samarang," looked for this Island, but tailed to

find it.

In 1856 the United States expedition under Commodore Perry a'so looked for Ykima without

In 1870 Captain G. H. Schoof, of the German barque " Uranus," passed over its position without seeing any such Island.

No such Island is shown on the plan of Meiaco Sima Islands by Captain Broughton of His

Majesty's ship " Providence," 1795.

As no authority can be found for placing Ykima Island on the Chart in the position given above. and as no report of its existence can be traced, it is considered probable that this island must be identical with Ikema Island shown on the Chart in lat. 24° 56' N., long. 125° 161 E., at the north end of Taipinsan Island.

Ykima Island in lat. 24° 25′ N., long. 125° 29′ E., has been consequently erased from the Aduiralty
