Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in the Parish Churchyard of Ilchester, in the county of Somerset, be postponed until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed, at their decease, of the widows and widowers of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(c.) The burial of the Reverend James Hipwell may take place at his decease in a vault or grave not less than five feet deep to be constructed on the east side of the south aisle.

Havana, September 28, 1900.

The Military Governor of Cuba directs the publication of the following order which will govern in matters pertaining to the questions of quarantine in all Ports of Entry of the Island of Cuba:

I. Pilots on boarding vessels to conduct them into the harbour, shall proceed immediately to the pilot deck and remain there.

II. They shall immediately direct the yellow flag to be hoisted as a signal for inspection, whether the vessel has sickness on board or not.

III. Pilots shall remain upon the vessel until permitted to go ashore, and no person shall be allowed to come on board or leave the vessel until after the completion of inspection and the quarantine flag lowered.

IV. The hours for the inspection of vessels shall be from sunrise to sunset, except for vessels

in distress.

V. Upon the arrival of a vessel, the crew-shall be mustered upon deck for inspection, and the number verified as given upon the crew list and bills of health. Cabin passengers shall also be inspected and the number verified, if from suspected or infected ports; and a careful inspection and verification of steerage passengers shall always be made.

VI. In suspicious cases occurring among the passengers or crew the clinical thermometer shall be used, and particular care is enjoined in vessels coming from ports or countries suspected of Cases of pneumonia occurring en route must be carefully scrutinized; and, when deemed necessary, also the cervical, axillary, and inguinal regions examined for glandular enlargement, in order to exclude this disease.

VII. The written certificates of medical officers of the Navy and U.S. Army Transport Service may be accepted as to the sanitary condition of their vessel, passengers, and crew.

VIII. All vessels, whether foreign or coastwise, shall be subject to inspection throughout the year. Bills of Health.

IX. Bills of health shall be required and issued in every instance upon the consular or supplemental forms for foreign or coastwise ports in accordance with the quarantine laws and regulation.

X. When vessels expect to depart during the night or early morning the bills of health must be applied for the previous afternoon, during the Customs Office hours. The final inspection of the vessel, passengers and crew shall be made during daylight as late as possible before sailing, and no further communication allowed with the vessel except by permission of the quarantine officer.

XI. The official dispatch boats acting under the direct orders of the Military Governor and vessels of the Customs Service are exempt from inspection and necessity of obtaining bills of health. In case, however, sickness occurs on board of said vessels. it shall be immediately reported to the quarantine

XII. In ports where a quarantinable disease prevails, certificates of health shall be required of all passengers before being allowed to board a vessel, and their baggage shall be labelled "Inspected and passed" or "Disinfected and passed" as may be required.

XIII. The treatment of passengers, vessel, and crew shall be noted briefly under the head of "Remarks" upon the bills of health; time of day the vessels depart; partial or complete disinfection; methods employed; if disinfection is vitiated by after communication with shore or other pertinent facts, and the same signed by the inspecting officer.

XIV. In any doubtful diagnosis or infractions of the Quarantine Rules and Regulations the vessel shall be detrined in quarantine, and the facts immediately telegraphed to the Chief Quarantine Officer for instructions.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 22ND OCTOBER 1900.)

STAFFORDSHIRE, DERBYSHIRE, LEICESTERSHIRE, AND WARWICKSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement out of into or within Scheduled District.

- 1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District).
- (2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into the Scheduled District, or along over. or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement into out of or within Infected Place or Area.

2. Nothing in this Order shall authorize the movement of any animal into, or out of, or along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within,

a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area, or the movement of any animal in such Place or

Movement within Scheduled District with Livence. 3.—(1.) Subject to Article 2 of this Order, an animal may, if accompanied by a Licence under this Article, be moved by the nearest available route from any premises in the Scheduled District to any other premises within such District.

(2.) A Licence for movement under this Article may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved, but only on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in

writing for this purpose to the effect :

(i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period :

(ii.) that the animal is not affected with Footand-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and

(iii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to

the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.

Movement into Parts of Scheduled District for Slaughter without Licence.

4. An animal may be moved from any place outside the Scheduled District, to any railway premises in the petty sessional divisions of Aston, Handsworth, Willenhall, or Wednesbury, or in the boroughs of Walsall, Wednesbury, West Bromwich, Stafford, Smethwick, or Burton-upon-Trent, provided that the animal is so moved without being untrucked within the said District; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway premises by the nearest available route to a slaughter-house within such petty sessional division or borough, and shall be there detained and be slaughtered within four days from the date of its arrival therein.

Movement within Scheduled District of Animals across a highway between different parts of a Farm in the same occupation without Licence.

5. Subject to Article 2 of this Order, an animal may be moved by the nearest available route along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled District from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm being in the same occupation, provided that the animal to be moved is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and that the movement of such animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Movement of Animals by Railway through Scheduled District.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal out of or into the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside | such revocation shall not invalidate or make un-

such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Saving for Regulations of Local Authority.

7. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demaid of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Anthority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(!.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and. defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle, or a sheep, or goat, or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of. Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture: "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and awine:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation of Orders.

12. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that lawful anything done under either of the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred.
